

Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum, annual increase and maximum as well as the dates from which such salaries are to be effective are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule, but the annual increase of such salaries shall (except in the case of the Secretary) be only granted on a Certificate by the Commissioners that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry and regularity.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order Mr. John Vass, at present the holder of the post of Superintendent mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, may be paid an annual allowance of £110 over and above the scale of salary specified for that post in the said Schedule such annual allowance to count as salary for the purpose of calculating the superannuation allowance or compensation to which he may be entitled on discharge or retirement.

6. The following provisions in respect of age, examination, appointment and retirement shall take effect, that is to say:—

(a) all persons appointed in future to the executive, shorthand-typist and typist grade on the establishment of the Commissioners

shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) below, previously to their appointment pass such examination as may be arranged, and such examination shall be held under conditions which are similar to those for candidates sitting for examinations for similar posts in the Civil Service;

(b) all officers appointed to posts on the establishment fixed by this Order shall be governed by conditions of service, including promotion and superannuation benefits, similar to those governing Civil Servants of the corresponding grades.

7. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.
