The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the Realm empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Exeter to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the death of the Right Reverend Father in God Rupert Ernest William Gascoyne-Cecil (Lord William Gascoyne-Cecil) D.D., late Bishop thereof; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Charles Edward Curzon, M.A., Bishop Suffragan of Stepney and Rector of St. Margaret, Lothbury, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Exeter.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932. WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

KINGSLEY ERIC LAWTON.

Whereas Kingsley Eric Lawton, L.D.S.R.C.S., Eng., of 1A, Fore Street, Brixham, Devon, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts: And whereas the said Kingsley Eric Lawton cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1923, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Kingsley Eric Lawton the authority granted by the said Regulations to Registered Dentists to be in possession of and to supply by personal administration the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

And I also direct as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Kingsley Eric Lawton to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
