

Kirkby, which has been formed out of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Kirkby in Ashfield, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 111, section 5, grant out of the Common Fund under our control to the Minister of the said District of Saint Andrew, East Kirkby, and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish, and to his successors, one yearly sum or stipend of £60 such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated from the 28th day of February, 1934, and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year. Provided always that the yearly sum or stipend hereby granted shall be and shall be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the yearly sum or stipend of like amount heretofore payable by us towards the stipend of the Curate serving the Church at East Kirkby, in the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Kirkby in Ashfield, under the authority of an Instrument which was sealed by us on the 13th day of October, 1932, and was published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month: Provided also that if at any time lands, tithes or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of £60 or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said District or New Parish of Saint Andrew, East Kirkby, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of the yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

(Provision for Unbeneficed Clergy) Measures, 1928 and 1931, do hereby grant out of our Common Fund the yearly sums amounting in all to £800 set out in Reports of our Estates Committee dated the 17th day of October and the 5th day of December, 1935, and the 12th day of March, the 7th day of May and the 23rd and 30th days of July, 1936 (which Reports were duly adopted at General Meetings), each such yearly sum to be payable during our pleasure and subject to the conditions contained in the said Regulations and the special conditions (if any) set out in the said Reports or any of them to the unbeneficed clergyman indicated in the relevant Report, to commence from the date specified in such Report and so long as it continues payable to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year.

LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT ACT, 1936.

NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 6 of the above-named Act that the London Passenger Transport Board intend to make application to the Minister of Transport for the approval of provision for the turning of trolley vehicles in the following streets or roads in the Metropolitan Borough of Battersea, being streets or roads not comprised in any of the trolley vehicle routes authorised by the above-named Act:—

1. Meyrick Road, Grant Road and Lavender Road.
2. Battersea Park Road, Candahar Road and Cabul Road.

A copy of the plan of each of the turning points has been, or will be, deposited for public inspection with the Town Clerk of the Metropolitan Borough of Battersea at his Office at the Municipal Buildings, Lavender Hill, S.W.11, on or before the 23rd day of October, 1936.

Any objection made with respect to the application by or on behalf of persons affected or interested must be sent to the Minister of Transport on or before the 14th day of November, 1936. Every objection shall be in writing and state the specific grounds of objection to the application.
