### INCOME TAX.

Whereas it is provided by the Income Tax Acts that every person who is entrusted with the payment of any dividends which are payable out of the public revenue of Northern Ireland or which are payable to any persons in the United Kingdom out of any public revenue other than that of the United Kingdom or of Northern Ireland; or who has entrusted to him any interest, dividends, or other annual payments payable out of or in respect of stocks, funds, shares or securities of any foreign or colonial company, society, adventure or concern for payment to any persons in the United Kingdom; or who has entrusted to him any annuities, pensions or other annual sums payable out of the funds of any institution in India for payment to any persons in the United Kingdom shall, within one month after being so required by notice published in the Gazette, deliver to His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue an account in writing, giving his name and residence and a description of the dividends, interest, annuities, pensions or other annual payments or sums entrusted to him for payment; and whereas by the said Acts it is further provided that any person who neglects or refuses to deliver any such account as aforesaid shall forfeit the sum of one hundred pounds over and above the tax chargeable on such dividends, interest, annuities, pensions, or other annual payments or sums. Notice is hereby given to all persons entrusted with the payment of such dividends, interest, annuities, pensions or other annual payments or sums as aforesaid that the accounts of the said dividends, etc., required by the said Acts are to be delivered in writing to His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue at Somerset House, London, W.C.2, addressed to their Secretary within the space of one month from the date hereof.

### NEWQUAY TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 3.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) on the 15th day of July, 1936, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Urban District Council of Newquay dated the 20th day of February, 1936, deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area situate within the Urban District of Newquay. (2) the Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Chambers, Beach Road, Newquay aforesaid and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on any day of the week (Saturdays and Sundays excluded). (3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the Urban District of Newquay and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the said Urban District Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order 1933,\* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Newquay Urban District Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Newquay Urban District Council intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.
