At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 28th day of May, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of May, 1936 (C.W. 3097/36), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated 26th May, 1925, and 19th April, 1933, conditions of service were prescribed for the R.N. Shore Signal Service:

"And whereas we consider it expedient in the interest of the Force that provisions should be made to permit of Officers voluntarily retiring therefrom:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction that Officers of the R.N. Shore Signal Service may be permitted to retire voluntarily, subject to a requirement of a minimum period of service of one year as Chief Officer, and be eligible at our discretion to receive on retirement a proportionate gratuity earned by service, such gratuity to be assessed on the revised basis authorised for Officers who, as ratings of the R.N. Shore Signal Service, entered on or after the 1st April, 1933, irrespective of the date of the Officers' entry."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
