TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th September, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 14th September, 1936, to Saturday, the 19th September, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PORT OF LONDON AUTHORITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Port of London Authority propose to make jointly with the Corporation of the City of London under the provisions of the City of London (Various Powers) Act, 1933, the following Byelaws with regard to Houseboats:—

Byelaws with regard to Houseboats made under the City of London (Various Powers) Act, 1933, by the Port of London Authority and by the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London.

1. These byelaws may be cited as "The Port of London Houseboat byelaws 1936" and shall come into operation on the day after the same are confirmed by the Minister of Health.

2. In these byelaws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have

the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, viz.:—

The expression "Port Sanitary Authority" means the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London.

The expression "district of the Port Sanitary Authority" means the Customs Port of London as described in the Treasury Minute dated August 1st, 1883.

The expression "Port Authority" means the Port of London Authority.

The expression "the Port of London" means the Port of London within the limits described in the First Schedule to the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, as amended by Section 22 of the Port of London (Various Powers) Act, 1932.

The expression "Registration Authority" means the Port Authority in respect of Houseboats moored within the Port of London, and the Port Sanitary Authority in respect of Houseboats moored in such parts of the district of the Port Sanitary Authority as are beyond the limits of the Port of London.

The expression "infectious disease" includes smallpox, cholera, chickenpox, measles, scarlet fever, diphtheria, membranous croup, erysipelas, typhus fever, typhoid fever, para-typhoid fever, enteric fever, continued fever, relapsing fever, puerperal fever, cerebro-spinal fever, acute poliomyelitis, acute polioencephalitis, encephalitis lethargica, acute influenzal and acute primary pneumonia, tuberculosis (all forms), ophthalmia neonatorum, malaria, plague, dysentery and yellow fever.

The expression "Medical Officer of Health" means the Medical Officer for the district of the Port Sanitary Authority, or any legally qualified medical practitioner authorised to act on behalf of such Officer.

The word "owner" in relation to any houseboat means the person for the time being receiving the rent of the houseboat or who would so receive the same if such houseboat were let.

The word "occupier" in relation to any houseboat means the person who for the time being has the charge, management or control of such houseboat.

For requiring the Registration of Houseboats.

3. The Owner of a houseboat which is lying within the Port of London or within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority at the date of the confirmation of these byelaws shall, within a period of three calendar months therefrom, make application to the Registration Authority for the registration of the same in the manner prescribed in byelaw No. 4.

The owner of a houseboat which is lying within the Port of London or within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority at the date of the confirmation of these byelaws shall not, after the expiration of fourteen days from the termination of such period of three calendar months, use or permit to be used such houseboat within the Port of London or within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority, unless and until such houseboat has been registered by the Registration Authority.

The owner of a houseboat which is brought into the Port of London or the District of the Port Sanitary Authority from elsewhere after the confirmation of these byelaws shall forthwith make application to the Registration Authority for the registration of the same, in the manner prescribed by byelaw No. 4, and shall not after the expiration of one calendar month from the date when such houseboat is brought into the Port of London or the District of the Port Sanitary Authority as aforesaid use or permit to be used such houseboat within the Port of London or within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority unless and until such houseboat has been registered by the Registration Authority.

The owner of any vessel or boat (other than a houseboat) which is within the Port of London or the District of the Port Sanitary Authority and who intends to convert the same into a houseboat and the owner of any newly constructed houseboat within the said Port or District after the confirmation of these byelaws shall make application to the Registration Authority for the registration of the same in the manner prescribed by byelaw No. 4 and shall not use or permit to be used such vessel, boat or houseboat as a houseboat within the port of London or within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority unless and until such vessel or boat has been registered as a houseboat by the Registration Authority.

For Regulating the Making of Applications for Registration.

4. The owner of a houseboat shall make application for registration of the same on a form to be obtained from the Registration Authority, and shall enter upon such form:—

- (i) The name and address of the owner.
- (ii) The name and description of the houseboat, the date and material of its construction and its principal dimensions.
- (iii) The name and address of the occupier.
- (iv) The situation in which the houseboat is to be moored.
- (v) Whether the houseboat will be afloat at all or any states of the tide.
- (vi) The means of communication with the shore.
- (vii) The number of occupants.
- (viii) The number of living and sleeping rooms respectively with the cubic capacity of each.
- (ix) The number and nature of other compartments.
- (x) The type of sanitary convenience.
- (xi) The nature of the provision for light (natural and artificial).
- (xii) The means of ventilation of each compartment.
- (xiii) The arrangements for cooking.
- (xiv) The arrangements for the supply of fresh water.
- (xv) The method of disposal of sewage and other refuse.

and shall sign a declaration thereon that the particulars contained therein are correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

5. On receipt of the form of application signed by the owner and on being satisfied by means of a certificate signed by the Medical

Officer of Health that the houseboat in respect of which the application is made complies with byelaws Nos. 11, 12 and 13 hereunder, and that the name of the houseboat is not the same as or similar to that of any other houseboat already registered, the Registration Authority shall register the houseboat and issue a certificate of registration to the owner, which the owner shall cause to be retained in legible condition on board the houseboat and to be available at any time for inspection by an authorised officer of the Port Authority or the Port Sanitary Authority and the name and the registered number of the houseboat shall be painted white on a black ground, in capital letters, not less than 3 inches long and proportionately broad, and figures not less than 6 inches long and proportionately broad, on each side of the houseboat.

6. The owner of a registered houseboat shall give notice in writing to the Registration Authority of every transfer, sale or change of tenancy of such houseboat within three days thereof.

7. The certificate of registration of a houseboat shall remain in force until the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued. The owner of a houseboat shall apply to the Registration Authority for renewal of the certificate of Registration of the same on or before the 1st day of November in each year.

8. The owner of a houseboat shall pay to the Registration Authority a sum of ten shillings for a certificate of Registration or renewal of Registration and an additional sum of one shilling for each duplicate thereof.

Provided that in the case of a certificate of Registration issued after the 1st day of September in any year a sum of five shillings only shall be payable.

For Prohibiting the Mooring of Houseboats except at Places Specified.

9. The owner or occupier of a houseboat shall not moor such houseboat or permit the same to be moored except at the following places, viz.:—

(a) Those portions of the undermentioned Creeks which have been allocated by the Port Authority and are shown in red colour on the plan which has been prepared in triplicate signed by and on behalf of the Port Authority and by and on behalf of the Port Sanitary Authority respectively and sealed by the Minister of Health on the date of the confirmation of these byelaws, one copy of which is deposited at the Ministry of Health, one copy at the Port Authority Harbour Service Office, Bell Wharf, Leigh-on-Sea, Essex, and the other copy at the Port Authority Harbour Service Office, Custom House, Gravesend, viz.:—

 Tewkes Creek.
 Smallgains Creek.
 Parting Gut.

(b) Any places alongside land adjoining the River Thames above Chelsea Bridge within the Port of London or the District of the Port Sanitary Authority.

(c) Any places alongside land adjoining such parts of the Rivers Roach and Swale as are within the District of the Port Sanitary Authority.

provided that such mooring is not contrary to the byelaws of any local authority, nor contrary to any direction given by any Harbour Master under Section 267 (Powers of Harbour Masters) of the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, and is not for any other reason unlawful and provided also that a houseboat shall not occupy a position within *one hundred feet in any direction* from any other houseboat or where there is not available a supply of wholesome drinking water within a reasonable distance.

Provided also that training ships and vessels used as club premises may use such moorings or facilities as shall be from time to time licensed for that purpose by the Port Authority, and that any vessel of the Port Sanitary Authority used as a boarding station may use such place in the River Thames off Gravesend as is from time to time occupied by it as a mooring place.

For Prescribing the Maximum Number of Occupants of any Houseboat.

10. The occupier of a houseboat shall not knowingly permit any room wholly or partly used as a sleeping apartment to be occupied at any one time by a greater number of persons than will allow, 320 cubic feet of free air space for each person over 10 years of age and 240 cubic feet of free air space for each person under 10 years of age, provided that if in any room any part is less than 6 feet in height, such part shall not be included in the cubic space specified above.

For requiring adequate means for the Admission of Daylight.

11. The owner of a houseboat shall provide in every living and sleeping room thereof adequate means for the admission of daylight by a window or windows opening directly into the external air and having a total area exclusive of frames equal at least to one-tenth of the floor area in such room, provided that a properly constructed skylight or deck-light opening directly into the external air and having the minimum dimensions required in the case of a window or windows may be provided in lieu of a window or windows when these are impracticable.

For requiring the provision of adequate means of Permanent Ventilation.

12. The owner of a houseboat shall provide adequate means of permanent ventilation in each living and sleeping room in the shape of permanent openings for both the inlet and outlet of air, the total area of such inlet openings being not less than 36 square inches and the total area of such outlet openings being not less than 36 square inches.

For requiring the Provision of Sanitary Conveniences and Appliances.

13. The owner of a houseboat shall provide for use therein a sanitary convenience of impervious and durable material and of such

size and shape as to permit of its being easily removed and cleansed, and a separate compartment in or on the houseboat, ventilated directly into the open air and not communicating directly with any other compartment, in which to keep the said sanitary convenience. The occupier of a houseboat shall maintain the sanitary convenience in good and sound condition and shall keep it in the separate compartment provided for that purpose as aforesaid, and shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, empty and cleanse the same; provided that this byelaw shall not apply where a suitable sanitary convenience is constructed on shore and available for use of the occupants of a houseboat.

14. The owner of a houseboat shall provide a suitable movable receptacle of impervious material and having a tight-fitting lid for the reception of domestic refuse and the occupier of a houseboat shall keep such receptacle in the open air and shall deposit all domestic refuse therein.

For Promoting the Cleanliness and Habitable Condition of Houseboats.

15. The owner of a houseboat shall provide a receptacle or receptacles for water easily accessible and properly covered having a total capacity equal to not less than five gallons for each occupant of such houseboat. The occupier of a houseboat shall at all times keep the same in good order and thoroughly clean.

16. The occupier of a houseboat shall cause the internal surfaces and the floor thereof to be thoroughly cleansed as often as may be necessary for keeping the same in a cleanly condition.

17. The owner of a houseboat shall cause the same to be maintained so that it shall be reasonably weather-proof at all times.

18. The owner of a houseboat shall cause the same to be at all times provided with a suitable dry flooring, a properly ventilated compartment for the storage of food, a cooking stove and means of keeping the houseboat warm and dry.

19. The owner of a houseboat shall cause the windows and skylights of such houseboat to be so constructed that they can be opened to at least one-third of their extent.

For Preventing the Spread of Infectious Disease by Persons Inhabiting Houseboats.

20. The occupier of a houseboat who has been informed or has otherwise ascertained or has reason to suspect that any inmate thereof is suffering from an infectious disease, shall forthwith notify the Medical Officer of Health of the name and address of the person so suffering and the nature of the illness and shall adopt all such reasonable precautions for the preventing of the spread of the disease as the Medical Officer of Health may order.

21. The occupier of a houseboat in which there is any person suffering from an infectious disease or which has not been properly disinfected subsequent to the removal or recovery of any person who has been suffering from an infectious disease on board shall:—

(a) before causing or allowing such houseboat to be moved from its moorings, give the Medical Officer of Health and the Harbour Master of the Port Authority twenty-four hours' notice of his intention to

move the houseboat and of the place to which it is proposed to move the same.

(b) not cause or allow such houseboat to be brought into any place which may for the time being be devoted to the purposes of public amusement, recreation or resort, or to be moved to any mooring place where, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, there would be danger of spreading infection.

(c) where the Medical Officer of Health, for the purpose of preventing the spread of infection, orders the removal of such houseboat from any mooring place, move the same in compliance with the order of the Medical Officer of Health.

(d) when moving such houseboat, comply with such reasonable conditions as the Medical Officer of Health may impose for the purpose of preventing the spread of infection.

(e) not move such houseboat out of the District of the Port Sanitary Authority until the same has been properly disinfected.

22. In every case where, in pursuance of any statutory provision in that behalf, an order of a Justice has been obtained for the removal from a houseboat to a hospital or other place for the reception of the sick of a person who is suffering from any dangerous infectious disorder, the occupier of such houseboat, on being informed of such order shall, in and about such removal, adopt all such precautions as the Medical Officer of Health may prescribe.

23. The occupier of a houseboat shall immediately after a person suffering from an infectious disease has been removed therefrom, or has died therein, or has recovered from such disease whilst being therein, give notice of such removal, death or recovery to the Medical Officer of Health. The occupier shall as soon as conveniently may be cause such part or parts of the houseboat as the Medical Officer of Health may prescribe to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and shall comply with all reasonable instructions of the Medical Officer of Health as to such cleansing and disinfection. The occupier shall cause all bedding, clothing or other articles therein which may be liable to retain infection, other than such as shall have been ordered to be destroyed or shall have been required to be removed for the purpose of disinfection, to be in like manner cleansed and disinfected, and shall comply with all reasonable instructions of the Medical Officer of Health as to such cleansing and disinfection. When the houseboat and every such article as aforesaid shall have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, the occupier shall give notice thereof to the Medical Officer of Health. Provided that if for any reason beyond his control the occupier has been unable to comply with any of the provisions of this byelaw it shall be the duty of the owner, on becoming aware of the fact, to comply with such provisions.

24. Neither the owner nor the occupier of a houseboat in which any person has to his know-

ledge been suffering from an infectious disease shall cause or suffer any person newly to occupy or to become an inmate of such houseboat, unless the provisions of the last preceding byelaw have been complied with.

Generally for the Prevention of Nuisances in connection with Houseboats.

25. The occupier of a houseboat shall not deposit or cause to be deposited any faecal matter or any urine or any solid or liquid refuse of any sort whatever on the foreshore and shall not deposit or cause to be deposited such matter, urine or refuse in any other place so as to cause a nuisance.

26. The occupier of a houseboat shall not keep any animal on board in such a manner as to render the houseboat filthy or unwholesome.

For Authorising the Inspection of Registered Houseboats or on behalf of the Port Sanitary Authority.

27. A person residing in a houseboat shall at all reasonable times when required by the Medical Officer of Health or a Sanitary Inspector of the Port Sanitary Authority afford such officer free access to the interior of such houseboat and any room or compartment therein.

28. A duly authorised officer of the Port Authority or the Port Sanitary Authority shall have the right to enter and inspect a registered houseboat, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of these byelaws are being complied with, and the owner and occupier thereof shall afford all reasonable facilities and assistance to such officer to carry out such inspection.

Penalties.

29. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing byelaws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of £5 and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of 40s. for each day after written notice of the offence from the Port Authority or the Port Sanitary Authority as the case may be: Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment, as a penalty, of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this byelaw.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed byelaws may do so in writing or otherwise, on or before the 12th day of October, 1936, to the undersigned.
