WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of June, 1936, (C.W. 5513/36), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

"And whereas by Section VI, Schedule V, to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, provision is made, inter alia, for the payment of Entertaining Allowance at 5s. a day to Colonels Commandant in command of Royal Marine Divisions:

"And whereas we consider that the emoluments of these Officers are inadequate, and that an increase is justified in view of the financial obligations entailed in their appoint-

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to annul the provisions of Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, in so far as they relate to the payment of Entertaining Allowance to Colonels Commandant, Royal Marines, and to sanction with effect from the 1st day of April, 1936, the payment to Colonels Commandant in command of Royal Marine Divisions of a duty allowance of 5s. a day and Entertaining Allowance of 10s. a day.

" The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.'

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"And whereas we consider that Warrant Officers so employed should receive additional remuneration in respect of such duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment to Warrant Officers qualified in Observer duties of allowances at 4s. a day when employed on full flying duties, and at 2s. 6d. a day when holding appointments for ground duties in which there is a frequent liability to fly.

WHEREAS by subsection (4) of section 35 of the County Courts (Amendment) Act, 1934, 24-5 G. 5, c. 17 (hereinafter called "the Amendment Act") it is enacted that the provisions of the Amendment Act shall come into operation on such date as His Majesty in Council may appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Amendment Act:

And whereas by section 193 of the County Courts Act, 1934, 24-5 G. 5, c. 53 (hereinafter called "the Consolidation Act") it is enacted that the Consolidation Act shall come into operation on the first day on which, by virtue of Orders made by His Majesty in Council under the said subsection, all the provisions of the Amendment Act will be in operation:

And whereas it is desirable that the Consolidation Act should come into operation on the first day of January, 1937:

And whereas for that purpose it is necessary that all the provisions of the Amendment Act (except those already in operation by virtue of Orders made by His Majesty in Council under the said subsection) should be ordered to come into operation on the first day of January, 1937:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, follows:-

- 1. All the provisions of the Amendment Act (except those already in operation by virtue of Orders made by His Majesty in Council under the said subsection) shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts Act, 1934, (Date of Commencement) Order, 1936.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein

mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Hartford, in the County of Huntingdon and in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hartford is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of

Ely, in his private capacity:
"And whereas the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hartford, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese

of Ely:

"And whereas the said Bernard Oliver

of Elv has executed this Francis, Bishop of Ely, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of such his desire and of his willingness, as such Bishop to accept such transfer, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hartford which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Hartford:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hartford now vested in him, the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely, in his private capacity as aforesaid, shall be transferred to himself the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.'

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty King has junisdiction within

dominions of the Republic of China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37, and 3 & 4 Geo. 5. c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, follows:

1. "The China (Amendment) Order Council, 1929," (S.R. & O. 1929 No. 1160) is hereby repealed and the following article shall be substituted for Article 227 of "The China Order in Council, 1925" (S.R. & O. 1925

No. 603):—
"All fees, fines, penalties, and other sums of money which, under the provisions of this Order or any Regulations or Rules of Court. are stated or imposed in terms of British currency, shall be paid in such currency or currencies in use at that place where they are levied and at such rates of exchange as may from time to time be specified by His Majesty's Ambassador in China with the approval of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

"The said rate of exchange shall apply to the ascertainment of the value of any income for any purpose of qualification or of any limitation or security, in any case where this Order or any Rule or Regulation contains a reference to British Currency."

2. The present Order shall be cited as the China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1936, and shall take effect on the 1st July, 1936.

3. Copies of the present Order shall exhibited as soon as possible in the office of the Supreme Court for China and at each Provincial Consulate, but failure to comply with

the provisions of the present article shall in no way affect the operation of the other provisions of this Order.

WHEREAS by "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891" (54 & 55 Vict. c. 36), His Majesty The King is authorised by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular Officer in the execution of his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees, and to create new fees:

And whereas by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892" (55 & 56 Vict. c. 23), by "The Marriage with Foreigners Act, 1906" (6 Ed. 7 c. 40), and by "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913" (S.R. & O. 1913 No. 1270), it is provided that certain things may or shall be done on payment of the proper fee, and those Acts further provide that the proper fee shall be such fee as may for the time being be fixed under "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891" (54 & 55 Vict. c. 36), and that the fee so fixed as respects a Consul shall be the fee which may be taken by any marriage officer:

And whereas it is expedient that the notes set forth in the Table of Consular and Marriage fees in China, annexed to "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1923" (S.R. & O. 1923 No. 968), should be varied in certain respects:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1936," and shall be read as one with "The Consular Fees Order in Council, 1921" (S.R. & O. 1921 No. 1131), and "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1923" (S.R. & O. 1923 No. 968).
- 2. Note 5 of the notes set forth on the table annexed to "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1923" (S.R. & O. 1923 No. 968), and as amended by the Schedule annexed to "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1929" (S.R. & O. 1929 No. 373) is hereby withdrawn and the note set forth in the Schedule annexed to this Order is substituted therefor.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation upon 1st July, 1936.
