### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY 3 NOVEMBER, 1936.

Whereas it is expedient to amend § 1 of Sectio I of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to provide that the age limit imposed upon holders of Professorships by clause 2 of that sub-section shall not apply to the holder of the Slade Professorship of Fine Art.

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

In the Schedule appended to clause 4 of Statt. Tit. IV. § 1 (Statuta, 1936, p. 48, l. 26), after "George Eastman Visiting Professorship" insert "Slade Professorship of Fine Art".
