## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th August, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919 to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 31st August, 1936, to Saturday, the 5th September, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000; and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### EXPORT OF ARMS, EXPLOSIVES AND AIRCRAFT TO SPAIN.

With effect from the 19th August, 1936, the Board of Trade have withdrawn the application to Spain, Spanish Possessions and the Spanish Zone of Morocco of the three Open General Export Licences, Nos. G.L. 110, 111 and 112, which were issued on 1st June, 1931, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931. The articles which are covered by the Open General Export Licences are:—

1. Aircraft, assembled or dismantled, and aircraft engines.
2. Bayonets, swords and lances, and component parts thereof.
3. Smooth bore shotguns and ammunition for use therewith.
4. The following brands of smokeless gun-powder:—

Amberite, E.C. No. 3, Empire, Ideal, K.S.G., Nobel No. 48, Schultze, Shotgun Neonite, Smokeless Diamond.

5. The following explosives:—

Gelatine, Monobel, Nobel Gelatine, Rex Powder, Rockite, Sabulite No. 1, Safety Fuses, Samsonite, Stonobel, Super-Cliffite, No. 1, Super-Cliffite, No. 2, Super-Cliffite, No. 3,

Super Rippite, Super-Sabulite, Thames Powder, Tonite or Cotton Powder, No. 1, Viking Powder.

## PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1933.

The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat, or to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

Certificates recognised for the purposes of items (a) (b) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Amendment Regulations, i.e. :—

(a) A severed part of the carcase of an animal (including the head or any part thereof, and the whole carcase without the head, but not including any part of the carcase of a pig which has been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared), from which no submaxillary, prescapular, pre-crural, superficial inguinal, supramammary, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

(b) Lard, dripping, edible tallow, and all other rendered animal fats except oleo oil, oleo stearine, and premier jus; and

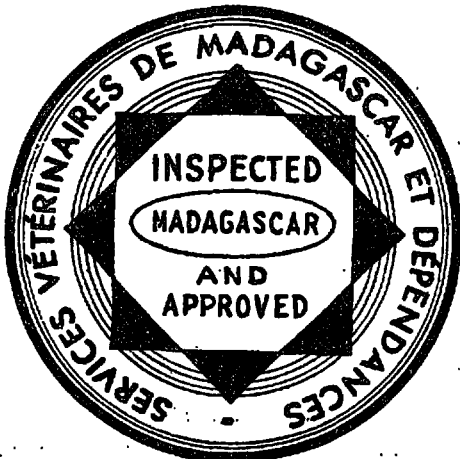
(c) All edible parts of an animal other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase, (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings, and (iii) meat which has before importation been made ready for human consumption in the form of a sausage or other prepared or manufactured article of food.

THE COUNTIES OF SALOP AND STAFFORD.  
*The Rural Districts of Wellington and Stafford.*

Alteration of Local Boundaries consequent upon Alteration of Watercourse.

Whereas the County Council of Salop have carried out alterations in certain portions of the channel of the Moreton Brook (hereinafter referred to as "the watercourse") which forms part of the boundary lines between the counties of Salop and Stafford, the rural districts of Wellington and Stafford and the parishes of Woodcote and Gnosall;

And whereas the said County Council have, in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, notified the Minister of the above-mentioned alterations, and the Minister is satisfied that a new boundary line may conveniently be adopted;

Now therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, hereby declares that the watercourse coloured red on the map deposited at the Offices of the Ministry of Health, Whitehall, S.W.1 (which map is sealed with the seal of the Minister, and is marked "Map referred to in the Notice published in August, 1936, in the London Gazette under sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, relating to the alteration of a watercourse in the counties of Salop and Stafford") shall, as from the date of this Notice, be substituted for the watercourse shown coloured blue on the said map as part of the boundary line between the said counties, districts and parishes.

And notice is hereby given that, consequent upon the foregoing Declaration whereby the limits of areas of local government, of which the watercourse shown coloured blue on the deposited map formed part of the boundary, are deemed to have been varied in accordance with the Declaration, the area hatched blue on the deposited map is, by virtue of the operation of sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, situate in the County of Salop and the area hatched red in the County of Stafford.

And notice is hereby further given that the map deposited at the Offices of the Ministry of Health, Whitehall, S.W.1, and copies thereof which have been lodged at the Offices of the Salop County Council, Shirehall, Shrewsbury, and the Offices of the Stafford County Council, County Buildings, Stafford, are open to inspection without payment during ordinary office hours.

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Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.
