In the county of Oxford.

The petty sessional division of Wootton North (except the parishes of South Newington, Barford St. John and St. Michael, and so much of the parish of Sandford St. Martin

as lies to the west of the road running from Nether Worton via Ledwell and Sandford St. Martin to Westcot Barton).

The parishes of Souldern, Fritwell, Hardwick with Tusmore, Stoke Lyne, Somerton, Ardley, Bucknell, Caversfield, Bicester, Upper Heyford, Lower Heyford, Middleton Stoney, Chesterton, Kirtlington, Bletchingdon, Weston on the Green, Tackley, and so much of the parishes of Kiddington with Asterleigh, Glympton and Wootton as lies to the north-east of the road running from Wescot Barton via Whitehouse Farm, Home Farm, Wootton and Hordley Farm to the Tackley parish boundary.

In the county of Northampton.
