Whereas under Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar-General, with the approval of the Minister of Health, may divide any superintendent registrar's district into two or more superintendent registrars' districts;

And whereas it is expedient that the Wigan superintendent registrar's district should be divided into two superintendent registrars' districts;

And whereas it is necessary to transfer the functions under the Registration Acts in relation to one of the superintendent registrars' districts so formed;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Wigan Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1936, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1936.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a superintendent registrar's district, and the term "existing district" means a district which existed immediately before the 1st day of July, 1936.

2.—(1) The existing Wigan district shall be divided into two districts called respectively the Wigan and the Ince districts.

(2) The Wigan District shall consist of that portion of the existing Wigan district which is situate within the County Borough of Wigan.
