Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Kingsley Eric Lawton the authority granted by the said Regulations to Registered Dentists to be in possession of and to supply by personal administration the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act,

And I also direct as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Kingsley Eric Lawton to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation)
