WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of July, 1936 (G.H. 462/36), in the words following wiz:—

in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, clerks and servants for the purposes of the Hospitals and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. Alphonso William James Davies, I.S.O., M.B.E., Clerk-in-Charge of Greenwich Hospital, will retire from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 24th July, 1936, on account of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the grant to Mr. Davies from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of a pension at the rate of Four hundred and twenty pounds, fifteen shillings

and ninepence (£420 15s. 9d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and an additional allowance of One thousand, one hundred and seventy-three pounds and eleven pence (£1,173 0s. 11d.)."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

the tonnage of that ship:
And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section it is (amongst other things) provided that His Majesty in Council may make the Order subject to such conditions and qualifications (if any) as His Majesty may deem expedient:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Free City of Danzig and are now in force there:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said Section, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- This Order may be cited as the Free City of Danzig Tonnage Order, 1936.
- 2. Ships of the Free City of Danzig the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 14th June, 1922, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes, as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.
- 3. This Order shall apply to ships of the Free City of Danzig, when within any part of His Majesty's dominions, other than the Union

of South Africa or the Irish Free State; provided that if the Governor in Council of the Dominion of Canada shall make an Order having within Canada the same effects as this Order, then this Order shall cease to apply to such ships when within the Dominion of Canada as from the date on which the said Order of the Governor in Council comes into force

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chaper 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Portsmouth which is known as Bishopswood, Fareham:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Frank, now Bishop of Portsmouth, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £1,000 (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Portsmouth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £1,000 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said

Governors by Deed for a term of fifteen years or until the said sum of £1,000 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twelfth part of the said principal sum of £1,000 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Frank, now Bishop of Portsmouth, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £1,000 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of Portsmouth for the time being shall insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said Episcopal Residence the said insurance to be for a sum of not less than £8,000 and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London, or Westminster, to be approved by us and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the said Episcopal Residence the moneys receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said Bishop and shall with any interest or accumulations thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same Episcopal Residence with the concurrence of the said Bishop.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Portsmouth.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Parishes of the United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas pursuant to an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, dated the 12th day of August, 1885, the Benefices of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, and York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, were constituted an United Benefice but the Parishes thereof remain distinct:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the Parishes of the said United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of such Parishes and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

approval of the said Report:
"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, is now full, the Reverend John William Lamb being the present Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said William, Archbishop of York, and John William Lamb (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows,

that is to say:—
"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the Parishes of the said United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, shall be permanently united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of

Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Michael, Spurriergate, York, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of April, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the eleventh Section of that Measure with reference to the Church of Saint Mary, Magdalene, situate within the Parish of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George, Saint John and Saint Petrock, in the City and the County of the City of Exeter and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 5th day of October, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as the original Order) provision was made (inter alia) for the union of the Benefice and Parish (containing the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene) of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the United Benefice and Parishes of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and a part of the United Benefice and Parishes of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock:

"And whereas the said union has since taken effect:

"And whereas by the original Order in Council authority was given for the appropriation of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene as a Parish Hall but such appropriation has not yet been made effective by the execution of a Deed of Trust pursuant to Section 24 of the said Measure:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene should not be appropriated as a Parish Hall as aforesaid but that it should be taken down and the materials and site thereof should be sold, the net proceeds of such sale being applied as is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene has ceased to be used and is no longer required for purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he

has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That the provisions in the original Order relating to the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene shall be altered in the following manner, that is to say, (a) that so soon as conveniently may be, the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene shall be taken down and such materials thereof as the Bishop of Exeter may select shall be appropriated for use in the building of a new Church or Churches in the vicinity of the City and County of the City of Exeter and any materials not so used and the site of the said Church together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; (b) that the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Exeter under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) towards the cost of removal of any of the materials of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene, Exeter, which may selected as aforesaid for use in the building of a new Church or Churches and (2) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held accumulated and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parish Hall for the said United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George, Saint John and Saint Petrock; (c) that the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Mary Major being the Parish Church of the said United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George, Saint John and Saint Petrock, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Exeter and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene or such of them as the Bishop of Exeter shall select, shall be removed to the said Parish Church of Saint Mary Major, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Exeter for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Exeter which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene as aforesaid.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with reference to the purchase of certain fixtures at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Salisbury:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Neville, now Bishop of Salisbury, being desirous that the fixtures within the said Episcopal House of Residence which belonged to the late Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, should be purchased for an agreed sum of £250 and should be annexed to the Episcopal Residence so as to become part of the property of the See, has submitted to us the particulars of the said fixtures, and we have specified our general approval of the purchase of such fixtures

And whereas the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that for the purchase of the said fixtures a sum of £250 (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong to the Bishopric

of Salisbury:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts a sum of £250, and that as a security for the same and interest thereon the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by deed for the term of ten years or until the said sum of £250 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest at the rate of £3 10s. 0d. per centum per annum in ten equal annual instalments to include principal and interest in manner following, that is to say, the said Bishop or his successor shall yearly at the end

of the first period of twelve months of the said term of ten years computed from the day of the date of the mortgage and at the end of every such period of twelve months thereafter, pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, our successors or assigns, one such instalment to include principal and interest until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, as every succeeding Bishop of Salisbury until the principal money and shall have been paid off and disinterest charged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £250 shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time and in such manner as shall be required: for the purchase of the said fixtures, which shall thereupon become annexed to the said Episcopal House of Residence and form part of the property of the See, a schedule of such fixtures being deposited in the Diocesan Registry.

Whereas We deem it expedient to provide for the appointment to and conditions of service of a Regular Reserve of Officers for Our Indian Army and Our Indian Land Forces.

And whereas it is expedient for this purpose to extend the application of the Warrant of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria dated the 6th January, 1892, in manner hereinafter appearing.

Our will and pleasure is as follows:—

1. There shall be a Regular Reserve of Officers for Our Indian Army and Our Indian Land Forces which shall be called the Indian Regular Reserve of Officers.

2. An officer of one of the categories shown in the Schedule to this Our Warrant shall be a member of Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers so long as he remains liable to be recalled to Army Service.

Provided that an officer who misconducts himself or is certified by the regulated medical authority to be mentally or physically unfit may be removed from Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers.

- 3. An officer shall not be appointed to Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers in a rank higher than that which he holds or was granted on retirement.
- 4. An officer of one of the categories shown in the Schedule to this Our Warrant shall, unless his recall is otherwise provided for, remain liable to be recalled to service in Our Indian Regular Forces, by general or special notification, at a time of grave emergency, or when a grave-emergency appears imminent, until he reaches the following age limits:—
 - (i) If he retires as a Lieutenant, 45 years.
 - (ii) If he retires as a Captain or Major, 50 years.
 - (iii) If he retires as a Quartermaster (special list) or as a departmental officer of the India Unattached List, 52 years.
 - (iv) If he retires as a Lieutenant-Colonel, 55 years.
 - (v) If he retires as a Colonel, 60 years.
 - (vi) If he retires as a General Officer, 67 years.

Provided that this article shall not apply to an officer who retires on account of mental or physical incapacity certified by the regulated medical authority or on account of misconduct or, if so determined by Our Secretary of State for India, to an officer who for reasons other than misconduct may have been called upon to retire.

- 5. An officer of the Indian Regular Reserve of Officers shall be removed from the Reserve, by notification in the Gazette of India, on reaching the age limit for retention applicable to his rank specified above, but his services may be retained during the continuance of an emergency although he may pass the age limit for recall during his employment.
- 6. An officer of Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers may, with his own consent and the sanction of the Commander-in-Chief of Our Forces in India, be employed on Army Service at any time, without prejudice however to the provisions of the two preceding Articles.
- 7. An officer of Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers shall report himself at the commencement of each year, in writing in such manner as Our Secretary of State for India may
- 8. Regulations for the employment of officers of Our Indian Regular Reserve of Officers shall be approved from time to time by Our Secretary of State for India in Council.

Our further will and pleasure is that the Royal Warrant of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria dated the 6th January, 1892, shall apply, from the date of this Our Warrant, to officers who may thereafter retire from Our Indian Army with a gratuity in like manner as it applies to officers who retire from Our said Army on pension.

Further the said Warrant of Her late Majesty and the Royal Warrant of His late Majesty King George Fifth dated 11th September, 1914, shall not apply to officers who enter Our Indian Army after the 31st January, 1935, and in their stead the provisions for recall in this Our present Warrant shall apply.
