The KING has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that John Percy Samuel FitzRoy, Anna Ismay Ethel, wife of Frederick Ernest Charles Byron, Victoria Alexandrina Mabel, wife of Richard Sturgis Seymour, Member of the Royal Victorian Order, and Violet Freddie, wife of Nigel Maitland Wilson, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Indian Army, the brother and sisters of Charles Alfred Euston FitzRoy, Duke of Grafton, shall henceforth have hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as would have been due to them if their late father, Charles Edward FitzRoy (commonly called Lord Charles Edward FitzRoy) had survived his great-nephew John Charles William FitzRoy, Duke of Grafton, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Duke of Grafton.

And to command that the said order and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

CORONATION OF HIS MAJESTY.

COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty for the purpose will meet at the Council Office, Downing Street, S.W.1, on Wednesday, the 25th day of Novem-

ber instant, at 11 a.m., to hear and determine Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 28th day of May last), and of fees to be received for the same.

All Petitioners will be notified whether appearance is or is not required at the above meeting.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th November, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th November, 1936, to Saturday, the 5th December, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
