A PROCLAMATION

DIRECTING THAT SILVER COINS OF THE UNITED KINGDOM SHALL CEASE TO BE LEGAL TENDER IN THE BAHAMA ISLANDS FOR A PAYMENT OF AN AMOUNT EXCEEDING FORTY SHILLINGS.

EDWARD R.I.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the third day of February, 1898 (hereinafter called "the Proclamation"), certain provisions of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied with the modifications specified in the Proclamation of the colonies or possessions therein mentioned (including Our Bahama Islands):

And whereas it was provided by the Proclamation that silver coins which, under section four of the Coinage Act, 1870, as set out in the Proclamation, were legal tender should, in any of Our said colonies or possessions in which the like coins were at the date of the promulgation of the Proclamation therein legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount, continue to be legal tender for a payment of any amount:

And whereas the Proclamation was promulgated in Our Bahama Islands on the eighteenth day of March, 1898, and at that date the like coins were in Our Bahama Islands legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount:

And whereas by the Coinage Act, 1920, provision was made for the amendment of the Coinage Act, 1870, in respect of the standard of fineness of silver coins, and it was enacted that where by virtue of a proclamation made under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, the whole or any part of that Act was in force in any British possession at the date of the commencement of the Coinage Act, 1920, the Coinage Act, 1870, should, as from that date, apply in that possession as amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, and that any Order in Council or proclamation directing that any coins which under the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891 were legal tender in the United Kingdom should be current and legal tender in any British possession should extend to coins which were legal tender in the United Kingdom under the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1920:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us with the advice of Our Privy Council, by proclamation to revoke or alter any proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the silver coins which under section four of the Coinage Act, 1870 as set out in the Proclamation and amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, are legal tender should no longer be legal tender in Our Bahama Islands for a payment of an amount exceeding forty shillings:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said recited provisions and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. As from the 1st day of November, 1936, the silver coins which, under section four of the Coinage Act, 1870 as set out in the Proclamation and amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, are legal tender shall in our Bahama Islands be legal tender for a payment of an amount not exceeding forty shillings, but for no greater amount, and accordingly so much of the Proclamation as provides that the said silver coins shall be legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount shall, as from that date, cease to have effect as respects Our Bahama Islands.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bahama Islands (Silver Coinage) Proclamation, 1936.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and in the First year of Our Reign.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of His Most Sacred Majesty King Edward the Eighth.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of His Majesty that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure and powdered with bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz.:—

Barons, two rows.

Viscounts, two rows and a half.

Earls, three rows.

Marquesses, three rows and a half.

Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stone are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have, on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquess to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, the cape to be powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, the cape to be powdered with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, the cape to be powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three-quarters.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, the cape to be powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards.
