The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made Orders authorising the employment on two day-shifts of:—

(a) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in the manufacture of electric water heaters at the works of Messrs. Santon Ltd., Lloyd Street, Newport, Mon., subject to conditions as to weekly alternation of shifts, accommodation for clothing and facilities for washing and for taking meals.

(b) Women over 18 years of age in the spoon and fork press department at the works of Messrs. James Dixon & Sons Ltd., Cornish Street, Sheffield, subject to similar conditions.

(c) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in hank to bobbin winding at the works of Messrs. Frank Willis Ltd., Brougham Street, Leicester, subject to similar conditions to those under (a) and to conditions as to the taking of additional humidity readings, and that transport facilities may be required.
