The Order provides that no person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle the weight of which, whether laden or unladen, and including the weight of any trailer, whether laden or unladen, drawn thereby,

exceeds three tons on so much of the Stamford—Oundle Road (A.6118) as is carried by the Wansford Old Bridge spanning the River Nene in the parishes of Wansford and Sibson-cum-Stibbington.

MIRFIELD URBAN DISTRICT TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that: 1. On the second day of September, 1936, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Mirfield Urban District Council dated the 23rd day of June, 1936, deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area situate in the Urban District of Mirfield. 2. The Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Offices, Fold Head, Mirfield, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays and between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any other week-day. 3. Any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the Urban District of Mirfield and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the pro-

perty of which he claims to be the owner, require the Mirfield Urban District Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Mirfield Urban District Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.
