#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the Constitution of the Army Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself is to be transacted in the following principal subdivisions:—
  - (a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business

- affecting the Territorial Army Associations and War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.
- (b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General to the Forces), the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quarter-Master-General to the Forces), and the Fourth Military Member of the Army Council (the Master-General of the Ordnance) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organisation, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.
- (c) The Finance Member of the Army Council (Financial Secretary of the War Office) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.
- (d) The Director-General of Munitions Production shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the production of munitions and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Permanent Under-Secretary of State shall be a Member, and Secretary, of the Army Council and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible, on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts, for the control of expenditure, and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated 17th day of December, 1931.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. #### COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

The Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 22 of the Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 1st day of October, 1936, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended as follows:—

- 1. Clause 9 shall have effect as if in the proviso to paragraph (xi) thereof for the words "Provided that if any quota is fixed for a period less than the period of allocation to which such quota relates" there were substituted the words "Provided that if any quota is fixed for a period of less than three months", and the reference were to Clause 10a of the Scheme and not to Clause 10.
- 2. After Clause 9A there shall be inserted the following Clause, that is to say:—
- "10.—(i) Where quotas for output are determined for a period of three months the Board shall open a tonnage pool (hereinafter referred to as "the pool") for that period (hereinafter referred to as "the pool period").
- (ii) (a) Any owner who desires to limit the output of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof may during the first two months of any pool period (such two months being hereinafter called "the first part of the pool period") and also during the first 20 days of the third month of such period

(such 20 days being hereinfter called "the second part of the pool period") transfer to the pool the whole or any part of the quota not required for such output.

- (b) Immediately before the end of every pool period every owner shall be deemed to have transferred to the pool all tonnage by which the output of coal or any class of coal from his coal mine for that period and any tonnage transferred by him under paragraph (ii) (a) of this Clause shall together be less than the relevant quota for his coal mine together with any quota acquired by him out of the pool.
- (iii) All tonnage in the pool during a pool period shall be allotted by the Board as follows:—
  - (a) During the first part of the pool period any owner may apply to the Board for tonnage of coal or any class of coal out of the pool and at the end of the first part of the pool period the Board shall distribute tonnage out of the pool to the extent and in satisfaction of the applications so made if the tonnage of coal or that class of coal in the pool shall be sufficient for that purpose but if the tonnage of coal or any class of coal applied for during the first part of the pool period shall exceed the tonnage of coal or that class of coal in the pool at the end of such part of the period, then the distribution shall be made pro rata to the amounts of the respective applications and the balances thereof (if any) shall be satisfied in the same proportions so far as possible out of the tonnages transferred to the pool during the second part of the pool period.
  - (b) During the second part of the pool period any owner may apply to the Board for tonnage of coal or any class of coal out of the pool and at the end of the second part of the pool period the Board shall subject to the provisions of the last preceding sub-paragraph distribute tonnage out of the pool to the extent and in satisfaction of the applications so made if the tonnage of coal or that class of coal in the pool shall be sufficient for that purpose, but if the tonnage of coal or any class of coal applied for during the second part of the pool period shall exceed the tonnage of coal or that class of coal in the pool at the end of such part of the pool period after making any distri-bution under the last preceding sub-paragraph then the distribution under this subparagraph shall be made pro rata to the amounts of the respective applications.
  - (c) Any tonnage in the pool at the end of the pool period shall be distributed among the owners, the output of coal or that class of coal from whose coal mines shall have exceeded the tonnage permitted to be raised under the relevant quotas after taking into account any tonnages already distributed to them out of the pool and so that the distributions under this sub-paragraph shall be in proportion to but not exceeding such excess tonnages. Any surplus that may then remain in the pool shall be cancelled.
  - (d) Applications made under sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph by the owner of any coal mine in any pool period shall not exceed in the aggregate 5 per cent. of the relevant quota of that coal mine.

- (iv) Every owner shall pay to the Board a sum calculated at such rate per ton not exceeding 1s. as the Board may from time to time decide for all tonnage distributed to him out of the pool. If a pool be opened in respect of the period of three months commencing on the 1st day of October, 1936, the rate shall be 1s. per ton. Any alteration of the rate of payment shall be decided by the Board not less than 28 days before the commencement of the pool period in which it is to come into force. The rate of payment for the time being so fixed by the Board is hereinafter referred to as the full rate". Payment for any tonnage distributed to an owner under the provisions of this Clause shall become due immediately on notification to him of the amount of tonnage so distributed.
- (v) The moneys received by the Board under paragraph (iv) of this Clause in respect of tonnage distributed out of the pool during a pool period shall be applied as soon as possible after the end of that period in the following manner:

First such moneys shall be divided among all owners who during the first part of the pool period have transferred tonnage to the pool and such division shall be in proportion to the tonnage so transferred but so that no owner shall thereby receive more than the full rate in respect of every ton so transferred.

Any moneys then remaining in the hands of the Board shall then be divided among all the owners who during the second part of the pool period have transferred tonnage to the pool and such division shall be in proportion to the tonnage so transferred but so that no owner shall thereby receive more than one-half of the full rate in respect of every ton so transferred."

- 3. Clause 10 shall be renumbered 10A and shall have effect as if for paragraph (i) thereof there were substituted the following paragraph, that is to say:-
  - (i) Where quotas for output are determined for a period of less than 3 months arrangements may be made by any two owners whereby the output of coal or any class of coal from the coal mine of one owner may exceed the quota in respect thereof in any period where the other owner has agreed, whether for valuable consideration or not, to limit the corresponding output from his coal mine to a tonnage which is less than the quota in respect thereof by a tonnage not less than the tonnage by which such firstmentioned quota is exceeded. If the output from any coal mine exceeds any limit so agreed, for the purposes of Clause 21 of the Scheme the corresponding quota shall be deemed to be exceeded by the amount of the excess over such limit."
- 4. Clause 21 shall have effect as if in paragraph (i) (a) (1) thereof for the words in parenthesis after the word "quota" where that word appears for the second time there were substituted the words "(after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 9 (xi) of the Scheme and any adjustment or arrangement under Clause 10 or Clause 10A of the Scheme) ".

#### NORTHAMPTONSHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

Poor Law Act, 1930: section 3. (30th September, 1936.)

Whereas by the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order (No. 2) 1930, the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1933 and the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order (No. 2) 1933 the Minister of Health made provision until the 1st day of October 1936 for the combination of the counties of Bedford and Northampton and the county borough of Northampton for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a Joint Committee named the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as hereinafter provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

#### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1936.

#### Interpretation.

- 2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them-
  - "the combined areas" means the counties and county borough for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

Joint Committee" " the means the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee constituted under the Northampton-Vagrancy Committee Order shire Joint

(No. 2) 1930;

"council" means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and "councils" means the councils of both the counties and the county borough so included;

"casual" means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

ing for or receiving poor relief;
"casual ward" means any ward, building
or premises set apart or provided for the
reception, relief or employment of casuals;

and

"the Minister" means the Minister of Health.

#### Combination of Counties and County Boroughs.

3. The counties of Bedford and Northampton and the county borough of Northampton shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

#### Joint Committee.

- 4.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the Northamptonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal.
- (2) The Joint Committee shall consist of 24 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected.
- (3) Ten members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by the council of the county of Bedford, ten by the council of the county of Northampton and four by the council of the county borough of Northampton.
- (4) Every member of the Joint Committee who is in office immediately before this Order comes into force shall continue in office subject to the provisions of this Order, until the date of the first meeting at which ordinary business is transacted after the last day of February, 1937, of the council who elected him.

#### Election of Members.

5.—(1) In each year at the first meeting of each council held after the last day of February at which ordinary business is transacted, the council shall elect from their own body the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this Order.

(2) Every member of the Joint Committee

shall come into office upon his election.

(3) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(4) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

#### Period of Office.

- 6.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.
- (2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member

was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

#### Meetings and Proceedings.

7. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

#### Appointment of Executive Sub-Committee.

8.—(1) The Joint Committee may constitute an executive sub-committee and include among the members thereof persons who are not members of the Joint Committee:

Provided that:-

- (i) of the persons who are not members of the Joint Committee at least one shall be a woman:
- (ii) of the whole number of members of the executive sub-committee two-thirds at least shall be members of the Joint Committee.
- (2) Any matter relating to the exercise by the Joint Committee of their functions under this Order, except the duty of making contribution orders on the councils or the power of borrowing money, may—

(a) be delegated to the executive sub-committee with or without any restrictions or conditions as the Joint Committee think fit,

(b) be referred to the executive sub-committee, and if so referred, the Joint Committee before exercising any such functions shall, unless in their opinion the matter is urgent, receive and consider the report of the executive sub-committee with respect to the matter in question.

#### Powers and Duties of Joint Committee.

- 9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—
  - (a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council:
  - (b) the number of casuals for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;
  - (c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas:

Provided that before making any such recommendation the Joint Committee shall notify the councils of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall have power to repay to any council the whole or any part of any expenditure incurred by the council

- (a) the provision of accommodation for casuals in accordance with any requirement of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites);
  - (b) the maintenance of casual wards;
  - (c) the reception and relief of casuals;
- (d) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;
- (e) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;
  - (f) the burial of any casual;
- (g) the maintenance, care and education of any casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;
- (h) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;
- (i) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuals:

Provided that before making any repayment of expenditure falling within any of the classes enumerated in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph, the Joint Committee shall obtain the consent of the councils.

- (4) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuals.
- (5) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuals, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.
- 10.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray any expenses necessarily incurred by members of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof in travelling to and from meetings.
- (2) The Joint Committee may confer with other Joint Committees for all or any of the purposes of this Order, and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and may also defray any expenses necessarily incurred by their representatives in travelling to and from such conferences.

#### Contracts.

11. All contracts and agreements relating to the purposes of this Order shall be made by

the Joint Committee, and shall be signed and sealed on their behalf by the presiding chairman and by two other members of the Joint Committee, and countersigned by the clerk to the Joint Committee.

#### Expenses of Joint Committee.

12. A fund shall be established to be called the Joint Fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried, and out of which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

#### Apportionment of Expenses.

13. For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee for the purposes of this Order, the council of the county of Bedford shall contribute to the Joint Fund 45 per centum the council of the county of Northampton shall contribute 43 per centum and the council of the county borough of Northampton shall contribute 12 per centum of those expenses.

#### Contribution Orders.

- 14.—(1) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as may be after the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year, make orders on each of the councils for the payment to the Joint Committee of such sums as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee.
- (2) Every order for contributions shall direct that the contribution shall be paid in one sum or by instalments, as the Joint Committee may see fit, on the dates mentioned in the order.
- (3) Any sum mentioned in any order for contributions shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed, and may be recovered accordingly: Provided that the Joint Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until after the expiration of a period of three months from the date of the order:

#### Application of Statutes and Orders.

- 15.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this Order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.
- (2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their subcommittees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised

by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the

purposes of this Order.

#### Reports.

16. The Joint Committee shall furnish to any council such reports, returns and information as that council may from time to time require.

#### Settlement of Disputes.

17. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event, the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

#### Financial Adjustments.

18. In the event of the revocation of this Order, the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities of, and any financial relations between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

#### SCHEDULE.

RULES AS TO MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS,

- 1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings for the transaction of general business which as near as may be shall be held at regular intervals.
- (2) The first meeting held after the 31st day of March in any year shall be the annual meeting.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.
- 3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least seven members are present thereat.
- 4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.
- (2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number

to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee

the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and the vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members

present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have

been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The Clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend the meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.
