APPOINTMENT OF ADJUDICATING OFFICERS.

Whereas it is expedient that the council of the city of Liverpool (in this Order referred to as "the council") should be empowered to appoint officers to be termed Adjudicating Officers to perform duties under the Poor Law Acts, 1930 and 1934, relating to the grant of relief and the reimbursement of the council of the amount of any relief expended on their behalf. Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

# Citation, &c.

1. This Order may be cited as the Council of the City of Liverpool (Adjudicating Officers) Order, 1936, and, in its application to the City of Liverpool, shall be read as one with the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as modified by this Order:

Provided that in case of any inconsistency the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

# Modification of Orders, &c., applicable to the City of Liverpool.

- 2.—(1) Any orders, rules or regulations made by the Minister and in force in the city of Liverpool shall, in their application to that city, have effect subject to such modifications as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions of this Order.
- (2) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Public Assistance Order, 1930 in its application to the city of Liverpool shall be modified in manner following, namely:—
  - (a) in paragraph (1) (b) of Article 25, before the words "a Relieving Officer," there shall be inserted the words "an Adjudicating Officer or";
  - (b) in paragraph (5) of Article 166, after the words "the council," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer," and after the words "when required by them," there shall be inserted the words "or him";
  - (c) to paragraph (1) of Article 167, there shall be added the words "and shall also attend before any Adjudicating Officer when that Officer is considering applications for relief reported to him by the Relieving Officer";
  - (d) in paragraph (4) of Article 167, after the word "Committee," there shall be inserted the words "and each attendance before any Adjudicating Officer";
  - (e) in paragraph (5) of Article 167, for the words "report to the Committee at their next meeting every application for relief made to him since their previous meeting," there shall be substituted the words "report to the Adjudicating Officer acting for his district every application for relief made to him";
  - (f) in paragraph (12) of Article 167, for the words "until the next ordinary meeting of the Committee," there shall be substituted the words "until his next attendance before an Adjudicating Officer."
- (3) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Relief Regulation Order, 1930, in its application to the city of Liverpool shall be modified in manner following, namely:—
  - (a) in the proviso to paragraph (2) (a) of Article 11, for the word "Committee" wherever that word occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Sub-Committee or Adjudicating Officer," and the word "their" in line 7 shall be omitted;

(b) in Article 10, the provise to Article 12 and Article 16, after the words "Committee or Sub-Committee," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or Adjudicating Officer."

# Appointment of Officers.

3. The council shall from time to time appoint such numbers of suitable persons as they may think necessary to hold the office of Adjudicating Officer and to perform such of the duties of that office (as prescribed by this Order) in such area or areas as the council may from time to time require.

# Conditions of Service, &c.

4. Every person appointed by the council as an Adjudicating Officer shall be a Senior Poor Law Officer.

# Duties of Adjudicating Officers.

- 5. An Adjudicating Officer shall:-
- (a) consider all applications for relief reported to him by a Relieving Officer, and the Relieving Officer's report thereon, and whenever practicable, interview applicants for relief;
- (b) have power to visit, at his discretion, any applicant for relief in whose case he is called upon to adjudicate;
- (c) determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with rules to be prescribed by the council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief;
- (d) make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;
- (e) reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any rules prescribed by the council in that behalf, the cases of persons receiving relief, and make any necessary orders with regard thereto;
- (f) report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all orders for relief made by him;
- (g) refer for consideration by such Sub-Committee such applications for relief reported to him by Relieving Officers and such cases due for reconsideration as by rule, or in his opinion, should be dealt with by the Sub-Committee;
- (h) refer to the Sub-Committee for review or consideration any case in which a recipient of relief or an applicant for relief asks for re-consideration of the Adjudicating Officer's determination or proposed determination of his case;
- (i) have power to make grants of relief by way of loan;
- (j) attend at the meetings of the Sub-Committee;
- (k) report to the Sub-Committee all cases in which relief has been discontinued or refused by him;
- (l) make no variation in orders made by the Sub-Committee, except there be a change in circumstances;

(m) report to the Public Assistance Committee upon all cases in which relief has been granted;

- (n) determine, in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the council, the amounts (if any) to be paid by recipients of relief, or the persons liable for their maintenance, towards reimbursing the council the amount expended by them on relief;
- (o) keep a record of all determinations under the last preceding sub-paragraph, and report the same to the Sub-Committee;
- (p) refer for consideration by the Sub-Committee such of the cases referred to in sub-paragraph (n) as in his opinion should be dealt with by the Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the council may from time to time direct;
- (q) refer for review or consideration by the Sub-Committee every case in which any person affected by a determination made or proposed to be made by the Adjudicating Officer under sub-paragraph (n) asks that the matter should be so dealt with.
