(e) Male young persons over 16 years of age in welding, grinding and machining small tools at the Imperial Steel Works of Messrs. Edgar Allen & Co. Ltd., Sheffield, subject to similar conditions.

(f) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in the manufacture of knitted wear at the works of Messrs. F. L. Boulanger Limited,

Seaforth Avenue, New Malden, Surrey, subject to conditions similar to those under (a) and to a condition that transport facilities may be required.
