

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATIONS:

JOHN JOSEPH COGLAN.

The Home Secretary gives notice that he has suspended until further Order the operation of the Notice, dated 21st June, 1930, and published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 24th June, 1930, withdrawing from John Joseph Cogan, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., the authority granted by the Regulations made under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Act applies; and has also suspended the direction, given at the same time, that it should not be lawful for Dr. Cogan to give prescriptions for the purposes of the aforesaid Regulations.
