

said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Westbury on Trym which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'the District of Saint Stephen, Southmead'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Stephen, Southmead, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Westbury on Trym, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the north-west and upon the north by the Parish of Henbury, upon the east partly by the Parish of Filton, partly by the New Parish of Saint Gregory, Horfield, and partly by the Parish of Horfield, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Henleaze, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Henleaze, from the said Parish of Westbury on Trym, at the junction of Henleaze

Road with Lake Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Lake Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries it across the stream which flows into the River Trym, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the River Trym, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of the River Trym for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 294 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Westbury on Trym published in the year 1915 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 257 upon the same maps, and extending thence first north-westward in a straight line across the close numbered 291 upon the said maps to such fence and then first north-westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 294 and the closes numbered 256, 255, 254, 253, 224 and 223 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 257 and the closes numbered 256, 259, 218 and 219 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 41 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 223 from the said close numbered 219 meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Charlton Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of the road leading into Charlton Road near its junction with Passage Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Charlton Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Charlton Road for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Westbury on Trym from the said Parish of Henbury."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Westbury on Trym out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.
