Venice, Sept. 12. N. S.

THE Senate have appointed Signior Melino, who was formerly Generalissimo of the Forces of this Republick, and Signior timeini, at present their Ambassador at the Empirer's Court, to be their Committioners and Pleapotentiaries for the Treaty of Peace with the Turks, wherein they are to be affished by Signior Kinlass, one of their Secretaries, who is already gone to Vienna, and Signior Molino will follow in a few days in Company of Signior Loredano, who is to fucceed in the Embassy at that Court. Severil Recruits are arriv'd at the Lide, in order to emtak on the Convoy which is preparing here for the Levant. We expect with impatience to hear from our Fleet, having for some time had no wher Advices concerning them, than by a Vessel was in here this week from Smirna, the Master whereof says, That when he sailed from thence, they were cruizing near the Mand of Stanchio in the Archiepelago; and that the Ships from Barbary, ther having been several days ar the Isle of Fachi, recegone to join the O:toman Fleet, who 'twas beleved would, as foon as they had received this Reinforcement, come out of the Dardanelles; fo that remay shortly hear of some Action on that side. We have Letters from Dalmatia of the 28th of Angul, which say, That the Bassa of Bosnia had appeared with a strong Body of the Enemy's Troops on the Frontiers of Croasia, upon which the Proveditor Marcello had affembled the Venetin Forces in those Parts, and intended to match blimechi to observe the Enemy.

Tarin, Sept. 6. The Duke of Savoy went from bance last Thursday for Mondew; and after having made a short stay there, he intends to go advisit the Garison of Pignerol. Orders are given for repairing our Citadel, which received gear Damage by the blowing up of the Magazine that was set on fire by Lightning some Weeks we, and divers Workmen have been sent for from factal of the neighbouring Cities, to be employed therein.

Inferg, Sept. 4. The King of Poland designs in sew days to go from hence to Halitz, where conf of his German Forces (which, when all kind together, will consist in 30000 Men,) are that arrived. The Army of the Crown constructs in the mean time encamped near Monastermik. We hear, the Cariston of Cominion make sequent Excursions on our Frontiers, notwith-standing they have often been regulied with Loss ty our Forces which are posted in those Parts. The Queen-Dowager, with Prince Constructions in order to set out from thence their Journey to Rome. Prince Alexander, who was lately made Captain of the King's Guards, continues here, and will arrend him during the Campagne.

Vienna, Sept. 13. The Court continues at Eberfdorf. But their Imperial Majestics intend to come hither to morrow, to affift at the Celebration of the Anniversary Feast for the Deliverance of this City from the Siege in the year 1683, and the next day they will return to Eberfdorf. The Emperor's Plenipotentiaries for the Peace with the Turks, are preparing their Equipages in order to their Journey to the Frontiers, which they will begin in a few days; and in the mean while they have frequent Conferences with the Emperor's Ministers, and with those of the Republick of Venice and the Czar of Museowy; concerning the Matters they are to Treat of. A farther Supply of Ammunitions was fent fome days ago down the Danube for the Service of our Army in Hungary, and Magazines are provided on the Frontiers of Transilvania and Upper Hungary, to supp'y them from time to time with Provitions and Amounition during their stay on that side the Danabe. Our last Advices from the Army say, That the Bridges over the Theyste being ready, they passed that River the 3d Instant, and encamped overagainst Titul, and the Artillery and Baggage followed the next day. Prince Engene, who commands them, had posted Lieutenant-Colonel Nicubourg and the Count of Thierheim with a Party of 600 Men on each side the Bridge over the Morals of Villowar, as well for the Security of that Pass, as to maintain the Communication with Peter-Waradin. General Spielberg was left with a Regiment near Titul, and had Orders to build some Redoubts to co. ver that place, and they were making a Fort likewife to secure their Bridge over the Theyffe; Prince Eugene had fent the Quartermasters-General Creftien and Conty to mark out a Camp near Bergskerk, intending to march thither in 2 or 3 days. They had been some days without any carrain Advi-ces of the Motion of the Enemy, several Parties which were fent out to make Prisoners, and to get Intelligence, not being yet returned; but it's believed, they are still encamped near Semendia. The Turkish Fleet on the Danabe continues near

Francfort, Sept. 21. The Elector Palatine is expected here next week from Weinheim, and great Preparations are making for his Reception. He intends in his way hither to make a Visit to the Landtgrave of Hesse Darmstadt, and having passed some days here, to go and view that part of his Territories which is situate along the Rhime. His Electoral Highness has given Directions for making some Fortifications at Manheim. The Elector of Menix is gone from Menix to Aschaffendard.
