DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1935.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Order No. 5458.

(Dated 8th December, 1936.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1936 (No. 37).

SUBJECT.

(i) Contracts the Flintshire and Cheshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area as from the 12th December, 1936, to the Area as described in the First Schedule and revokes as from the same date the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) (Temporary Modification of Restrictions) Order of 1936 (No. 2) dated 4th December, 1936.

(ii) Releases the Flintshire and Cheshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area from restrictions and revokes Orders Nos. 5446 and 5449, as from the 19th December, 1936.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Chester.

So much of the city and county borough of Chester, and the petty sessional division of Chester Castle including its detached part as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point on the Cheshire County Boundary on the northern edge of Bretton Wood, thence in a south-easterly direction along the northern edge of Bretton Wood to the road at Balderton Dairy; thence in a generally easterly direction along the Gorstella-Eccleston road, via Balderton, Roughill to Twomile House; thence in a southerly direction along the Chester-Wrexham main road via Belgrave Bridge to Rake Lane and thence along Rake Lane passing Eccleston Post Office

and Deeside Cottage to the River Dee; thence following the River Dee in a northerly and westerly direction to Dee Lane; thence along Dee Lane to The Bars; thence in an easterly direction along Boughton to the road leading to Station View; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Station View, Crawford's Walk, Hamilton Street and Newton Lane to the point where the latter road crosses the Cheshire Lines railway; thence following the Cheshire line to East Junction and thence along the London and North Eastern Railway Line to the point where it crosses Parkgate Road near Meadow Bank; thence in a north-westerly direction along the road via Mollington Causeway; and Little Mollington Hall to the road leading to Mollington Brewery; thence along that road in a north-westerly direction via Mollington Brewery to Astbury House; thence in a westerly direction along the road leading to Hey House and the cross roads at Saughall Green; thence along the road in a south-westerly direction via All Saints Church, Great Saughall and Seahill Bridge to the county boundary near Saughall Station.

In the county of Flint.

So much of the parishes of Sealand, East Saltney and Hawarden as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the Cheshire-Flintshire county boundary crosses the road leading from Great Saughall to Sealand; thence along the road in a southerly direction via Saughall Station to Sealand; thence in a south-easterly direction along the road leading to Chester as far as Yew Tree Farm; thence in a generally westerly direction along Sandycroft Sluice to the point where it meets the River Dee; thence crossing the River Dee and proceeding in a south-easterly direction to the West Saltney-East Saltney parish boundary; thence following the parish boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point where it crosses the road leading to Queensferry; thence following the latter road in a south-easterly direction to its junction with the road leading from The Beeches to Manor Hall Farm; thence in a south-westerly direction along the latter road, via Manor Hall Farm to its junction with the Hawarden road; thence in a south-easterly direction along the Hawarden road via St. Mary's Church to the Lodge at the North-western end of Bretton Wood; thence first in a northerly and then in an easterly direction along the western and northern edge of Bretton Wood to the point where it meets the Cheshire county boundary.
