At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 28th day of *May*, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of April, 1936 (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks :

“And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind :

“And whereas we are of opinion that an appointment of an Assistant Paymaster, in the Royal Hospital School, is necessary :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise this post with retrospective effect as from 12th January, 1931, and with emoluments consisting of a basic scale of salary of £200 to £250 per annum, rising by annual increments of £10, and an official residence or an allowance in lieu.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
