#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF TYPIST AND CLERK-TYPIST (FEMALE) IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 16½ and 25, provided that the upper age limit may be extended to 28 in the case of candidates who were employed on the 1st July, 1936, and continue to be employed up to the date of the examination in a British Government Department in one of the following capacities, viz.:— Temporary Typist; Temporary Clerk-Typist; Temporary Shorthand-Typist; Temporary Clerk-Shorthand-Typist. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of April in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of October in that year. A candidate who attained the lower limit of age on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the upper limit of age on that date would not be admitted. The half year will be reckoned by calendar months.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,\* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Urban District Council of Southall-Norwood are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Urban District Council of Southall-Norwood intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.
