

or township as lies westward of a line drawn from the boundary of the county borough of Leeds and the Parish of Thorner at Shadwell Bridge thence in a southerly direction along the eastern side of an unclassified road to its junction with the Leeds and Collingham County Road and continuing in a south-easterly direction parallel to and 150 feet east of the easterly side of Coal Road to the boundary of the parishes or townships of Thorner and Barwick-in-Elmet or such other part of the parish or township of Thorner as shall be added to the county borough of Leeds by any order made under section 46 of the Local Government Act 1929), Weardley, and Wothersome.

In the rural district of Wharfedale—

The parishes or townships of Castley, Leathley and Pool.

2. To provide that subject to the provisions of the intended Order the Company shall have and may exercise within the added limits or any part or parts thereof all powers, rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply or some part or parts thereof.

3. To define the price which may be charged by the Company for gas supplied by them within the added limits and if thought fit to provide that no account shall be taken of such price in determining the average price charged by the Company in any year for gas supplied by them or for any of the purposes of section 44 of the Harrogate Gas Act 1921.

4. To empower the Company on the land hereinafter mentioned to erect maintain alter improve and renew works for the storage of gas with all necessary machinery and apparatus ancillary thereto and do all such acts as may be proper for storing gas and for supplying gas.

The land above referred to is:—

A piece of land containing 3,630 square yards or thereabouts situate in the parish of Scarcroft and rural district of Wetherby in the West Riding of the county of York being so much of the enclosure numbered 55 in the said parish on the $\frac{25}{100}$ Ordnance Map Edition of 1908 Yorkshire (West Riding) Sheet CCIV.1 as lies southward of the northern of the two streams which converge to form Thorner Beck.

5. To empower the Company to purchase by agreement any debentures or debenture stock of the Company and to apply their funds for the purpose and to provide that any debentures or debenture stock so purchased shall be cancelled.

6. To authorise the Company to apply to any of the purposes of the intended Order any money which they have raised or are authorised to raise under the Harrogate Gas Acts and Orders 1863 to 1932.

7. To make provisions as to the substitution of a card or other index for the shareholders address book or for the portion of any register kept in lieu thereof.

8. To make new or further provisions with reference to the Company's affairs including provisions as to:—the indemnity which may be required before the issue of substituted

certificates &c., the appointment of a managing director and the circumstances in which the office of director shall be vacated.

9. To make new provisions with respect to the payment of half-yearly dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and with respect to the Company's accounts.

10. To make provision as to the supply of gas to premises abutting on streets, &c., forming the boundary of but outside the limits of supply and as to the breaking up of such streets for the purpose of affording such supply.

11. To make provisions with respect to the following matters:—The notice to be given by consumers before discontinuing a supply; the inspection and testing of meters, and the recovery of sums due or payable to the Company in respect of the sale or hire of apparatus and fittings for or in connection with the consumption or use of gas or the provision of materials and work in connection therewith or the fixing, setting up, repairing, altering, maintaining or removal thereof.

12. To authorise the Company to contract with any person for the supply to the Company of gas in bulk.

13. To authorise the Company to establish superannuation schemes and to make payments to any superannuation fund formed for the benefit of their employees.

14. To amend subsection (9) of section 156 of the Harrogate Corporation Act 1935.

15. To amend section 42 of the Harrogate Gas Act 1921 and to make new provisions as to the cases in which the Company shall be bound to allow a discount for prompt payment of accounts.

16. To amend the enactments relating to the Company with respect to the appointment of proxies and to provide that for the purposes of section 33 of the Harrogate Gas Order 1932 the expression "employee" shall include a managing director and a director appointed under section 26 of the Gas Undertakings Act 1934.

17. To repeal section 63 of the Harrogate Gas Company's Act 1863.

18. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

19. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Harrogate Gas Acts and Orders, 1897 to 1932 and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

20. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable all, or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act 1847 and the Gasworks Clauses Act 1871.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 18th day of September 1936.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) The specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) The omissions additions or modifications asked for.
