

(which Deed is intended to be registered in the books of the Charity Commissioners), the said Cyprian Thomas Rust did, with the consents of the said George William Phipps Winn and Granville Robert Croft and of the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the following sums of £3 per centum Funding Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for the said Vicarage of Frodingham, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and his successors, namely, one sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per centum Funding Stock as from the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and a further sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per centum Funding Stock as from the date of the avoidance of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Frodingham by the said Cyprian Thomas Rust or in the event of any pension being awarded to the said Cyprian Thomas Rust out of the revenues of the said Vicarage of Frodingham, then as from the date of the cessation of such pension:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid and to his successors such grant to cease upon the date on which the assignment of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per centum Funding Stock takes effect:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said two sums of £6,666 13s. 4d. £3 per centum Funding Stock have been so assigned as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the right of Patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Cyprian Thomas Rust has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Lincoln as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Frodingham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with

the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Hugh, Old Brumby.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of Patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Hugh, Old Brumby, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Frodingham, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Gunhouse with Burringham, upon the south by the Parish of Ashby, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ashby from the said Parish of Frodingham crosses the middle of Brigg Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Brigg Road for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with East Common Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of East Common Lane for a distance of 76 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Doncaster Grimsby Trunk Road, and extending thence first north-westward, then westward and then again north-westward along the middle of the Doncaster Grimsby Trunk Road for a distance of 1 mile and 25 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Barnsley to Barnetby Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 33 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Frodingham from the said New Parish of Gunhouse with Burringham."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Frodingham out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall
