TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 18th December, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 21st December, 1936, to Thursday, the 24th December, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less that £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

 Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE LANCASHIRE AND CHESHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 15 of the Lancashire and Cheshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section (1) of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 12th day of December, 1936, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Lancashire and Cheshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. In Clause 49 for sub-clauses (4) and (5) there shall be substituted the following sub-clauses:—

- "(4). If the Board declare any works to be an excluded works of an Owner, or if the Board increase the annual tonnage of coal, which may be supplied in any year by an Owner from his coal mine for consumption in his excluded works, upon any enlargement or re-organisation of those works whereby their capacity for consumption of coal is increased, the Board may adjust the annual supply basic tonnage of his coal mine having regard to all relevant circumstances including:—
 - (i) any alteration in the tonnage of coal produced from that coal mine available for supply to the Board, and
 - (ii) any probable reduction in the demand for coal supplied by the Board by reason of the supply of coal by that Owner for consumption in those works, or by reason of the operations of those works.
- (5) If the Board declare that any works shall cease to be excluded works of an Owner, or if the Board decrease the annual tonnage,

which may be supplied in any year by an Owner from his coal mine for consumption in his excluded works, by reason of any decrease in the capacity of those works for consumption of such coal, the Board may adjust the annual supply basic tonnage of the coal mine of that Owner having regard to all relevant circumstances and to the interests of all the Owners."

- 2. Clause 52 shall have effect as if: -
- (a) in sub-clause (4) for the words "The Board shall not in any event" there were substituted the words "So far as practicable the Board shall not", and at the end there were inserted the words, "Provided that the Board may with the consent of the Owner thereof take a greater tonnage of coal from any coal mine in order to meet a demand which cannot reasonably be satisfied by coal from another coal mine (not being a coal mine from which the Board have taken a tonnage of coal 20 per cent. greater than the trade share thereof)"; and
- (b) in sub-clause (5) for the words from "in accordance with" to the end of the sub-clause there were substituted the words "or to failure to supply coal in accordance with the directions of the Selling Committee or to a request by the Owner that the Selling Committee should not direct supply".
- 3. Clause 55 shall have effect as if in subclause (9) for the words "by agreement with the Owner" there were substituted the words "on the application of the Owner or other-
 - 4. Clause 63 shall have effect as if:-
 - (a) sub-clause (8) were omitted; and,
 - (b) in sub-clause (9) the words from "and" to the end of the sub-clause were omitted.
- 5. After Clause 63 there shall be inserted the following clause:—
 - "63a.—(1) At the Annual General Meeting of the Owners in every year the Board shall lay before the Owners an audited account of the profits or losses on the operation of the Scheme for the period since the preceding account made up to a date not more than three months before the date of the meeting. The Board shall also so lay an audited balance sheet of the assets and liabilities of the Scheme as at the date to which the profit and loss account is made up.
 - (2) The profits or losses shown on each profit and loss account shall be divided proportionately to the respective sums of the monthly supply basic tonnages of coal of the coal mines for the period to which the account relates, and the amount thus calculated for each coal mine shall be the share of the Owner thereof in such profits or losses
 - (3) The Board may from time to time determine the shares of the Owners in any part of the interim profits on the operation of the Scheme. Such shares shall be proportionate to the respective sums of the monthly supply basic tonnages of coal of their coal mines for the period in respect of which those profits are determined."

- 6. Clause 64 shall have effect as if:
- (a) for sub-clauses (1) and (2) there were substituted the following sub-clause:-
 - "(1) The Board shall cause to be kept a Reserve Account for each Owner, to which all monies paid by that Owner by way of levies, and the share of that Owner in any profits or losses on the operation of the Scheme, and any monies paid to that Owner under the following provisions, shall be credited or debited as the case may be:

Provided that the shares of the Owners in any interim profits shall be on account of their respective shares in the profits shown in the next profit and loss account."

- (b) sub-clause (3) were re-numbered (2), and for the words from the beginning of the sub-clause to "Owners" where that word first occurs there were substituted the words "The Board may at any time distribute to the Owners such part of the total sum standing at the credit of their Reserve Accounts as appears to the Board to be justified by their operations under the Scheme".
- (c) sub-clause (4) were re-numbered (3), and at the end thereof there were added the words "but shall be liable to pay or entitled to receive forthwith any amount subsequently debited or credited to that account ".
