At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 24th day of July, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of July, 1936 (N. 5133/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 20th day of December, 1935, the pay of Naval ratings, other than non-European natives, and of Royal Marines (other ranks) sent to hospital abroad with disabilities due to their own misconduct, carelessness or neglect, is subject to stoppages:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the pay of non-European native ratings should

similarly be subject to stoppages:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction hospital stoppages after the first 30 days in hospital for non-European native ratings who are sent to hospital with disabilities due to their own misconduct, carelessness or neglect, at rates and under conditions as we may from time to time determine."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
