TEIGNMOUTH GAS.

(Application for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Urban District Council of Teignmouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), whose address is the Council Offices, Bitton House, Teignmouth, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the limits of the Council for the supply of gas so as to include (a) so much of the Urban District of Teignmouth as is not within the Council's existing limits of supply, and (b) the Parish of Bishopsteignton, in the Rural District of Newton Abbot, and to empower the Council within the said areas to exercise the same powers, rights, privileges and authorities in relation to the supply of gas, and to impose upon them the like duties and obligations in respect thereof as they now have and are subject to within their existing limits of supply.

2. To authorise a differential price for gas in the said Parish of Bishopsteignton.

3. General provisions as to the conduct of the gas undertaking of the Council, including the breaking up of streets forming the boundary of the limits of supply; the laying
