PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of June, 1936 (N. 1532/36), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the authority of Order in Council dated the 28th March, 1903, Boys are entered in Your Majesty's Navy as Artificer Apprentices to be trained at Naval Establishments for service in the Fleet:

"And whereas in view of the need for additional Artificers in Your Majesty's Navy, we consider that the normal provision for training should be supplemented by the training of Naval Artificer Apprentices in Your Majesty's Dockyards under the general conditions applicable to Dockyard Apprentices:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to

extend to the Naval Artificer Apprentice when under training in the Royal Dockyards, the scale of remuneration payable to the Dockyard Apprentice:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of the Whaling Industry (Regulation) Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of the Act shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations or modifications, if any, as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands, Newfoundland or to any Colony:

And whereas by Section 13 of the Act it is further enacted that the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, shall have effect as if the provisions

of the Act were included among the enactments which, by virtue of Section 5 of the said Foreign Jurisdiction Act, may be extended by Order in Council to foreign countries in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction:

And whereas by Section 11 of the Act it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any provision of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships shall, subject to such exceptions, adaptations or modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order, apply also to other ships, being ships registered in or licensed under the law of any Colony or British Protectorate, or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by Section 12 of the Act it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the Order, any of the provisions contained in Sections 1 to 11 of the Act which restricts the taking or killing of whales or the use of ships shall not apply in relation to anything done within the coastal waters of

(a) a country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the Act may be extended by virtue of Section 13 thereof, or

(b) a British protected state,

if there is in force, as respects those coastal waters, a provision of the local law which appears to His Majesty substantially to correspond with the aforesaid provision of the Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should extend to Newfoundland and the territories mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order, subject to the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in this Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act which are expressed to apply only to British ships should apply to other ships registered in or licensed under the law of any territory mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that in respect of the coastal waters of the territories mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order there are provisions of the local law substantially corresponding with the provisions of Sections 3 and 4 of the Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Sections of the Act should not apply in relation to anything done within the coastal waters of the territories mentioned in the said Second Schedule:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Act (except Sections 9 (2) and 15, and except in so far as the Act requires, authorises, prohibits, or restricts the doing of anything in the United Kingdom or in the coastal waters thereof) shall extend to Newfoundland and the territories mentioned in the First Schedule to this

Order, subject to the following adaptations and modifications, that is to say:—

(a) For the words "Summary Jurisdiction Acts" in Section 10 (2) of the Act there shall be substituted the words "law relating to summary jurisdiction";

(b) In the proviso to Section 10 (2) for the words "those Acts" there shall be substituted the words "that law"; and for the words "United Kingdom" there shall be substituted "Newfoundland" or the name of the territory as the case may be;

(c) The provisions of the Act shall not apply to aborigines dwelling on the coasts of any of the territories mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order provided that—

(1) they only use canoes, pirogues or other exclusively native craft propelled by oars or sails;

(2) they do not carry firearms;

(3) they are not in the employment of persons other than aborigines;

(4) they are not under contract to deliver the products of their whaling to any third person.

2. The provisions of the Act which are expressed to apply only to British ships shall apply to other ships registered in or licensed under the law of any territory mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order.

3. Sections 3 and 4 of the Act shall not apply in relation to anything done within the coastal waters of any territory mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

4. This Order may be cited as the Whaling Industry (Regulation) Act (Newfoundland, Colonies, Protectorates, and Mandated Territories) Order, 1936.

### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Lord Bishop of Chester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"That the three detached portions of the Parish of Whitegate in our Diocese of Chester described in the Scheme hereto appended which lie in the Parish of Weaverham and are entirely separated from the said Parish of Whitegate may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Whitegate in the Diocese of Chester to which they belong and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Weaverham in the said Diocese because the areas so to be united are distant from the Parish Church of Whitegate and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said detached portions will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by such separation and union.

"That the three detached portions of the Parish of Weaverham in our said Diocese secondly described in the said Scheme hereto appended which lie entirely within the boundaries of the New Parish of St. John Hartford may be conveniently separated from the said Parish of Weaverham to which they belong and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said New Parish of St. John Hartford in the said Diocese because the areas so to be united are distant from the Parish Church of Weaverham and so that the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said detached portions will be more conveniently and effectually provided for.

"That the detached portion of the Parish of Weaverham in our said Diocese thirdly described in the said Scheme may be conveniently separated from the said Parish of Weaverham to which it belongs and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Whitegate in the said Diocese because the last mentioned portion of the said Parish of Weaverham so to be united is distant from the Parish Church of Weaverham and so that the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the

said portion of the Parish of Weaverham will be more conveniently and effectually provided for.

"That the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the various Parishes which are affected by this Representation have given their consents in writing to the separation and annexation for ecclesiastical purposes proposed by the underwritten Scheme.

"That pursuant to the directions of the said Acts we have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we submit the same to Your Grace together with our Consent in writing and also the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices to be affected to the intent that Your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

### "SCHEME.

"I. It is proposed that those detached portions of the Parish of Whitegate which lie wholly within the boundary of the Parish of Weaverham and are coloured blue and edged red on the accompanying plan and which contain a population of approximately forty-one persons shall be annexed to and united with the Parish of Weaverham for ecclesiastical purposes:

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said detached portions in the Parish Church of Weaverham and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said detached portions shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Weaverham:

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe Lands, Tithes or Tithe Rent Charges, Compositions in lieu of Tithes, Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage:

"That the Inhabitants of the said detached portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Weaverham to which it is proposed that the said detached portions shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Whitegate from which they shall be separated.

"II. It is also proposed that those detached portions of the Parish of Weaverham which are situate wholly within the New Parish of St. John Hartford and which are coloured red and edged blue on the said plan and which contain a population of approximately one hundred persons shall be annexed to and

united with the said New Parish of St. John Hartford in the said Diocese of Chester for ecclesiastical purposes:

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said detached portions in the Church of the said New Parish of St. John Hartford and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues, Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said detached portions shall belong to the Incumbent of the said New Parish of St. John Hartford:

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe Lands, Tithes or Tithe Rent Charges, Compositions in lieu of Tithes, Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage:

"That the Inhabitants of the said detached portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the New Parish of St. John Hartford to which it is proposed that the said detached portions shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Weaverham.

"III. It is also proposed that the detached portion of the Parish of Weaverham which is contiguous to the said Parish of Whitegate and lies to the south of the centre of the main Chester Road (known as Watling Street) and is coloured yellow and hatched red on the said plan and which contains a population of approximately forty persons shall be annexed to and united with the said Parish of Whitegate in the said Diocese of Chester for ecclesiastical purposes:

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said territory in the Church of the said Parish of Whitegate and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said territory shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Whitegate:

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe Lands, Tithes or Tithe Rent Charges, Compositions in lieu of Tithes, Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage:

"That the Inhabitants of the said territory shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Whitegate to which it is proposed that the said territory shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Weaverham."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 29th day of June, 1936, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

#### UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V, CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTES ARE NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, The Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us, by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

#### STATUTE B.

#### CHAPTER VI.

#### DISCIPLINE.

By amending Sections 2—4 so as to read as follows (Sections 5 and 6 being renumbered 8 and 9):—

2. A court, called the Septemviri, the members of which shall be the Vice-Chancellor



and six persons elected singly by Grace for two years, shall (subject to the provisions of this Statute) have jurisdiction over University officers and over such persons not *in statu pupillari* as hold degrees or titles of degrees. Five members of the court shall constitute a quorum.

(i) The Septemviri shall have no jurisdiction over the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, the High Steward, the Deputy High Steward, or the Commissary.

(ii) As a court of appeal the Septemviri shall hear appeals from decisions of the General Board, or other body, depriving a University officer of his office on account of failure to perform satisfactorily the duties or to fulfil the conditions of tenure of his office, and shall affirm or reverse such decisions. The decision of the Septemviri in such cases shall be final.

(iii) As a court of first instance the Septemviri shall (subject to the provisions of this Statute) adjudicate when a person over whom they have jurisdiction is charged, otherwise than under the immediately preceding paragraph of this section, with an offence against the discipline of the University or with grave misconduct, if the Commissary shall have certified in writing that the charge so made against that person is one which is fit to be entertained by the court. Every decision of the court acting as a court of first instance shall require the concurrence of at least four of its members. The court may award the following sentences either singly or in combination:

(a) deprivation or suspension of degree or title of degree;

(b) deprivation or suspension of University office;

(c) any sentence considered by them to be lighter than the aforesaid.

3. The Registry shall be the Clerk of the Septemviri.

4. The Septemviri shall have power to make rules of procedure.

5. Any person sentenced by the Septemviri sitting as a court of first instance may within twenty-eight days after notice of their decision lodge an appeal with the Chancellor. Such appeal shall be heard by a court consisting of the Chancellor, or a deputy appointed by him, and two assessors appointed by the Chancellor, all of whom shall be present. The court shall have power by the votes of a majority of all its members to affirm or reverse the decision of the Septemviri, or to vary the sentence.

6. A court, called the Court of Discipline, shall have jurisdiction over any member of a College and any Non-Collegiate Student, whether matriculated or not, who being *in statu pupillari* is charged with an offence against the discipline of the University or with acting in a manner discreditable to the University. It shall consist of the Vice-Chancellor and six Heads of Colleges, two being elected singly by Grace in each year to serve for three years. Four members of the court shall constitute a quorum, and every decision of the court shall require the concurrence of the votes of at least four of its

members. The court may award the following sentences, either singly or in combination, namely, deprivation of degree or title of degree, rustication, expulsion, or any sentence which the court considers to be lighter.

Notice of a meeting of the court shall be given to the Head of the College to which the person charged belongs (or, if the latter is a Non-Collegiate Student, to the Chairman of the Non-Collegiate Students Board) in order to enable him to be present as an assessor but such Head or Chairman shall not (unless a member of the court) be entitled to vote.

7. The Court of Discipline shall have power to make rules of procedure.

## STATUTE D.

### CHAPTER II.

#### THE UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS.

By substituting in Section 9 the words "the Septemviri" for the words "the Vice-Chancellor and the *Sex Viri*."

### CHAPTER III.

#### THE VICE-CHANCELLOR.

By adding to the Chapter the following Section:

7. The Chancellor shall have power, upon representations made to him by the Council, to suspend a Vice-Chancellor from his office. The Council shall appoint the Head of a House to perform the duties of Vice-Chancellor during the continuance of such suspension.

### CHAPTER IV.

#### THE HIGH STEWARD, THE DEPUTY HIGH STEWARD, THE COMMISSARY.

By substituting for Section 4 the following Sections 4 and 5:

4. The duties of the High Steward and the Deputy High Steward shall be as heretofore customary.

5. The Commissary shall perform such duties as have heretofore been customary, and shall have the duty assigned to him in the Statute intituled "Discipline".

### CHAPTER V.

#### THE PROCTORS.

By substituting in Section 8 the words "The Septemviri" for the words "The Vice-Chancellor and the *Sex Viri*".

### CHAPTER VII.

#### THE REGISTRARY, THE SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE FACULTIES, ASSISTANT REGISTRARIES.

By inserting in Clause (b) of Section 2 the words "and of the Septemviri" after the words "the Courts of the Chancellor".

### CHAPTER IX.

#### THE TREASURER.

By adding to the Chapter the following Section:

6. So far as the Financial Board may allow or direct, any duty of the Treasurer

may be performed by a member of the Regent House approved for the purpose by the Board.

## CHAPTER XII.

### THE UNIVERSITY TEACHING OFFICERS.

By substituting in Section 7 the words "the Septemviri" for the words "the Vice-Chancellor and the *Sex Viri*".

## STATUTE K.

### COMMENCEMENT, INTERPRETATION, INVALID PROCEEDINGS.

By amending Clause (f) of Section 3 so as to read as follows:

(f) the term person *in statu pupillari* shall mean a member of a College, or a Non-Collegiate Student, who has not been admitted to a University office, to a Fellowship or office of a College, or to any degree higher than that of Bachelor of Arts, Law, Surgery or Music, and is of less than three and a half years' standing from admission to his first degree (if any);

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, Oxford, on the 30th day of June, 1936, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

*Ex Parte* the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statutes I, II and VI of the College Statutes duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on the twenty-ninth day of June, 1936, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University had been given on the eighth day of June, 1936 (*Oxford University Gazette*, Vol. LXVI, No. 2133, 10 June, 1936), and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Statute I of the College Statutes in order to permit certain elections or appointments to be made beforehand:

And whereas it is expedient to amend Statute II in order to fix a more convenient date for the retirement of the Master on account of age:

And whereas it is expedient to amend Statute VI in order to increase the number of persons able to serve on the Tutorial Committee:

Now, therefore, We, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), do alter and amend the Statutes of the College by the following additions and alterations:

In Statute I we add a new Clause 6, as follows:—

"When any position or office within the College is about to become vacant at a known date by resignation or superannuation, and provided that the Master and Fellows shall have authorized such a course by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at a College Meeting, an election or appointment may be made not more than six calendar months before the date of the vacancy by the same procedure as if the position or office had already become vacant. Such election or appointment shall take effect from such date as shall be determined at the time of the election or appointment."

In Statute II we strike out Clause 6 and substitute for it the following form of words:—

"The Master shall hold office until the 31st day of July next following his seventieth birthday, or if his birthday fall on the 31st day of July then until his seventieth birthday."

In Statute VI. 7 we substitute the word "six" for the word "four" in the second line of the third paragraph.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

Hours of Employment (Conventions) Act, 1936.

Road Traffic (Driving Licences) Act, 1936.

Employment of Women and Young Persons Act, 1936.

Pensions (Governors of Dominions &c.) Act, 1936.
