

which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Castle Town.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Castle Town, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the United Parish of Seighford with Derrington and Creswell and of the Parish of Castle Church, both in the said County and Diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the north by the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Tillington, upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Castle Town, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Castle Town, from the said Parish of Castle Church, at the junction of the Grand Junction Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway with the Shropshire Union Line of the same railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Castle Church from the said United Parish of Seighford with Derrington and Creswell, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along such boundary for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the southern branch of Doxey Brook, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Doxey Brook for a distance of 75 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said United Parish of Seighford with Derrington and Creswell from the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Tillington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas certain of the Patrons of the United Benefice of Seighford with Derrington and Creswell have offered certain objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas, notwithstanding the said objections, the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with

the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.
