WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of October, 1936, (C.W./N. 4119/36) in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section VI of Schedule V to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, rates of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance were established *inter alia* for Naval Officers appointed in command of Ships or Shore Establishments:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1920, provision was made for the payment of Command Money to Lieutenant-Colonels or Majors of the Royal Marines placed in independent command of Royal Marine Battalions detached from their Divisions and Depot:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 27th day of October, 1930, payment of Command Money was authorised, at the rates approved from time to time for Lieutenant-Colonels and Majors, R.M., commanding Royal Marine Battalions, to Officers of those ranks when placed in command of other independent units, which, though not organised in the form of a Battalion, approach the strength of a Battalion and entail responsibilities analogous to those involved in the command of a Battalion:

"And whereas we consider that Captains and Commanders, Royal Navy, appointed in command of Royal Navy Battalions should receive Command Money and Entertaining Allowance; and that the rate of Command Money for Lieutenant-Colonels commanding R.M. Battalions or analogous units should be increased:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to Officers appointed in command of Royal Navy and Royal Marine Battalions at the following rates:—

the rates of Entertaining Allowance to be payable at our discretion according to circumstances.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service Hard-Lying Money is issued to the personnel on board certain vessels where the accommodation is below the usual naval standard, payment in respect of some vessels being restricted to periods during which they are employed mainly on sea service:

"And whereas the accommodation in two such vessels in Your Majesty's Navy, viz. the Trawlers *Vernon* and *Kate Lewis* at all times falls below the recognised naval standard, to the discomfort of the personnel on board, and we are therefore of opinion that Hard-Lying Money should be payable continuously in those vessels:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of Hard-Lying Money, at half rates, to the Officers and ratings on board those trawlers for the periods during which they are not in receipt of the full allowance, payment being made as from the 1st April, 1936.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

Instructor Boy	9d. a week.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 1st October, 1936, the addition, in respect of such personnel whose families are not occupying official quarters, of a fixed sum of 3s. a week to the rate of Marriage Allowance payable for a wife.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 2nd April, 1936, the payment of Marriage Allowance in respect of men of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, the Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve and the Royal Naval Wireless Auxiliary Reserve, of the age of 21 years and over.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of March, 1863, rates of Field Allowance were established for Officers and men of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines when employed in military operations on shore and not provided with quarters:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of July, 1911, allowances calculated at one-half the rates of extra pay for general work laid down in Schedule A to Order in Council of the 10th day of August, 1909, were introduced for Officers and men of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines living under canvas when landed for duty not strictly within the definition of military service:

"And whereas we consider that the rates of Field Allowance for Officers and the conditions of payment should be brought into line with those established for Your Majesty's

Army and Royal Air Force and that the necessity for payment of Living under Canvas Allowance to Officers no longer exists:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of Field Allowance to Naval and Marine Officers, and Field Allowance and Living under Canvas Allowance to men of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines at the revised rates and under the conditions set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" SCHEDULE.

" I.—*Field Allowance—Officers.*

" Rank Rate per diem.

" Flag Officers, Commodores, Captains, Commanders and Officers of relative rank ... 3s. 6d.

Lieutenant - Commanders, Lieutenants and Officers of relative rank; including Lieutenants, R.M., paid on the scale prescribed for Lieutenant ex Warrant Officer, and other Lieutenants, R.M., of over four years' commissioned service ... 3s. 0d.

Other Lieutenants, R.M., not provided for above Second Lieutenants, R.M.; Sub-Lieutenants, and Officers of relative rank; Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank, Warrant and Subordinate Officers ... 2s. 0d.

" To be paid

(a) When employed on shore service in time of peace and sleeping under canvas or in shore accommodation markedly inferior to that normally used for sleeping purposes.

(b) When employed on shore service in time of peace in military operations of a warlike nature.

(c) When employed in military operations on shore in time of war in an area specifically defined as a war area.

" II.—*Naval ratings and Royal Marine ranks.*

" Living under Canvas Allowance at 6d. per diem when employed on shore in time of peace or war and sleeping under canvas or in shore accommodation markedly inferior to that normally used for sleeping purposes.

" Field Allowance at 6d. a day when employed on shore in military operations of a warlike nature in time of peace or in military operations in time of war in an area specifically defined as a war area."

“Whereas by Section 3 of the *Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 3rd *November*, 1927, provision is made, *inter alia*, that men who are entered or re-entered after the 4th *October*, 1925, in the *Engine Room Artificer* branch, shall be petty officers while holding the acting or confirmed 4th class rating:

“And whereas men who entered or re-entered after the 4th *October*, 1925, who hold the confirmed rating of *Engine Room Artificer* 4th class and have been granted a certificate that they are capable of taking charge of a watch in the engine room of a small ship, are liable to be employed on such duties as involve additional responsibilities and are, in our opinion, deserving of the status of a chief petty officer:

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section seventeen of the *Finance Act, 1930*, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to a person resident in any foreign state through an agency in the United Kingdom or to a person resident in the United Kingdom through an agency in any foreign state are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in that foreign state; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the declaration have been made with the Government concerned with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation,

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from United Kingdom income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas it is enacted by a proviso to the said subsection that no such arrangements as aforesaid shall exempt from United Kingdom income tax any profits or gains which either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue to a person resident in the United Kingdom; or

(iii) accrue to a person not resident in the United Kingdom directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through any agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts:

And whereas the Convention set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to persons resident in the Netherlands through agencies in the United Kingdom or to persons resident in the United Kingdom through agencies in the Netherlands are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in the Netherlands; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Convention have been made with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Agency Profits (Netherlands) Declaration, 1936."

SCHEDULE.

CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN OF THE NETHERLANDS.

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands, being desirous of concluding a Convention for reciprocal exemption from taxes in certain cases, have appointed to that end as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty the King):

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Sir John Allsebrook Simon, G.C.S.I., K.C.V.O., O.B.E., K.C., M.P., His Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands:

Jonkheer R. de Marees van Swinderen, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of Orange-Nassau, Commander of the Order of the Netherlands Lion, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Her Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found to be in due form, have agreed as follows:—

Article I.

His Majesty the King undertakes that the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall, so long as the exemptions specified in Article 2 hereof remain effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Sur-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and that His Government in the United Kingdom will take the necessary action under section seventeen of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1930, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the United Kingdom, to a person who is resident in the Netherlands and is not resident in the United Kingdom, unless the profits or gains either—

(a) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(b) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom, or through an agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 2.

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands undertakes that as from the sixth day of April, 1931, and thereafter, so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective—

(a) the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall be exempted from Income Tax and Municipal Fund Tax (Inkomstenbelasting and Gemeentefondsbelasting); and

(b) any property which is owned or possessed and employed in the Netherlands by a person resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in the Netherlands for the purpose of making profits or gains to which this Article relates shall, in so far as it is employed for that purpose, be exempted from Property Tax and Defence Tax I (Vermogensbelasting and Verdedigingsbelasting I); and that Her Government will take the necessary action under the law of the 14th June, 1930 (Collection of Acts, No. 244, 1930) with a view to giving the force of law to the exemptions aforesaid.

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands further declares that, under the laws of the Netherlands relating to Dividend and Tantieme Tax (Dividend- en Tantiëmebelasting), tax is not chargeable on dividends or other sums distributed on account of profits or gains to which this Article relates by a body corporate which is resident in the United Kingdom, and undertakes that, so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective, the dividends and other sums aforesaid shall continue to be exempt from tax under the laws of the Netherlands for the time being in force relating to the said Dividend and Tantieme Tax.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the Netherlands, to a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in the Netherlands, unless the profits or gains either—

(a) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the Netherlands; or

(b) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the Netherlands or through an agency in the Netherlands where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 3.

His Majesty the King declares that under the laws in force in the United Kingdom relating to Income Tax the purchasing of goods or material in the United Kingdom, for sale or manufacture elsewhere than in the United Kingdom by a person who is resident in the Netherlands and is not resident in the United Kingdom, does not involve liability to United Kingdom Income Tax (including Sur-tax) on the part of that person notwithstanding that the purchase is effected through a branch or management in the United Kingdom or through such an agency in the United Kingdom as is mentioned in the second paragraph of Article 1 hereof.

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands undertakes that as from the sixth day of April, 1931, and thereafter, so long as the position under the laws in force in the United Kingdom

continues to be as declared in the preceding paragraph of this Article, the purchasing of goods or material in the Netherlands for sale or manufacture elsewhere than in the Netherlands by a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in the Netherlands shall not involve liability to the Netherlands taxes mentioned in Article 2 hereof on the part of that person, notwithstanding that the purchase is effected through a branch or management in the Netherlands or through such an agency in the Netherlands as is mentioned in the third paragraph of Article 2 hereof, and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands will take the necessary action under the law of the 14th June, 1930 (Collection of Acts, No. 244, 1930), with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

Article 4.

The exemptions granted under the foregoing Articles shall not extend to Income Tax chargeable in the United Kingdom under Schedule A of the Income Tax Acts or to Property Tax or Defence Tax I (Vermogensbelasting of Verdedigingsbelasting I) chargeable in the Netherlands in respect of immovable property in the Netherlands.

Article 5.

For the purposes of this Convention the word "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate, and a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom, and shall be regarded as resident in the Netherlands if its business is managed and controlled in the Netherlands.

Article 6.

The present Convention shall be ratified and shall come into force on the date of exchange of the instruments of ratification, which shall take place in London as soon as possible. The Convention may be denounced by either High Contracting Party at any time by a notice in writing given through the diplomatic channel, and shall cease to operate six months after the date on which the notice of denunciation is received.

In witness whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and affixed thereto their seals.

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas on account of urgency this Order should come into immediate operation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In Article 9 of the principal Order the following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (3):—

"(3 A) In every British aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland such particulars of or notices relating to the design construction and weight of the aircraft or the equipment thereof or to any restrictions to be observed and precautions to be taken to secure the safety of the aircraft shall be exhibited and kept exhibited in such manner and in such places in the aircraft as the Secretary of State may prescribe."

2. The following article shall be substituted for Article 30 of the principal Order:—

"30. The Secretary of State may make regulations for carrying out the purposes of this Order in respect of the following matters:—

(a) for prescribing anything which is to be prescribed under the provisions of this Order;

(b) for giving directions as respects any matter as to which the Secretary of State is by this Order authorised to give directions."

3. Article 31 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(a) in the definition of "Secretary of State" contained in paragraph (1) there shall be inserted after the words "any purpose of this Order" the words "other than the purposes of Article 30 thereof:" and

(b) the following words shall be inserted at the end of paragraph (2):—

"References to directions given by the Secretary of State shall include references

to regulations made by him and the expression 'direct' shall be construed accordingly."

4. The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 4 of Schedule I to the principal Order:—

"5. The registration of an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland may be cancelled at any time by the Secretary of State as from a date to be specified by him on his being satisfied that any of the requirements laid down in paragraph 1 of this Schedule are not complied with and thereupon the certificate of such registration shall lapse as from the specified date."

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1935 (25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and his late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the supplementary convention signed on the 15th day of October, 1935, between His late Majesty King George V and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland for the mutual extradition of criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Denmark (Extradition) Order in Council, 1936, and are as follows:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty the King and Emperor), and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland,

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals,

have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Commander Henry Fitzhardinge Berkeley Maxse, His Chargé d'Affaires *ad interim* in Copenhagen;

His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland:

For Denmark:

His Prime Minister Thorvald August Marinus Stauning, Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland on the one hand, that is to say, Denmark and Danish colonies, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty the King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty the King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, on the one hand, and on the other the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may

include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty the King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquess to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, the cape to be powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the Benefaction which has been duly secured in favour of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, which Benefaction is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and in respect of which Benefaction we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the Benefice, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, the yearly sum (if any) the amount of which is stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 111, section 5, grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the Benefice and appropriate for the benefit of such Incumbent and his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice to meet such Benefaction, the capital sum the amount of which is stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, in respect of which capital sum

so granted so long as the same or any part thereof shall remain in our hands there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice the yearly sum the amount of which is stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the yearly sums so payable in respect of the Benefaction and of the Grant to commence as from the date stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

(l) The grant will be subject to variation or withdrawal at the discretion of the Commissioners in the event of any powers of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, as extended by the Pluralities Measure, 1930, in relation to Union or otherwise being exercised in a manner to affect this Benefice.

The Township of Mawdesley and the Township of Croston as extended by the Lancashire (Central and Western Areas) Review Order 1934.

In the Rural District of Wigan—

The Townships of Parbold and Wrightington
