And whereas alterations are likely to occur in the assessment of certain railway companies to local rates:

And whereas proposals have been laid before Parliament for the amendment in certain respects of the said Eleventh Schedule and for making provision for meeting certain liabilities of the Railway Freight Rebates Fund in respect of the period beginning with the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six:

And whereas it appears to the Minister of Transport that the circumstances above recited constitute an exceptional occurrence necessitating the issue of a certificate under the said paragraph eleven:

Now therefore, the Minister of Transport in pursuance of paragraph eleven of Part I of the said Schedule hereby certifies that in his opinion the rates of the rebates to be allowed in respect of all the groups of selected traffics specified in Parts II, III, and IV of the said Schedule ought to be reviewed.

THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF SEVENOAKS.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1932.

THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF SEVENOAKS
TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 2.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) on the 12th day of November, 1936, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Urban District Council of Sevenoaks

dated the 22nd day of September, 1936, deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the Urban District of Sevenoaks forming all that portion of the said Urban District not included in the Preliminary Statement approved by the Ministry of Health on the 9th July, 1928; (2) the Map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Offices, Argyle Road, Sevenoaks, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (other than Saturdays) and the hours of 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays; (3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the said area and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Urban District Council of Sevenoaks to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933, the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Urban District Council of Sevenoaks are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Urban District Council of Sevenoaks intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Council, Council Offices, Argyle Road, Sevenoaks.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

BY-LAWS RELATIVE TO THE USE OF CONSTRUCTIONAL
TIMBER.

LONDON BUILDING ACT (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1935.

THE London County Council gives notice in accordance with section 8 (a) of the above-mentioned Act, that it proposes not less than two months from the date of this notice, to make by-laws under the above-mentioned Act relative to the use of timber in the construction and conversion of buildings.

Any authority body or person desirous of objecting to any proposed by-law may do so within six weeks after the publication of this notice by a letter addressed to the Minister of Health setting out the grounds on which objection is made.
