

include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty the King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Danish at Copenhagen the 15th day of October, 1935.

His Majesty has acceded to the said Convention in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island):

And whereas His Majesty has been advised by His Ministers in the Commonwealth of Australia to take the necessary steps to cause the said recited Acts to be applied in the case of Denmark in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island), in accordance with the said supplementary convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 9th day of November, 1936, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island) in the case of Denmark under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, as modified by the supplementary convention of the 15th October, 1935.

This Order may be cited as the "Denmark (Extradition: Commonwealth of Australia) Order in Council, 1936."

Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the Republic of Panama has acceded to the Load Line Convention.

WHEREAS the Department of Health for Scotland have, in pursuance of the powers competent to them under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that they have received a copy of an Interlocutor, dated 7th July, 1936, pronounced by the Sheriff-Substitute of Dumfries and Galloway at Stranraer; finding that the Burial Ground known as Kirkcolm Old Churchyard lying within the policies of Corsewall Estate, in the Parish of Kirkcolm and County of Wigtown, has become so overcrowded as to be contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that Burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Churchyard, in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act, except for the reservation of the right of burial in the said Churchyard of cremated human remains:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration on the 8th day of December next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or Notice thereof, be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, and that copies of this Order or Notice thereof be fixed as required by the aforesaid Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish of Kirkcolm one month before such Representation is considered.
