At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 24th day of *July*, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of July, 1936 (G.H. 462/36), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, clerks and servants for the purposes of the Hospitals and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. Alphonso William James Davies, I.S.O., M.B.E., Clerk-in-Charge of Greenwich Hospital, will retire from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 24th July, 1936, on account of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the grant to Mr. Davies from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of a pension at the rate of Four hundred and twenty pounds, fifteen shillings

and ninepence (£420 15s. 9d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and an additional allowance of One thousand, one hundred and seventy-three pounds and eleven pence (£1,173 0s. 11d.)."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Suffragans Nomination Act, 1888, it is enacted, that from and after the passing of that Act for the purposes of the Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14, intituled "An Act for Nomination and Consecration of Suffragans within this Realm," such other Towns as His Majesty The King may from time to time by Order in Council direct shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in that Act, and that that Act shall be construed and have effect accordingly:
