"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Patricroft, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Christ Church, Patricroft, is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Patricroft, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Patricroft, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries

thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Michael and All Angels, Peel Green'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Michael and All Angels, Peel Green, being:-

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Patricroft, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Winton, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Worsley, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Irlam, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Catherine, Barton upon Irwell, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Barton upon Irwell, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Patricroft, at the junction of Barton Road with Liverpool Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Liverpool Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Bridgewater Canal and extending thence first north-westward, then northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the Bridgewater Canal for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Liverpool and Manchester Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway across such canal upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Patricroft, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Winton."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

Commissioners of the fourth part

the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Hugh, Old Brumby.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of Patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors for ever.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Pimlico, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Pimlico, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Pimlico, which is bounded upon the south by the River Thames, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Pimlico, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Philip, Buckingham Palace Road, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Buckingham Palace Road, from the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Pimlico, at a point in the middle of Ebury Bridge opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence which forms the western boundary of the premises belonging to the Southern Railway Company, and extending thence first southward to and then first southward then eastward and then again southward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the wall on the western side of Victoria Bridge which carries the Southern Railway across Chelsea Embankment and the River Thames and extending thence southward along the wall on the western side of the said bridge for a distance of 6% chains or thereabouts to the middle of the River Thames.

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Pimlico, which is bounded upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Michael, Chester Square, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Graham Street, Pimlico, upon the west by the Parish of the Holy Trinity with Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of the Holy Trinity with Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Pimlico, at the junction of Holbein Place with Pimlico Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Pimlico Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ebury Street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Ebury Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westbourne Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Westbourne Street for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of the Holy Cross, Newcastle upon Tyne, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Margaret, Scotswood, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Scotswood, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of

Saint James and Saint Basil, Fenham, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as afore-said upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributor of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Portsmouth as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank, now Bishop of Portsmouth (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Wymering and of the said Parish of Widley which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the

publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Philip, Cosham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Philip, Cosham, comprising:-

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Portsmouth.
