PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His late Majesty, King George the Fifth, in Council was pleased to make the following Orders (hereinafter referred to as the "Treaty of Peace Orders"), namely, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 3) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 4) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (Jersey) Order, 1935, and the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (Guernsey) Order, 1935:

And whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of section one of the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, that any Order in Council made under the said Act may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas the Treasury have made an Order called the Clearing Office (Italy) Order, 1936, under the Debts Clearing Offices and Import Restrictions Act, 1934:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Treaty of Peace Orders subject to such provisions as are hereafter contained:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Revocation of Treaty of Peace Orders.

1.—(1) The Treaty of Peace Orders are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order, subject to the provisions hereafter contained in this Article.

(2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect—

(a) the previous operation of any of the said Orders, or anything duly done or suffered under any of them; or

(b) any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under any of the said Orders; or

(c) any penalty, forfeiture or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any of the said Orders; or

(d) any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and any such penalty, forfeiture or punishment may be imposed, as if the said Orders had not been revoked:

Provided that after the commencement of this Order no debt to which the Clearing Office (Italy) Order, 1936, applies shall be payable to the Controller of Anglo-Italian debts (hereafter referred to as "the Controller"), notwithstanding that it is a debt to which Article 3 of the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, applies and was due before the commencement of this Order.

(3) Any sums in the hands of the Controller at the commencement of this Order or thereafter received by him shall be paid by him into the special account referred to in the proviso to paragraph (5) of the said Article 3.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in this Order accounts shall continue to be prepared by the Controller and audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General as provided in paragraph (8) of the said Article 3.

Short title, extent, commencement and interpretation.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1936.

(2) This Order shall extent to the following countries as well as to the United Kingdom,

namely:-

- (a) the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands:
- (b) all the colonies, except colonies administered by the Government of a Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931;
 (c) All British protectorates;

- (d) all terrritories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Govern-ment in the United Kingdom.
- (3) This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-six.
- (4) The Interpretation Act, 1889 as amended by any subsequent enactment, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

in the words following, viz.:"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 8th August, 1932, sanction was given for the formation of a Reserve Force to be known as the Royal Naval Wireless Auxiliary Reserve:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that members of the Royal Naval Wireless Auxiliary Reserve, when undergoing training in the Royal Navy, should receive pay as authorised for the rating of Telegraphist in the Royal Navy serving under a Continuous Service engagement and on the post-1925 scale of pay, together with such appropriate nonsubstantive pay and allowances as we, at our discretion, may consider to be necessary:

"And whereas we further consider that embers of the Royal Naval Wireless members Auxiliary Reserve should be entitled, in respect of hurts or sickness incurred while under training in the Royal Navy, to pensions or gratuities under the Regulations applicable to the corresponding personnel of the Royal Navy and that the widows and other dependent relatives of such men killed, drowned or dying from hurts or disease incurred when undergoing such training, should be eligible for pensions and allowances at the same rates, and under the same conditions, as such dependants of the corresponding personnel of the Royal

Navy:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the fore-

going proposals.
"The Lords Lords of Your Commissioners Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence."

"And whereas we now consider it desirable to enter Boys for Special Service in the Royal

Navy:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the entry of Boys to serve in the Royal Navy under the Special Service system with rates of pay as laid down for Boys entered for Continuous Service, i.e.,

A day. s. d. Boy 2nd class (Special Service) 9 Boy 1st class (Special Service) Boy Telegraphist (Special Service) 1 3 Signal Boy (Special Service)

in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by an Order in Council of His late Majesty bearing date the 15th day of June, 1928, sanction was given to the payment of revised rates of non-substantive pay for ratings qualified as Submarine Detectors:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to alter the titles at present applied to these ratings and to revise further the rates of non-sub-

stantive pay granted to them:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of August, 1928, provision is made for the payment of allowances to ratings of the Telegraphist branch who are qualified and employed as Submarine Detectors in submarines:

"And whereas we consider that titles should be introduced for these Telegraphist ratings: 'We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the undermentioned titles and rates of non-substantive pay and allowances for ratings of Your Majesty's Navy qualified as Submarine Detectors :-

Submarine Detector Instructor, 1s. 6d. a

Telegraphist Detector Instructor, 1s. 3d. a

Higher Submarine Detector, 9d. a day. Higher Telegraphist Detector, 6d. a day. Submarine Detector, 6d. a day Telegraphist Detector, 3d. a day.

Men below Petty Officer rate holding the non-substantive rating of Higher Submarine Detector to receive 3d. a day in addition to the revised rate of 9d. a day.

Payment for Higher Telegraphist Detector or Telegraphist Detector to be made only to those Telegraphist ratings who are actually detailed for the duties in vacancies in the complements of submarines.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of April, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of that Measure, for making certain alterations and additions in relation to the provisions of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 14th day of December, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of the same month (hereinafter called the original Order), for effecting the union of the Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, and the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, both situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas the said union has duly taken effect under the provisions of the original Order, and the Reverend Reginald Guy Frushard Waddington is the present Incumbent of the United Benefice of Christ Church

with Saint Thomas, Bradford:

"And whereas by the original Order provision was made for the union of the Parishes, as well as the Benefices, of Christ Church, Bradford, and Saint Thomas, Bradford, and the Church of the Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, was constituted the Parish Church of the United Parish:

"And whereas the Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford (being formerly the Parish Church of the Parish of Saint Thomas, Bradford, and now a Chapel of Ease to the Parish Church of the United Parish of Christ Church with Saint Thomas, Bradford), has ceased to be used and is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"And whereas by the original Order it was directed that upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, should become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and it appears to us to be expedient that the provisions of the original Order should be altered in regard to the house of residence of the Incumbent of the United Benefice and that provision should be made for the taking down of the said Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, and for the sale of the materials and site thereof, as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred now Bishop of Bradford, and with the consent of the said Reginald Guy Frushard Waddington (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the provisions of the original Order shall be altered in the following manner, that is to say, that the Parsonage House belonging to the former Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford (instead of the Parsonage House belonging to the former Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford), shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Christ Church with Saint Thomas, Bradford, and that so soon as conveniently may be after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the house which was formerly the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested or otherwise applied for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"2. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all repects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; (b) That the net proceeds to

arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bradford under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall constitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bradford; (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to Christ Church, Bradford, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Bradford; and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, or such of them as the Bishop of Bradford shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, or to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Bradford which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bradford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid.

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months: And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of May, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Hawksworth Wood, situate within the District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Woodside, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such District Parish and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population afore-said) of the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, and of the said New Parish of Woodside, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Hawksworth Wood, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Woodside (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Patrons of the Church of Saint Peter, Leeds (constituted a body politic and corporate under the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter cviii), as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall (in testimony whereof they have caused their common or corporate seal to be affixed hereto), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, and of the said New Parish of Woodside, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Hawksworth Wood, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Hawksworth Wood.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary,

Hawksworth Wood, comprising:-

"1. All that portion of the District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon part of the south and upon the south-west by the Parish or Parochial Chapelry of Bramley, upon part of the north-west by the New Parish of Horsforth, upon the remaining part of the north-west and upon the north by the New Parish (sometime District) of Woodside, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south-east, anupon the remaining part of the south by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said District Parish of St. Stephen, Kirkstall, of the said New Parish of Woodside, and of the New Parish of Saint Chad, Far Headingley, in the said County and Diocese, all meet at the junction of Spen Lane with the road called Butchers Hill, and extending thence southward along the middle of Spen Lane for a distance of 44 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Vesper Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Vesper Road for a distance of 16} chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sandy Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Sandy Lane for a distance of 134 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Vesper Lane, and extending thence southwestward along the middle of Vesper Lane for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Abbey Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Abbey Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the Abbey Park Recreation Ground and Forge Wood, and extending thence southward to and along such wall or fence for a

distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern bank of the River Aire, and extending thence first south-westward to and then north-westward along the middle of the River Aire for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkställ, from the said Parish or Parochial Chapelry of Bramley.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Woodside which is bounded upon the south-west, upon the south and upon the south-east by the above described portion of the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said District Parish of St. Stephen, Kirkstall, from the said New Parish of Woodside diverges southward from following the middle of Butchers Hill, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Butchers Hill for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Oil Mill Beck, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Oil Mill Beck for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Woodside from the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Kirkstall."

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly pre-pared and laid before His Majesty in Council; a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1936, in the words and figures following, that

is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Dalham with the Benefice of Gazeley (now part of the United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford) and (2) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Higham Green, Saint Stephen, with the Benefice of Kentford (now part of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:
