The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the Realm empowering the Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Portsmouth to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Ernest Neville Lovett, C.B.E., D.D., late Bishop thereof to the See of Salisbury; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Chapter the Venerable Frank Partridge, B.A., Archdeacon of Oakham, Canon of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough and Chaplain to His Majesty, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Portsmouth.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the King's Police Medal for Gallantry to Syed Akhtar Husain, Sub-Inspector of Police, Agra, in recognition of his gallantry on the 31st October, 1935, when with two other Sub-Inspectors of Police he waylaid an armed murderer and by his persistence, after being seriously wounded, succeeded in disarming and arresting the man.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT, 1933.

SOUTH WALES AND MONMOUTHSHIRE SCHOOL, TREHARRIS, GLAMORGAN.
