“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint George, East Ham, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint George, East Ham, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint George, East Ham, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order

of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Sheffield, of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, and of the said New Parish of Brightside, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set

forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Hilda, Shiregreen.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Hilda, Shiregreen, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Cuthbert, Sheffield, of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Brightside, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which taken together are bounded upon the north by the Parish of Ecclesfield in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, upon the south-east, upon the south-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Common Road where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Sheffield, of the said Parish of Ecclesfield and of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, all meet and extending thence southward along the middle of Common Road (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Sheffield, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank), for a distance of 5 chains to its junction with Shire Green Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Shire Green Lane for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wincobank Road, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of Wincobank Road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading into Wincobank Avenue near its junction with Bluebell Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wincobank Avenue, and extending thence south-westward to and along the middle of Bluebell Road for a distance of 8 chains or

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Deptford, Saint Nicholas, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Deptford, Christ Church, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Southwark, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the

said two Benefices of Deptford, Saint Nicholas, and Deptford, Christ Church, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwark and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwark signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Deptford, Saint Nicholas, is now full the Reverend Theodore William Pitman being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Deptford, Christ Church, is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is no Parsonage House belonging to either of the said Benefices or Deptford, Saint Nicholas, or Deptford, Christ Church, but there is in our hands a Fund available towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Deptford, Christ Church:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Richard, Bishop of Southwark, and the said Theodore William Pitman (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

That upon the said union taking effect a part of the endowment at present belonging to the said Benefice of Deptford, Christ Church, that is to say a capital sum of £900 held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of which an annual payment of £27 is made by us to the Incumbent

for the time being shall be applied by us together with the Parsonage House Fund in our hands belonging to the same Benefice of Deptford, Christ Church, for and towards the cost of the provision of a house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining such assistance, clerical or lay as the Bishop may from time to time approve and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely, the whole of the endowments other than the aforesaid capital sum of £900 of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Deptford, shall be charged with a sum of £235 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing such clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £235 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £235 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of defraying the cost of such clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong to the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Deptford, Saint Nicholas, and Deptford, Christ Church, jointly.

"8. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect Christ Church, Deptford, shall be taken down and the site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof and such of the materials as shall not be required for the erection of the Parish Hall hereinafter referred to shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwark under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parish Hall for the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwark.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in Christ Church, Deptford, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Nicholas, Deptford, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Southwark, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Dept-

ford, or such of them as the Bishop of Southwark shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Southwark for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Southwark which the Bishop may select at a price to be determined by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the approval of the Bishop and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Deptford, as aforesaid.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Deptford, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of Christ Church, Deptford, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwark has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, His Majesty, if He is satisfied that, in the event of the benefits conferred by Part I of the said Act being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of any foreign country, substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement in that foreign country of judgments given in the superior courts of the United Kingdom, is empowered to direct by Order in Council that Part I of the said Act shall extend to that foreign country and that such courts of that foreign country as are specified in the Order shall be deemed to be superior courts of that country for the purposes of the said Part I:

And whereas by Section 3 of the said Act it is provided that Rules of Court made for the purposes of this Act shall have effect, subject to any such provisions contained in Orders in Council made under Section 1 of the said Act as are declared by the said Orders to be necessary for giving effect to agreements made between His Majesty and foreign countries in relation to matters with respect to which there is power to make rules for the purposes of this Act:

And whereas a Convention, a copy whereof is set out in the Schedule to this Order, relating to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments, signed at Brussels on the 2nd day of May, 1934, has been ratified by His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that, in the event of Part I of the said Act being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of Belgium, substantial reciprocity of treatment will, under the terms of the said Convention, be assured as respects the enforcement in Belgium of judgments given in the superior courts of the United Kingdom; and is accordingly minded to direct that Part I of the said Act shall extend to Belgium:

And whereas it is expedient to specify the Courts in Belgium which are, for the purposes of this Act, to be deemed to be superior courts, and further in order to give effect to the said Convention, to make certain provisions in relation to matters with respect to which there is power to make Rules of Court for the purpose of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of His powers under the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

(1) This Order may be cited as "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Foreign Judgments

(Belgium) Order in Council 1936", and shall come into operation on the 28th November, 1936.

(2) Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, shall extend to Belgium.

(3) The following courts of Belgium shall be deemed superior courts of Belgium for the purposes of Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, that is to say:—

The Court of Cassation;
All Courts of Appeal;
All Tribunals of First Instance;
All Tribunals of Commerce.

(4) No security for costs shall be required to be given by any person making application for the registration of a judgment of a superior court of Belgium.

(5) All Belgian judgments which bear the executory formula prescribed by Belgian law shall be deemed to be capable of execution in Belgium at the date when the executory formula was issued. The executory formula at present in force in Belgium is that appended to the Convention signed between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians and annexed to this Order.

(6) If upon an application to register a judgment of a superior court in Belgium, the interest due up to the date of judgment on the claim in respect of which the judgment is given has been determined in the said judgment, or if a certificate given by the original court is produced specifying the rate of interest due under Belgian law upon the sum for which the judgment is given, the said judgment and the said certificate (as the case may be) shall be accepted as conclusive evidence as to the interest due up to the date of the said judgment and as to the rate of interest due under Belgian law upon the sum for which the judgment is given. If the interest due up to the date of judgment on the claim in respect of which the judgment is given has not been determined in the judgment, or if no certificate is produced, the party applying for registration may prove what is the interest due under the judgment by Belgian law up to the time of registration or what is the rate of interest due under Belgian law upon the sum for which the judgment is given.

And the Right Honourable Anthony Eden, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

SCHEDULE.

CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF THE BELGIANS PROVIDING FOR THE RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS IN CIVIL AND COMMERCIAL MATTERS, WITH PROTOCOL.

Brussels, May 2, 1934.

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and

His Majesty the King of the Belgians, being desirous to provide on the basis of reciprocity for the recognition and enforcement of judgments in civil and commercial matters;

have resolved to conclude a convention for this purpose, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

George Nevile Maltby Bland, Esquire, C.M.G., His Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Brussels, and

His Majesty the King of the Belgians:

Mr. Paul Hymans, His Minister for Foreign Affairs,

Mr. Victor Kinon, Honorary Director-General of the Ministry of Justice, Commander of the Order of the Crown, Officer of the Order of Leopold,

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

In this Convention:

1. the words "His Majesty the King and Emperor" shall mean His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India.

2. the words "territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted as meaning:

(a) on the part of His Majesty the King and Emperor, the United Kingdom (England and Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland), and any territories to which the Convention applies by reason of extensions under Article 11, of accessions under Article 13; and

(b) on the part of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, Belgium and any territories to which the Convention applies by reason of extensions under Article 12;

3. the words "superior court" shall be deemed to mean:

(a) in the case of the United Kingdom, the House of Lords, and for England and Wales, the Supreme Court of Judicature (Court of Appeal and High Court of Justice) and the Courts of Chancery of the Counties Palatine of Lancaster and Durham; for Scotland, the Court of Session; and for Northern Ireland, the Supreme Court of Judicature;

(b) and in the case of Belgium, the Court of Cassation, all Courts of Appeal, Tribunals of First Instance and Tribunals of Commerce.

All other Courts in these territories shall be deemed to be "inferior courts" for the purpose of this Convention;

4. the word "judgment" means any decision of a court, however described (judgment, order and the like), by which the rights of the parties are finally determined;

5.—(a) the words "original court" shall be deemed to mean, in relation to any judgment, the court by which such judgment was given; and the words "court applied to," the court in which it is sought to obtain recognition of a judgment, or to which an application for registration or grant of exequatur is made;

(b) the words "judgment debtor" mean the person against whom the judgment was given in the original court, and include any person against whom such judgment is enforceable in the country of the original court; and the

words "judgment creditor" mean the person in whose favour the judgment was given, and include his successor and assigns.

ARTICLE 2.

1. Judgments pronounced after the date of the entry into force of the present Convention by a superior court in the territory of one High Contracting Party, other than judgments rendered on appeal from inferior courts, shall, whatever the nationality of the judgment creditor or debtor, be recognised and enforced in the territory of the other in the cases and upon the conditions laid down in Articles 3 to 8 inclusive of the present Convention.

2. Nothing in the present Convention shall be deemed to preclude the recognition and enforcement in the territory of one High Contracting Party, in accordance with the municipal law for the time being in force in the country concerned, of judgments pronounced by a court in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, being judgments to which the present Convention does not apply, or judgments given in circumstances where the provisions of the present Convention do not require such recognition or enforcement.

ARTICLE 3.

1. Judgments in civil and commercial matters, given by any superior court in the territory of one High Contracting Party, and executory in the country of the original court, although still open to proceedings by way of opposition, appeal or setting aside shall, in the courts of the territory of the other, be recognised in all cases where no objection to the judgment can be established on any of the grounds hereinafter enumerated, that is to say, unless:

(a) In the case in question the jurisdiction of the original court is not recognised under the rules of Private International Law with regard to jurisdiction observed by the court applied to;

(b) The judgment was given in default, and the judgment debtor did not appear in the proceedings and satisfies the court applied to that he did not actually acquire knowledge of the proceedings in reasonably sufficient time to act upon it. It is understood that in all cases where it is proved that notice of the proceedings has been duly served on the defendant in conformity with the provisions of Article 3 or 4 of the Convention signed between the High Contracting Parties on the 21st June, 1922, it shall be deemed to be conclusive evidence that the defendant actually acquired knowledge of the proceedings;

(c) The judgment is one which is contrary to the public policy of the country of the court applied to;

(d) The judgment is in respect of a cause of action which had already at the date when it was given, as between the same parties, formed the subject of another judgment which is recognised under the law of the court applied to as final and conclusive;

(e) The judgment has, in the opinion of the court applied to, been obtained by fraud;

(f) In the opinion of the Court applied to, the judgment was given against a person, defendant in the proceedings, who under the rules of public international law was entitled to immunity from the jurisdiction of the

original court, and did not submit to the jurisdiction of the original court; or is sought to be enforced against a person who is entitled under the rules of public international law to immunity from the jurisdiction of the court applied to;

(g) The judgment debtor satisfies the court applied to that proceedings by way of appeal, opposition or setting aside have been instituted against the judgment in the country of the original court.

It is understood that if such proceedings have not been actually instituted, but the time for lodging an appeal, opposition or application to set aside has not expired under the law of the country of the original court, the court applied to may, if it thinks fit, adjourn its decision on the recognition of the judgment so as to allow the judgment debtor a reasonable opportunity of instituting such proceedings.

2. Recognition of a judgment shall not be refused merely on the ground that the original court has applied, in the choice of the system of law applicable to the case, rules of Private International Law different from those observed by the court applied to.

3. The recognition of a judgment under paragraph 1 of this article means that such judgment shall be treated as conclusive as to the matter thereby adjudicated upon in any further action as between the parties (judgment creditor and judgment debtor), and as to such matter shall constitute a defence against further action between them in respect of the same cause of action.

ARTICLE 4.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3, 1 (a) and without prejudice to the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of the present article, the original court shall be recognised as possessing jurisdiction in all cases:

(a) where the judgment debtor was in respect of the matter, which is the subject of the judgment, a plaintiff or counter-claimant in the proceedings in the original court;

(b) where the judgment debtor, being a defendant in the proceedings in the original court, submitted to the jurisdiction by voluntarily appearing in the proceedings. It is understood that the expression "voluntarily appearing in the proceedings" does not include an appearance merely for the purpose of protecting property situated within the jurisdiction of the original court from seizure, or of obtaining the release of property seized, or for the purpose of contesting the jurisdiction of the original court;

(c) where the judgment debtor, being a defendant in the proceedings in the original court, had before the commencement of the proceedings agreed, in respect of the subject matter of the proceedings, to submit to the jurisdiction of the original court or of the courts of the country of the original court;

(d) where, at the time when the proceedings were instituted, the judgment debtor, being a defendant in the original court, was resident in the country of the original court, or, being a company or other body corporate, had its head office in the country of the original court;

(e) where the judgment debtor, being a defendant in the original court, had, within the country of the original court, either a commercial establishment or a branch office, and the proceedings were in respect of a transaction effected through, or at, such establishment or branch office.

Nevertheless, the jurisdiction of the original court shall not be recognised in the cases referred to in sub-paragraphs (d) and (e) above if the judgment debtor satisfies the court applied to that the bringing of the proceedings in the original court was contrary to an agreement between the parties under which the dispute in question was to be settled otherwise than by proceedings in the courts of the country of the original court.

2. The provisions of paragraph 1 of this article do not apply to judgments where the subject matter of the proceedings is immovable property, nor to judgments *in rem* in respect of movable property. Nevertheless, in these cases the jurisdiction of the original court shall be recognised if such property was situated within the country of the original court.

3. The provisions of paragraph 1 of this article do not apply:

(a) to judgments in matters of family law or status (including divorces or other judgments in matrimonial causes);

(b) to judgments in matters of succession, or the administration of the estates of deceased persons;

(c) to judgments in bankruptcy proceedings, or proceedings for the winding up of companies or other bodies corporate.

In the case of judgments given in proceedings of the kind referred to in the present paragraph, the jurisdiction of the original court shall be recognised in all cases where such recognition is in accordance with the rules of Private International Law observed by the court applied to.

4. Recognition of the jurisdiction of the original court shall not be refused on the ground that the original court had no jurisdiction under the law of its own country, if the judgment is executory in the country of the original court.

ARTICLE 5.

1. Judgments, to which the present article applies, given by a superior court in the territory of one High Contracting Party shall be enforced by the courts of the territory of the other High Contracting Party in the manner and upon the conditions set out in Articles 6 to 8 inclusive.

2. The judgments to which the present article applies are judgments in civil or commercial matters, including judgments for the payment of a sum of money as compensation upon the claim of an injured party appearing as "partie civile" in criminal proceedings,

(a) which are capable of being executed in the country of the original court although still open to proceedings by way of opposition, appeal or setting aside;

(b) whereby a definite sum of money is made payable, including judgments for the payment of costs in civil or commercial matters;

(c) to the recognition of which none of the objections set out in Article 3 can be established.

3. The provisions of this article do not apply to judgments for the payment of a sum of money for any form of taxation, State or Municipal, or for the payment of penalties.

ARTICLE 6.

1. In order that any judgment of a superior court in the territory of His Majesty the King and Emperor should be enforced in Belgium, it is necessary that an application for the grant of an exequatur accompanied by a certified copy of the judgment issued by the original court, including full particulars as regards the proceedings and the causes of action in respect of which it was given, should be made in Belgium, in accordance with the procedure of the court applied to, to the Tribunal of First Instance of the district where the execution is sought.

2. Any judgment in respect of which a certified copy has been issued by the original court shall be deemed to have been a judgment which was capable of execution in the country of the original court at the time the certified copy was issued.

3. If such application is made, exequatur shall be granted unless the judgment debtor satisfies the court applied to:

(a) that the judgment debt has been wholly satisfied, or

(b) that the right to enforce the judgment debt is not vested in the person by whom the application is made.

ARTICLE 7.

1. In order that any judgment of a superior court in the territory of His Majesty the King of the Belgians should be enforced in the United Kingdom, it is necessary that an application for its registration accompanied by a certified copy of the judgment issued by the original court, including the reasons therefor, should be duly made:

(a) in England and Wales to the High Court of Justice;

(b) in Scotland to the Court of Session;

(c) in Northern Ireland to the Supreme Court of Judicature, in accordance with the procedure of the court applied to.

2. All Belgian judgments which bear the executory formula prescribed by Belgian law shall be deemed to be capable of execution in Belgium within the meaning of Article 5, 2 (a). The formula at present in force is that set out in the *Annex* to the present Convention.

3. If such application is made, registration shall be granted unless the judgment debtor satisfies the court applied to:

(a) that the judgment debt has been wholly satisfied, or

(b) that the right to enforce the judgment debt is not vested in the person by whom the application is made.

ARTICLE 8.

1. Where an exequatur has been granted in respect of any judgment under Article 6, or where any judgment has been registered under Article 7, such judgment shall, as from the date of registration or grant of exequatur, be as regards all questions relating to its

execution in the country of the court applied to in the same position as a judgment originally given by the court applied to at the date of registration or grant of exequatur, and the court applied to shall have the same control and jurisdiction over the judgment, in so far as related to its execution, as it has over similar judgments given by itself.

2. A copy of any judgment, certified by the original court, and attested with its seal, shall be accepted without the necessity of further legalisation.

3. The procedure for the registration of a judgment under Article 7, and the procedure for the grant of an exequatur to a judgment under Article 6 shall be simple and summary, and no deposit by way of security for costs or *cautio judicatum solvi* shall be required of any person making application for such registration, or for the grant of an exequatur.

4. A period of not less than six years, running from the date of the judgment of the original court, if no proceedings have been taken against the judgment in the country of the original court, or from the date of the judgment given in the last instance if such proceedings have been taken, shall be allowed for the purpose of making an application for registration under Article 7 or for the grant of an exequatur under Article 6.

5. It is understood—

(1) that, if it is found by the court applied to that the judgment debt, whose enforcement is sought by registration under Article 7 or by exequatur under Article 6 has been partly but not wholly satisfied, registration or exequatur shall be granted so as to permit of its execution in respect of the unpaid balance provided that the judgment is otherwise one which satisfies the conditions laid down in the present Convention;

(2) that, if it is found by the court applied to that a judgment, whose enforcement is sought by registration under Article 7 or by exequatur under Article 6, is one under which sums of money are payable in respect of different heads of claim, and that reasons for the refusal of the registration or executory declaration exist in respect of some, but not of all, the grounds of claim, registration or exequatur shall be granted in respect of the sums of money due under those portions of the judgment to the enforcement of which no objection under the provisions of this Convention is established;

(3) that, if under a judgment a sum of money is payable, which is expressed in a currency other than that of the country of the court applied to, the law of the country of the court applied to shall determine if, and if so in what manner, the amount payable under the judgment may or shall be converted into the currency of the court applied to for the purposes of the satisfaction or enforcement of the judgment debt.

6. When granting registration or exequatur, the court applied to shall, if so requested by the proper party, include the amount due by way of interest up to the date of the grant of registration or exequatur. If the interest due on the claim up to the date of the judgment has been determined in the judgment of the original court, and a certificate is produced

emanating from the original court, specifying the rate at which, in accordance with the law of the country of the original court, interest should be allowed as from that date upon the sum for which the judgment is given, the court applied to shall follow the indications so given in determining the amount of the interest. If this is not the case, the party claiming interest may prove what is the sum due under the law of the original court by way of interest on the claim which forms the subject of the judgment.

As from the date of registration or exequatur, interest shall be allowed at 4 per cent. on the total sum (principal and interest) in respect of which registration or exequatur is granted.

ARTICLE 9.

Any difficulties which may arise in connexion with the interpretation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

It is, however, understood that the decisions of the respective courts of the territories of the High Contracting Parties cannot be reopened.

ARTICLE 10.

The present Convention, of which the English and French texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in London.

The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged, and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

ARTICLE 11.

1. His Majesty the King and Emperor may at any time, while the Convention is in force under Article 10, and provided that an agreement has been first concluded by an exchange of notes on the points mentioned in paragraph 2 of this article, by a notification given through His Ambassador at Brussels, extend the operation of this Convention to the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, any of His Colonies, overseas territories or Protectorates, or to any territories under His suzerainty, or to any mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Government in the United Kingdom.

2. Prior to any notification of extension in respect of any territory under the preceding paragraph, an agreement shall be concluded between the High Contracting Parties by exchange of notes as to the courts of the territory concerned which shall be deemed to be "superior courts" for the purpose of the Convention, and the courts to which application for registration of any judgment shall be made.

3. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

4. Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an exten-

sion of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph 1 of this article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

5. The termination of the Convention under Article 10 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph 1 of this article.

ARTICLE 12.

1. His Majesty the King of the Belgians may at any time, while the Convention is in force under Article 10, and provided that an agreement has been first concluded by an exchange of notes on the points mentioned in paragraph 2 of this article, extend this Convention to the Belgian Congo or to the mandated territories administered by Belgium by a notification given through His Ambassador in London.

2. Prior to any notification of extension in respect of any territory under the preceding paragraph, an agreement shall be concluded between the High Contracting Parties by exchange of notes as to the courts of the territory concerned which shall be deemed to be "superior courts" for the purposes of the present Convention, and the Courts to which application for the grant of an exequatur in respect of any judgment shall be made.

3. The provisions of paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 of Article 11 shall apply to any of the territories above mentioned to which this Convention has been extended.

ARTICLE 13.

1. The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King and Emperor may, at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 10 or by virtue of any accession under this article, and provided that an agreement has been concluded by an exchange of notes on the points mentioned in paragraph 2 of this article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any other member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when His Majesty the King of the Belgians has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty the King and Emperor to which the Convention applies.

2. Prior to any notification of accession under the preceding paragraph an agreement shall be concluded between the High Contracting Parties by an exchange of notes as to the courts in the country concerned which shall be deemed to be "superior courts" for the purposes of the present Convention, and the courts to which application for registration of any judgments shall be made.

3. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of the notification.

4. After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph 1 of this article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of

which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 10 shall not affect its application to any such country.

5. Any notification of accession under paragraph 1 of this article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph 4 shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Convention, in English and French texts, and have affixed thereto their seals.

PROTOCOL.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries at the moment of signing the Convention between His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, relating to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments, declare that it is understood that nothing in Article 4 of the said Convention shall be deemed to oblige the Belgian courts to recognise the jurisdiction of a court in the territory of His Majesty the King and Emperor in cases relating to contracts of assurance where the assured are persons of Belgian nationality and exclusive jurisdiction is conferred on the Belgian courts by Article 1 of the Belgian law of the 20th April, 1920 (which article is incorporated as Article 43 *bis* in the Belgian law of the 25th March, 1876, relating to the jurisdiction of the Belgian courts).

This Protocol shall be deemed to be an integral part of the Convention to which it relates.

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section as amended by Section 5 and Part II of the Schedule of the Milk (Extension of Temporary Provisions) Act, 1936, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before October, 1939, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of November, 1936, is 5.93 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.

PORT OF LONDON AUTHORITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Port of London Authority propose to make the following byelaws for the regulation of the River Thames within the limits of the Port of London and the navigation thereof and for other purposes in substitution for the Port of London River Byelaws, 1914, as amended by Byelaws made in 1922, 1924, 1925, 1926, 1930 and 1934:—

The Port of London Authority in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, and of every other power them thereunto enabling do make the following Bye-laws that is to say:—

I.—General.

1. All Bye-laws made under the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, as amended by the Port of London Act, 1908, and the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, for the regulation of the navigation of the River Thames and for the management and improvement of the said River and of the lands appertaining thereto and for the government good order and regulation of vessels in or upon the said River and of persons navigating the same or using the towing paths piers landing places or any of the locks thereof so far as the same relate to the Thames as herein defined, except the Thames Motor Launch Bye-laws, for the time being in force, shall after these present Bye-laws have come into operation be and the same are hereby accordingly repealed.

2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London River Bye-laws, 1936" and shall come into operation on the expiration of fourteen days after the date of the confirmation thereof by the Minister of Transport.

3. The marginal and foot notes herein and the diagrams and other information contained in the Appendices hereto are for convenience and reference only and shall not in any way affect the construction of these Bye-laws and are not to be deemed to be part thereof.

4. These Bye-laws shall be applicable to so much of the River Thames as is between an imaginary straight line drawn from high water mark on the bank of the River Thames

at the boundary line between the parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the County of Middlesex to high water mark on the Surrey bank of the River immediately opposite the first-mentioned point (hereinafter referred to as the "Landward Limit") and an imaginary straight line drawn from the London Stone at the entrance to Yantlet Creek in the County of Kent to the City Stone eastward of Canvey Island (the Crow Stone) in the County of Essex (hereinafter referred to as the "Yantlet Creek Limit") including so much of the River Lee and Bow Creek respectively as are below the South Boundary Stones in the Lee Conservancy Act, 1868, mentioned and all locks cuts and works within the said portions of rivers and creeks; but not to any dock lock canal or cut existing at the passing of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority or to any bridge over the River Thames belonging to or vested in any County Council or Municipal Authority or to or in any Railway Company.

Provided that the Bye-laws numbered 30, 31, 52 and 66 relating to Vessels Turning Round, Vessels not Under Command, Vessels Sunk and the Report of a lost Anchor or Cable respectively shall be applicable to so much of the River Thames as is between the Landward Limit and an imaginary straight line drawn from the Pilot Mark at the entrance to Havengore Creek in the County of Essex on a bearing one hundred and sixty-six degrees reckoned clockwise from the true North Point of the compass to high water mark on the Kent bank of the River (hereinafter referred to as the "Seaward Limit").

II.—Preliminary.

5. In these Bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, viz. :—

(i) The expression "Port Authority" means the Port of London Authority.

(ii) The expression "the Thames" or "the River" means and includes that part of the River Thames to which these Bye-laws are made applicable.

(iii) The word "vessel" includes any ship hulk tug yacht launch dredger lighter floating structure boat hydro-plane or craft whatever whether navigated by steam or otherwise.

(iv) The expression "steam vessel" includes any vessel propelled by machinery.

(v) The expression "steam launch" applies to a steam vessel not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and not being certified by the Board of Trade to carry passengers.

(vi) The word "dredger" includes any vessel equipped with machinery for the purposes of dredging and whether self-propelled or not.

(vii) The word "lighter" means any dumb barge or other like craft for carrying goods. A sailing barge shall be deemed to be a lighter when her mast and gear are lowered on deck.

(viii) The expression "floating structure" means any float raft or float of timber

pontoon caisson non-propelling grain or coal elevator floating dock non-propelling floating crane non-propelling floating derrick or houseboat.

(ix) The word "boat" shall include any keel rowboat randan wherry skiff dinghy shallop punt or canoe.

(x) The word "length" when used in relation to any vessel means the length appearing in her certificate of registry.

(xi) The expression "under steam" means under any mechanical power.

(xii) The expression "under way" when used in relation to a vessel means when she is not at anchor or moored or berthed or aground and includes a vessel dropping up or down the River with her anchor on the ground.

(xiii) The expression "at anchor" when used in relation to a vessel means when she is lying at single anchor by cable or hawser from ahead or astern only.

(xiv) The word "moored" when used in relation to a vessel means when she is lying in the River either :—

(a) Secured by two separate anchors and cables or hawsers from ahead only; or

(b) Secured both ahead and astern by anchors and cables; or

(c) Made fast to a mooring buoy or buoys; or

(d) Secured alongside of or to a vessel secured or made fast in the manner specified in (a) or (b) or (c) hereof or to a vessel at anchor.

(xv) The word "berthed" when used in relation to a vessel means when she is secured in any manner to a wharf pier jetty stage dolphin or River wall or bank or secured to any other vessel so berthed.

(xvi) The expression "by night" means between sunset and sunrise.

(xvii) The expression "by day" means between sunrise and sunset.

(xviii) The word "visible" when applied to lights means visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere.

(xix) The expression "day mark" means any flag burgee pennant ball shape cone cylinder drum or any other object whatsoever of such colour form dimensions or character as are prescribed by these Bye-laws to be exhibited by day whether singly or combined by any vessel as a visual signal.

(xx) The expression "steam whistle" includes any efficient whistle or siren sounded by steam or some substitute for steam.

(xxi) The expression "short blast" means a blast of about one second's duration.

(xxii) The expression "prolonged blast" means a blast of from four to six seconds' duration.

(xxiii) The word "master" when used in relation to any vessel means any person whether the owner master or other person lawfully or wrongfully having or taking the command charge or management of the vessel for the time being.

(xxiv) The expression "the Harbour-master" means and applies to each of the harbour-masters and to any person authorised in writing by the Port Authority to assist them or to perform the duties of a harbour-master.

(xxv) The word "officer" means any officer of the Port Authority or any person employed by them to carry out the provisions of these Bye-laws.

(xxvi) The expression "the Secretary" means the person for the time being acting as Secretary to the Port Authority.

(xxvii) The word "person" includes a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

(xxviii) The word "certificate" means a certificate in writing signed by the Secretary.

(xxix) The expression "permission of the Port Authority" "consent of the Port Authority" or "approval of the Port Authority" means permission consent or approval of the Port Authority in writing signed by the Secretary.

(xxx) The expression "due notice" means a notice in writing given by the Port Authority or by any person duly authorised by them to act on their behalf.

(xxxi) The expression "in writing" applied to any document includes documents wholly printed or wholly written or partly printed and partly written.

(xxxii) The words importing the masculine gender shall include females and words in the singular shall include the plural and words in the plural shall include the singular.

6. In these Bye-laws every steam vessel which is under sail and not under steam is to be considered a sailing vessel and every vessel under steam whether under sail or not is to be considered a steam vessel.

III.—*Lights and other Visual Signals and Day Marks.*

7. The master of every vessel shall comply with the following Bye-laws as to visual signals in all weathers as to lights *by night* and as to other visual signals or day marks *by day* and during such times no other lights or other visual signals or day marks which may be mistaken for or impair the visibility of the lights or other visual signals or day marks prescribed by these Bye-laws shall be exhibited.

Provided that every vessel may, when visibility is bad, exhibit *by day* the appropriate lights prescribed for vessels *by night* in addition to the visual signals or day marks.

8. A steam vessel other than a steam launch when under way shall exhibit *by night*:—

(a) On or in front of the foremast or if a vessel without a foremast then in the fore part of the vessel a bright white light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the vessel, viz., from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on either side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 2 miles.

(b) Either forward or aft of the white light mentioned in sub-clause (a) a second white light similar in construction and character to that light.

Vessels of less than 150 feet in length shall not be required to carry this second white light but may do so.

Provided always that sub-clause (b) shall not apply to any steam vessel navigating above London Bridge.

(c) These two white lights shall be so placed in line with the keel that one shall be at least 15 feet higher than the other and in such a position that the lower light shall be forward of the upper one and higher than the side lights mentioned in sub-clauses (d) and (e). The vertical distance between the two white lights shall be less than the horizontal distance. The lower of these two white lights, or if only one is carried then that light shall be placed at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet and if the breadth of the vessel exceeds 20 feet then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, so however that the light need not be carried at a greater height above the hull than 40 feet.

Provided that steam vessels which navigate both above and below London Bridge shall not be required to exhibit their lights at a greater height than 12 feet above the hull.

Steam vessels, when navigating above London Bridge, may exhibit the bright white light at any convenient height above and in line with the stem, and if practicable above the level of the side lights mentioned in sub-clauses (d) and (e).

(d) On the starboard side a green light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(e) On the port side a red light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(f) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least 3 feet forward from the light so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

9. A vessel (other than steam launches lighters floating structures and boats) when under way shall *by night* carry at her stern a white light so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 12 points of the compass, viz., for 6 points from right aft on each side of the vessel, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile. Such light shall be carried as nearly as practicable on the same level as the side lights.

10. A vessel of 100 feet and upwards in length eastward of an imaginary line drawn in a true northerly direction from the Globe Stairs at Rotherhithe, which is not under command, shall *by night* exhibit where they can best be seen, and if a steam vessel in lieu of the white steaming lights required by Bye-law 8 (a) and (b) 2 red lights in a vertical line one above the other not less than 4 feet apart so placed that the lower one shall not be less than 12 feet above the hull and of such a character as to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 2 miles and shall *by day* exhibit in a vertical line one above the other not less than 4 feet apart 2 black balls or shapes each 2 feet in diameter.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage or to lighters, floating structures or boats.

11. Every steam launch when under way shall *by night* exhibit:—

(a) On or before the foremast, or if there be no foremast on the funnel or on a staff at the bow, in either case at a height above the hull of not less than 4 feet and if practicable above the level of the side lights mentioned in sub-clauses (b) and (c) hereof a white light so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the vessel, viz., from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on either side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(b) On the starboard side a green light so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(c) On the port side a red light so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(d) Every steam launch shall keep at hand lighted and ready for use a white light which shall on the approach of an overtaking vessel be shown in sufficient time to prevent collision.

12. A sailing vessel under way and any vessel not under steam being towed shall *by night* exhibit the same lights as are prescribed by Bye-law 8 for a steam vessel under way with the exception of the white steaming lights mentioned therein which they shall never exhibit.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to Lighters, Floating Structures and Boats.

13. Lighters and Floating Structures when under way and not in tow shall *by night* have a white light visible all round the horizon always ready and the person in charge thereof shall exhibit the same on the approach of any vessel and Boats when under way shall *by night* have ready at hand a lantern showing a white light which shall be temporarily exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to petroleum barges as defined in the Bye-laws made by the Port Authority with respect to the loading, discharge, etc., of Petroleum Spirit in the Port of London.

14. (a) A steam vessel, when towing another vessel or when attached to another vessel for the purpose of towing or manœuvring the same, shall be fitted with a mast of not less than 15 feet in height above the hull unless such towing vessel has a funnel of such a height as to be visible above the vessel being towed or attached to the towing vessel and shall *by night* in addition to her side lights exhibit 2 white lights in a vertical line one above the other not less than 4 feet apart. Each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character and one of them shall be exhibited in the same position as the white steaming light mentioned in Bye-law 8 (a) and the lowest light shall, if practicable, be exhibited above the level of the side lights.

The vessels towing and the vessels towed, except the last vessel of the tow, may *by night* carry in lieu of the stern light required in

Bye-law 9 a white light abaft the funnel or aftermast for the tow to steer by but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam.

(b) The person in charge of a lighter or floating structure being towed shall *by night* when the towage has commenced and during the towage exhibit a white light similar to that mentioned in Bye-law 13 on the stern or after part of such lighter or floating structure.

Provided that if more than one such lighter or floating structure is being towed astern of a vessel, the white light above referred to shall be exhibited either

(i) on the stern of the aftermost lighter or floating structure; or

(ii) on the stern of the lighter or floating structure which lies on the port side of any lighters or floating structures being towed abreast in a single rank, or in the last of several ranks, the stern of any one of which does not extend beyond the stern of any other in such rank.

(c) The master of a steam vessel shall not *by night* commence to tow any lighter or floating structure unless the white light mentioned in the foregoing provisions is exhibited.

(d) The master of a steam vessel shall not *by night* tow any lighter or floating structure made fast alongside such steam vessel unless a white light of the construction and character above-mentioned is exhibited on the side of such lighter or floating structure farthest from such steam vessel.

15. Steam vessels plying as Ferries when crossing directly from one side of the River towards the other side shall *by night* in addition to the side lights exhibit 2 lights in a vertical line one above the other not less than 4 feet or more than 6 feet apart, the upper light red and the lower one white, and each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character and one of them shall be exhibited in the same position as the white steaming light which other steam vessels are required to exhibit by Sub-clause (a) of Bye-law 8 and also shall in addition *by night* exhibit from the stern 2 lights in a vertical line one above the other not less than 4 feet or more than 6 feet apart, the upper light red and the lower one white and each of the lights shall be of the same construction and character and shall be exhibited from the same position as the stern light prescribed in Bye-law 9.

Provided that during such times as the said vessels are berthed they shall cease to exhibit their side lights and shall not exhibit the Riding Light required by Bye-law 16 (a) or (b).

Steam vessels plying as ferries when crossing directly from one side of the River towards the other side and when berthed whilst so plying shall *by day* exhibit 3 black shapes, the upper and lower to be spherical, not less than 2 feet in diameter and the centre shape to be cylindrical not less than 2 feet in length and 9 inches in diameter which shall be placed vertically in the forward part of the vessel not less than 3 feet apart.

16.—(a) A vessel under 150 feet in length when at anchor or moored or berthed shall *by night* exhibit forward where it can best be seen but at a height not exceeding 20 feet above the hull a white light referred to in these Bye-laws as the "Riding Light" in a lantern so

constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 2 miles.

Provided that in the case of a lighter it shall be deemed to be a due compliance with this Bye-law if the Riding Light be so placed on the highest available part of the lighter or her cargo as to be visible all round the horizon.

(b) A vessel of 150 feet or upwards in length, when at anchor or moored or berthed, shall *by night* exhibit in the forward part of the vessel at a height of not less than 20 feet above the hull one such Riding Light and at or near the stern of the vessel and at such a height that it shall be not less than 15 feet lower than the forward Riding Light another such Riding Light.

Provided that:—

(c) Where masted vessels are moored in the tiers only the outermost offshore of such vessels in each tier shall *by night* be required to exhibit the Riding Light or Riding Lights.

(d) Where masted vessels are berthed the outermost offshore of such vessels as are in the fairway shall *by night* be required to exhibit the Riding Light or Riding Lights.

(e) Lighters moored or berthed shall not be required to exhibit the Riding Light.

(f) Every vessel moored permanently ahead and astern in the River shall *by night* in addition to or in lieu of the Riding Light exhibit such light or lights as the Port Authority shall from time to time order or direct.

17. All vessels when at anchor or moored in the River shall by day exhibit where it can best be seen a black ball or shape 2 feet in diameter.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to:—

- (a) Vessels moored at tiers.
- (b) Vessels used as hulks and moored fore and aft.
- (c) Sailing barges at anchor or moored above London Bridge.
- (d) Yachts not exceeding 20 tons burden.
- (e) Lighters.
- (f) Floating Structures.
- (g) Boats.

18. A vessel when anchored by means of a stern anchor only shall in addition to the Riding Lights and Day Marks prescribed by Bye-laws 16 and 17 exhibit near the stern and where they can best be seen at the same height as the forward Riding Light prescribed by Bye-law 16 *by night* 3 red lights 6 feet apart in a triangle apex uppermost at right angles to the keel in lanterns so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile and *by day* a black cylindrical shape 3 feet 6 inches in length and 1 foot 6 inches in diameter.

19. Every dredger at anchor or moored in the River for the purpose of dredging shall *by night* in addition to the Riding Lights prescribed by Bye-law 16 exhibit 3 white lights in globular lanterns not less than 8 inches in diameter placed in a triangular form with the apex uppermost at right angles to the keel not less than 6 feet apart on the highest part of the framework athwartships and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

20. A vessel of 100 feet or upwards in length other than a Lighter when aground in or near the fairway shall *by night* exhibit the Riding Light or Riding Lights prescribed in Bye-law 16 and in addition where they can best be seen, 2 red lights in a vertical line, one over the other not less than 5 feet apart so placed that the lower light shall not be less than 14 feet above the hull and of such a character as to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile and *by day* where they can best be seen, 3 black balls or shapes each 2 feet in diameter placed in a vertical line one over the other.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to:—

- (a) Vessels above London Bridge, or
- (b) Vessels berthed, or
- (c) Lighters and Sailing Barges.

21. The master of any vessel which is aground in the fairway off any drawdock above Richmond Lock shall *by night* exhibit from such vessel where it can best be seen a globular lantern showing a clear uniform and unbroken white light all round the horizon and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least 1 mile.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to Boats.

22.—(a) All vessels when employed to mark the positions of wrecks or other obstructions shall exhibit where they can best be seen *by night* 2 green lights placed horizontally not less than 6 feet or more than 12 feet apart in such a position and of such a character as to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile and *by day* a green flag and 2 green balls or shapes placed horizontally not less than 6 feet or more than 12 feet apart and shall not exhibit any other lights or day marks.

(b) All vessels engaged in underwater work shall, if under way, exhibit where they can best be seen *by night* 2 green lights placed horizontally not less than 6 feet or more than 12 feet apart in such a position and of such a character as to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile in addition to the lights prescribed for a vessel under way and if at anchor or moored shall exhibit the said 2 green lights and not any other lights, and *by day* a green flag with 2 green balls or shapes placed horizontally whether under way or not, not less than 6 feet or more than 12 feet apart and shall not exhibit any other day mark.

23. Every vessel shall when approaching be kept well clear of any vessel exhibiting the lights or day marks prescribed by Bye-law 22 (viz. vessels marking wrecks and obstructions or engaged upon underwater work) and shall be navigated with care and caution and at such a speed and in such a manner as not to cause damage thereto or to endanger the lives of those engaged in underwater work.

24.—(a) The master of every vessel intending to proceed up the River past the Tower Bridge and requiring the bascules to be raised shall notwithstanding any previous Bye-law or Regulation and in addition to the lights prescribed to be exhibited by such vessel when under way *by night* exhibit before arriving at Cherry Garden Pier and shall continue to exhibit until such vessel shall have passed clear

of the said Bridge the following lights and day marks:—

(i) *By night* 2 red lights in globular lanterns not less than 8 inches each in diameter placed vertically 6 feet apart at a height of not less than 20 feet above the hull in such a position where they can best be seen and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile.

(ii) *By day* a black ball or shape not less than 2 feet in diameter placed in such a position where it can best be seen at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet and a pennant from the International Code of Signals immediately below the said ball or shape.

(b) The master of every vessel intending to proceed down the River past the said Bridge and requiring the bascules to be raised shall, notwithstanding any previous Bye-law or Regulation and in addition to the lights prescribed to be exhibited by such vessel when under way exhibit the lights and day marks prescribed by sub-clause (a) of this Bye-law (viz. *by night* 2 red lights placed vertically and *by day* a black ball or shape and a pennant immediately below) until the vessel has passed clear of the said Bridge.

(c) The master of every steam vessel intending to pass up the River past the said Bridge and requiring the bascules to be raised shall in foggy weather, in addition to the lights and day marks prescribed by sub-clause (a) of this Bye-law (viz. *by night* 2 red lights placed vertically and *by day* a black ball or shape and a pennant immediately below) sound when passing the Cherry Garden Pier a prolonged blast of the steam whistle followed by 3 short blasts in rapid succession and shall repeat such signal at moderate intervals until the vessel is in sight of the said Bridge.

This signal shall not be used in clear weather.

(d) The master of every steam vessel intending to pass down the River past the said Bridge and requiring the bascules to be raised shall, both in foggy and clear weather, in addition to the lights and day marks prescribed by sub-clause (a) of this Bye-law (viz. *by night* 2 red lights placed vertically and *by day* a black ball or shape and a pennant immediately below) give the sound signal mentioned in sub-clause (c) of this Bye-law (viz. a prolonged blast followed by 3 short blasts in rapid succession) when such vessel is ready and in position to proceed past the said Bridge.

25. A vessel under way under sail, when also under steam, shall carry *by day* a black cone 2 feet in diameter at its base point upwards, which shall be exhibited from the highest point of the masthead, where it can be visible all round the horizon.

26.—(a) All vessels fishing with nets, lines or trawls when under way or at anchor with their gear out, shall *by night* in addition to the lights prescribed for a vessel under way or at anchor, exhibit where it can best be seen, a flare on the approach of other vessels.

(b) All vessels fishing with nets, lines or trawls when under way shall *by day* exhibit a basket where it can best be seen.

(c) If such vessels at anchor have their gear out they shall *by day*, on the approach of

other vessels, show the same day mark on the side on which those vessels can pass.

IV.—Sound Signals.

27. The signals by whistle mentioned in the following Bye-laws shall be made by steam whistle and shall not be used on any occasion or for any purpose except those therein mentioned or those from time to time authorised by the Port Authority and no other signal by whistle shall be made by any vessel.

28.—(a) A steam vessel shall be provided with an efficient steam whistle so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstruction and with an efficient foghorn to be sounded by mechanical means and also with an efficient bell. Steam vessels of 350 feet in length and upwards shall also be provided with a gong or other instrument the tone of which cannot be confused with the ringing of a bell.

(b) A sailing vessel of 20 tons gross tonnage or upwards shall be provided with a similar foghorn and bell.

(c) A Dredger shall be provided with an efficient triangle.

29. All signals prescribed by these Bye-laws for vessels under way shall be given:—

(1) By steam vessels—on the steam whistle.

(2) By sailing vessels and vessels which are being towed and are not under steam other than lighters—on the foghorn.

30. When a steam vessel under way (which includes a tug with a tow) is about to turn round *by night* or *by day* she shall signify the same by 4 short blasts on the steam whistle in rapid succession followed after a short interval if turning with her head to starboard by 1 short blast, and if with her head to port by 2 short blasts, and whilst turning shall repeat such signal to any approaching vessel, which latter vessel shall take action to avoid collision.

31. When a steam vessel under way *by night* or *by day* is for any reason not under command or is unable to manoeuvre as required by these Bye-laws she shall signify the same to any approaching vessel by 4 short blasts on her steam whistle in rapid succession and thereupon such approaching vessel shall take action to avoid collision.

32. When a steam vessel under way takes the ground she shall immediately signify the same by 5 or more short blasts on her steam whistle in rapid succession and shall repeat such signal at short intervals until she shall have exhibited the lights or day marks prescribed by Bye-law 20 hereof (viz. *by night* 2 red lights in a vertical line and *by day* 3 black balls or shapes where they can best be seen).

33. A steam vessel coming out of a dock basin or lock or leaving a wharf jetty or tier shall signify the same by a prolonged blast on her steam whistle except in the case of a steam vessel coming out of the St. Katharine Docks requiring the bascules of Tower Bridge to be raised in order to get into position in the River which shall signify the same by a prolonged blast on her steam whistle followed by 3 short blasts in rapid succession.

In the case of a vessel not under steam the tug in attendance shall make the foregoing signals.

34. When vessels are in sight of one another a steam vessel under way and taking any course authorised or required by these Bye-laws shall indicate that course by the following signals on her steam whistle, viz. :—

1 short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard."

2 short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port."

3 short blasts to mean "My engines are going astern."

35. Every vessel shall in fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain-storms or other exceptional causes affecting visibility whether *by night* or *day* proceed at a moderate speed having careful regard to the existing circumstances and conditions.

A steam vessel hearing, apparently forward of her beam, the fog signal of a vessel the position of which is not ascertained, shall so far as the circumstances of the case admit, stop her engines and then navigate with caution until danger of collision is over.

36. In fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain-storms or other exceptional causes affecting visibility whether *by night* or *day* the sound signals described in this Bye-law shall be used as follows :—

(a) A steam vessel having way upon her shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 1 prolonged blast.

(b) A steam vessel under way but stopped and having no way upon her shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 2 prolonged blasts with an interval of about 1 second between them.

(c) A steam vessel dropping up or down the River with her anchor on the ground shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 2 prolonged blasts with an interval of about 1 second between them.

(d) A vessel when towing shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 3 blasts in succession, viz. 1 prolonged blast followed by 2 short blasts.

A vessel towed may give this signal and she shall not give any other.

(e) A steam vessel under way (which includes a tug with a tow) about to turn round and whilst turning shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 4 short blasts in rapid succession followed, if turning with her head to starboard by 1 short blast and if with her head to port, by 2 short blasts.

(f) A steam vessel under way which for any reason is not under command or which is unable to manœuvre as required by these Bye-laws shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 4 short blasts in rapid succession.

(g) A sailing vessel under way shall sound at intervals of not more than 1 minute when on the starboard tack 1 blast; when on the port tack 2 blasts in succession; and when with the wind abaft the beam or becalmed, 3 blasts in succession.

(h) A vessel when at anchor or moored in the fairway shall at intervals of not more than 1 minute ring the bell rapidly for about 5 seconds.

In vessels of more than 350 feet in length the bell shall be sounded in the forepart of the vessel and in addition there shall be sounded in the afterpart of the vessel at intervals of not more than 1 minute a gong

or other instrument the tone of which cannot be confused with the ringing of a bell.

Provided that this sub-clause shall only apply to vessels moored at such tiers as the Harbour-master may direct.

(i) A dredger when at anchor or moored in the fairway shall at intervals of not more than 1 minute sound a triangle.

(j) A vessel of 100 feet or upwards in length aground in or near the fairway whether *by night* or *by day* shall at intervals of not more than 1 minute ring the bell rapidly for about 5 seconds and shall in addition give 3 separate and distinct strokes of the bell immediately before and after each such signal.

Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to :—

(a) Vessels above London Bridge, or

(b) Vessels berthed, or

(c) Lighters.

Sailing vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage and Lighters shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned sound signals but if they do not they shall make some other efficient sound signals at intervals of not more than 1 minute.

This Bye-law shall not apply to Floating Structures and Boats.

V.—Steering and Sailing Rules.

37. When two sailing vessels are approaching one another so as to involve risk of collision one of them shall keep out of the way of the other, viz. :—

(a) A vessel which is running free shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled.

(b) A vessel which is close-hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.

(c) When both are running free with the wind on different sides the vessel which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.

(d) When both are running free with the wind on the same side the vessel which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is to leeward.

(e) A vessel which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other vessel.

38. Every steam vessel proceeding up or down the River shall, when it is safe and practicable keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such vessel.

When two steam vessels proceeding in opposite directions the one up and the other down the River are approaching each other so as to involve risk of collision they shall pass port side to port side unless the special circumstances of the case make departure from this Bye-law necessary.

39. Every steam vessel crossing from one side of the River to the other side shall do so at a proper time having regard to vessels navigating up and down the River, and shall be navigated so as not to cause obstruction injury or damage to any other vessel.

40. A vessel shall not come into the main channel of the River from any of the tributaries or creeks at such a time and in such a manner as to hamper traffic passing up and down such main channel.

41. Steam vessels plying as ferries when crossing directly from one side of the River towards the other side shall keep out of the way of vessels navigating up and down the River.

42.—(a) Every steam vessel navigating against the tidal stream shall if necessary in order to avoid risk of collision ease her speed or stop on approaching or when rounding a point or sharp bend so as to allow any vessel navigating with the tidal stream to pass clear of her.

(b) Every steam vessel navigating against the tidal stream shall if necessary on approaching a bridge ease her speed or stop in order to avoid risk of collision with another vessel or another vessel and her tow navigating with the tidal stream approaching or passing under the same bridge.

43. When a steam vessel and a sailing vessel are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision the steam vessel shall keep out of the way of the sailing vessel.

44. Where by any of these Bye-laws one of two vessels is to keep out of the way the other shall when it is safe and practicable keep her course.

45. Every vessel which is directed by these Bye-laws to keep out of the way of another vessel shall if the circumstances of the case admit avoid crossing ahead of the other.

46. Every steam vessel which is directed by these Bye-laws to keep out of the way of another vessel shall on approaching her if necessary slacken her speed or stop or reverse.

47. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Bye-laws every vessel overtaking any other vessel shall keep out of the way of the overtaken vessel.

Every vessel coming up with another vessel from any direction more than 2 points abaft her beam, i.e., in such a position with reference to the vessel which she is overtaking that *at night* she would be unable to see either of that vessel's side lights, shall be deemed to be an overtaking vessel, and no subsequent alteration of the bearing between the two vessels shall relieve the overtaking vessel of the duty of keeping clear of the overtaken vessel until she is finally past and clear.

As *by day* the overtaking vessel cannot always know with certainty whether she is forward or abaft this direction she should if in doubt assume she is an overtaking vessel and keep out of the way.

48. The master of every vessel in obeying these Bye-laws shall have due regard to all dangers of navigation and collision and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from them necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

49. The master of every vessel shall comply with the requirements of these Bye-laws as to Lights and Visual and Sound Signals and shall keep or cause to be kept a proper lookout and shall observe any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen or by the special circumstances of the case.

VI.—General Duties of Masters of Vessels.

50. The master of every vessel shall obey and conform to the directions of the Harbour-master and shall not obstruct the Harbour-master or any other officer of the Port Authority in the execution of his duty.

51. The master of every steam vessel navigating the River shall be on the bridge or on one of the paddle-boxes of such steam vessel when under way and shall remove or cause to be removed any person other than the members of the crew and the pilots who shall be on the bridge or paddle-boxes of such steam vessel.

52.—(a) The master of every vessel which through accident or other cause has sunk in the River shall forthwith give to the Harbour-master notice thereof and of the position of such vessel and such particulars as may be required for the safety of navigation.

(b) The master of every steam vessel, when towing another vessel or when attached to another vessel for the purpose of towing or manœuvring the same shall forthwith give a similar notice in the event of the sinking through accident or other cause of any vessel so being towed or attached for the purpose of towing or manœuvring.

53. No master of any vessel shall load or discharge any cargo, ballast, fuel, refuse, or rubbish, any part of which is liable in the course of such loading or discharging to fall into the River, without taking such precautions by affixing canvas or tarpaulins or other suitable material or thing as shall effectually prevent any such cargo, ballast, fuel, refuse, or rubbish from falling into the River.

54. No house-boat or steam launch shall lie or loiter in any part of the River from time to time marked off by the Port Authority or defined by notice given by the Port Authority or by notice boards set up by them as being a part of the River in which no house-boat or steam launch shall lie or loiter.

Provided always that nothing in this Bye-law shall prevent any house-boat or steam launch from remaining during any regatta, boat race, procession, or other special occasion at such place and for such length of time as may be sanctioned by the Port Authority or the Harbour-master.

55. A vessel being on the River on the occasion of any boat race, regatta, public procession, or launch of a vessel or on any other occasion when large crowds assemble thereon, shall not pass thereon so as to obstruct, impede or interfere with the boat race, regatta, procession, or launch, or endanger the safety of persons assembling on the River or prevent the maintenance of order thereon and the master of every such vessel shall observe the directions of the officer of the Port Authority engaged in superintending the execution of this Bye-law.

56. No master of a vessel propelled by means of an internal combustion engine shall navigate or operate such vessel on the River except where the machinery furnishing the motive power thereof shall be provided with a means which shall be at all times employed of effectively silencing the noise of exhaust.

VII.—Anchorages—Mooring Grounds—Berthing.

57.—(a) All vessels navigating Gravesend Reach shall be kept to the northward of the anchorage grounds hereinafter defined but this Bye-law shall not prohibit vessels from being navigated within the said anchorage ground for any special purpose therein.

(b) The Anchorage Ground is that portion of the said Reach which lies within the boundary lines hereinafter described:—

(i) The Eastern Boundary Line is an imaginary line drawn true North for a distance of 1,170 feet from the Explosives Notice Board at Denton.

(ii) The Western Boundary Line is an imaginary line drawn true North for a distance of 370 feet from the northern extremity of Town Pier, Gravesend.

(iii) The Southern Boundary Line is that part of the south shore which lies between the Western and Eastern Boundary Lines.

(iv) The Northern Boundary Line is an imaginary line joining the northern extremities of the Western and Eastern Boundary Lines and bearing 272° from the northern extremity of the Eastern Boundary Line.

58. No person without the written permission of the Admiralty or of the War Department respectively shall lay any moorings within 400 feet of the wharves of His Majesty's Victualling Yard at Deptford or of His Majesty's Supply Reserve Depot at Deptford and except at such moorings no vessel shall lie, be anchored or moored within the area prescribed above other than craft attendant on a vessel lying at the moorings without permission from the Superintendent of His Majesty's Victualling Yard at Deptford or from the Officer Commanding Supply Reserve Depot, Deptford, respectively.

59. No vessel without the consent of the Port Authority shall be placed or be permitted to remain in such a position as to obstruct or interfere with the access to any Dock entrance.

60. No vessel shall be berthed or remain at any pier or premises belonging to the Port Authority without the permission of the officer in charge of such pier or premises being first obtained, and every vessel so berthed or remaining by permission shall move away when ordered by such officer so to do.

61. No steam vessel attached to any moorings, mooring buoy, mooring post, dolphin, jetty, or landing place shall work her engines so that injury or damage may be caused to such moorings, mooring buoy, mooring post, dolphin, jetty, or landing place or any vessel or thing whatsoever.

62. No vessel shall be berthed or placed in front of the towing path so as to cause an obstruction to or interference with either the navigation of the River or the use of the towing path.

63. When any vessel shall be berthed in the River she shall be securely made fast and be laid along the side of or in front of such wharf, pier, jetty, stage, dolphin, or river wall, or bank, and as close thereto as may be safe and practicable.

VIII.—*Anchors.*

64. Every vessel when navigating or lying in the River shall carry her anchor in such a position as not to cause injury or damage to any other vessel.

65. No anchor of a vessel at the tiers shall be allowed to lie or remain in the River outside of the line of the tiers.

66. The master of every vessel which has slipped, parted from or lost any anchor or

cable in any part of the River shall forthwith give notice thereof and of the position of such anchor or cable to the Harbour-master.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to any vessel belonging to the Port Authority or to any wreck in charge of the Port Authority.

IX.—*Towing.*

67.—(a) All vessels under way in the River shall be navigated singly and separately except vessels towed by steam vessels and boats made fast together or towed alongside or astern of other vessels.

(b) A steam vessel may tow another vessel secured alongside of her but shall not at any one time tow more than one vessel in such a manner.

68. Vessels towed by steam vessels navigating the River below Chelsea Bridge shall, if more than 2 in number be placed 2 abreast (except vessels not exceeding 14 feet 9 inches in width which may be placed 3 abreast) and not more than 6 of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time and no tow of vessels shall exceed in length the following limits:—

to be calculated from the stern of the vessel towing to the stern of the aftermost vessel towed.

The provisions of Bye-laws 67 and 68 as to the number and disposition of the vessels shall not apply when such vessels are being moved at the entrance of a dock within the radius of such dock or are being moved between adjoining tiers or barge roads on the same side of the River or between a derrick and barge roads where the distance between such derrick and barge roads does not exceed 100 yards.

69. Vessels towed by steam vessels navigating the River above Chelsea Bridge may be placed in a single line but shall not be placed more than 2 abreast (except vessels not exceeding 14 feet 9 inches in width, which may be placed 3 abreast) and not more than 6 of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time and the distance between any 2 vessels so towed shall not exceed 50 feet.

70. No vessel shall be towed upon the River from the bank otherwise than from a mast of sufficient height to protect the banks gates and works from injury by the tow rope except in places where the strength of the stream renders it necessary that the tow rope should be brought down and secured to the vessel.

71. No float or floats or raft or rafts of timber either singly or together, exceeding 60 feet in length (excepting timber in one length) and 20 feet in width shall save when in the act of entering or leaving any dock or canal be under way or navigated in the River unless such float or floats or raft or rafts be towed by a steam vessel efficient for the purpose in which case the same shall not exceed 150 feet in length (excepting timber in one length) and 30 feet in width, nor in any case shall any following float or raft of timber go within a distance of 300 yards of any other such float or raft.

X.—*Payment of Tonnage Dues and Tolls.*

72. The master or owner of any vessel entering or leaving the Thames, subject to the payment of duties of tonnage, and which has not been entered at the office of His Majesty's Customs and on which the duties of tonnage have not been paid to the receiver there:—

(a) shall forthwith furnish the Port Authority, for the purpose of registration, with full particulars in writing of the name, tonnage and owner of such vessel and the port to which she belongs, and shall send a return once in every month of the arrival in and departure from the River of such vessel during the preceding month to the office of the Port Authority and shall pay to the Port Authority the duties of tonnage which are then payable for each time of such arrival and departure pursuant to the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920.

(b) shall within 14 days of the service on him of notice by the Port Authority requiring him so to do, send to the Port Authority at their office a return of the arrival in and departure from the River of such vessel during the period specified in such notice.

73. The master of every steam vessel which is being used as a tug shall when approaching the Toll Collecting Station at Kew so navigate his vessel as to avoid overcrowding at the said Station, and shall if necessary ease the speed of his vessel at a sufficient distance from the said Station to allow for the collection of tolls from any other vessel, and shall if necessary stop and await his turn for payment of tolls, such turn to be determined according to the order of arrival of vessels.

XI.—*Lighters and Sailing Barges.*

74. No lighter or sailing barge shall lie in or be navigated on the River below Battersea Bridge without having a freeboard of at least 15 inches, such freeboard to be measured amidships, and coamings (if any) may be included in such measurement, but in no case must the top of the gunwale be less than 3 inches above the water's edge when such craft is decked and hatched, or less than 6 inches above the water's edge when such craft is open.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to a lighter or sailing barge when being loaded or discharged.

75. A lighter when under way on the River shall have at least 1 competent man constantly on board for the navigation and management thereof and a lighter exceeding 50 tons but of not more than 150 tons burden shall when under way have 1 competent man in addition constantly on board and a lighter exceeding 150 tons burden shall when under way have 2 competent men in addition constantly on board to assist in the navigation and management of the same.

Provided that where a lighter is in tow of a steam vessel or is being moved between any vessels or places a distance not exceeding 200 yards 1 competent man on such lighter shall be sufficient.

The word "burden" in this Bye-law shall have the same meaning as the expression "burden tonnage" defined by the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920.

XII.—*Richmond Lock and above—General Procedure.*

76. The navigable part of the channel of the River above Richmond Lock shall at all times be kept clear for the passage of vessels navigated thereon and no vessel shall be stopped in the navigable part of the said channel so as to impede or obstruct the free and clear passage of any other vessel and no ryepeck or punt pole shall be left fixed in any part of the bed of the River.

77. If any vessel or thing shall be stopped or aground or sunk or placed in any part of the River above Richmond Lock so as to impede or obstruct the free and clear navigation thereof, the owner or any person having the care of such vessel or thing shall immediately on the request of any person impeded or obstructed thereby or of any officer of the Port Authority remove such impediment or obstruction so as to clear the channel, and on the refusal or neglect of such owner or other person to remove such obstruction forthwith any officer of the Port Authority may remove or cause the same to be removed and if necessary cause any such vessel to be unloaded and the costs of such removal and unloading shall be paid by the owner of such vessel or thing.

78. No vessel shall enter Richmond Lock unless there be sufficient water to float and carry such vessel through such lock and the channel or cut leading to or from the same, and no vessel shall stop in such lock longer than is necessary for the filling or emptying of the lock and passage through the same.

79. No vessel shall enter Richmond Lock with sail hoisted nor shall during the time she continues to be in the said Lock hoist any sail.

80. When any vessel used for carrying passengers or goods or merchandise or any steam tug or steam launch enters Richmond Lock a rope or chain shall be immediately put out from the bow and stern of such vessel and made fast on shore in order to prevent the vessel from running foul of the gates or works or other vessels in the lock.

81. No person without the previous express consent of the lock keeper shall use interfere or meddle with the gear at Richmond Lock or Weir or with any sluice belonging to the Port Authority.

XIII.—*Miscellaneous.*

82. The owner or occupier of any pier, jetty, or other structure in the River, or on the shore thereof shall light or mark such pier, jetty, or other structure in such manner as the Port Authority may from time to time direct.

83. No advertisement or advertising notice shall be exhibited upon or by means of any vessel or otherwise on or over the River except advertisements or notices by the owner of any vessel on such vessel for the purposes of or in reference to his trade or business as an owner builder or repairer of vessels.

The expression "owner" in this Bye-law shall mean the person whose name appears in the certificate of registration of such vessel.

84. No person on board any vessel shall without actual necessity place or hold a pole or boat hook against any bank or towing path or works on the River so as to injure or damage the same.

85. No person other than the occupier of land adjoining the towing path shall allow any horse or cattle or other animals to pasture on the towing path, and no person shall without the permission of the Port Authority ride or drive any cart, wagon, vehicle, or machine over or upon any part of the towing path, unless there be a public right of way for such cart, wagon, vehicle, or machine.

86. No person shall remove any material whatsoever from the banks, weirs, tumbling bays, towing paths, or lands, or any works of the Port Authority.

87. No person engaged in navigating or employed on or using or being in on or about the River or the banks, or towing paths thereof or any land or premises of the Port Authority, shall be intoxicated or make use of obscene, scandalous, abusive, indecent or improper language.

88. No person shall, while using or while in, upon or about the River or the banks or towing paths thereof or any land of the Port Authority, do or cause or incite any other person to do any of the acts hereunder specified, that is to say:—

(1) Commit any offence against decency or be otherwise disorderly.

(2) Bathe without proper bathing or rowing dress.

(3) Bathe or prepare to bathe at any place where or between any hours when bathing is for the time being prohibited by the Port Authority.

(4) Do any act which may cause danger to any person or property or occasion a nuisance, obstruction or annoyance to the public or to any person.

(5) Cast or throw into or upon or place or cause or suffer to fall or flow into or upon any of the places specified in this Bye-law, any sewage, rubbish, or other offensive or injurious matter or thing.

(6) Light, maintain, throw down, place or leave any fire, or any flaming, smouldering or burning substance or any matter or thing in any place where the same may cause danger or damage to property of any kind or annoyance to any person.

(7) Move, injure, or deface any notice, notice-board, work or thing whatsoever the property of or in charge of the Port Authority or set up by them or with their consent.

(8) Kill, injure, take, catch or trap or attempt to kill, injure, take, catch or trap any animal or bird or the young of any animal or bird. Provided always that this sub-clause shall not extend to prevent any person employed by the Port Authority or acting with their consent from killing vermin or affect any right of fowling, shooting, hunting, or sporting existing on the 14th day of August, 1885.

(9) Do any act injuriously affecting the safety or amenity of the River.

89. Any person acting in contravention of any of these Bye-laws shall for every such act be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount, which said penalties shall be recoverable, enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-laws may do so in writing or otherwise on or before the 14th day of December, 1936, to the undersigned.
