### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 65 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that His Majesty, if satisfied that the Government of any country has acceded to the Load Line Convention, may, by Order in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Government of Egypt has acceded to the Load Line Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the Government of Egypt has acceded to the Load Line Convention.

#### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY 3 NOVEMBER, 1936.

Whereas it is expedient to amend § 1 of Sectio I of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to provide that the age limit imposed upon holders of Professorships by clause 2 of that sub-section shall not apply to the holder of the Slade Professorship of Fine Art.
