Whitehall, December 12, 1936.

This day the Lords of the Privy Council assembled at St. James's Palace and gave orders for proclaiming His Majesty who made a most Gracious Declaration to them.

WHEREAS by an Instrument of Abdication dated the Tenth day of December instant His former Majesty King Edward the Eighth did declare His irrevocable Determination to renounce the Throne for Himself and His Descendants, and the said Instrument of Abdication has now taken effect, whereby the Imperial Crown of Great Britain, Ireland Majesty's His former all other and dominions is now solely and rightfully the High and Mighty Prince Albert Frederick George: Arthur therefore, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm, being here assisted with these of His former Majesty's Privy Council, with Numbers of other Principal Gentlemen of Quality, with the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of London, do now hereby with one Voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart, publish and proclaim, That the High and Mighty Prince Albert Frederick Arthur George is now become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord George the Sixth by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To whom we do acknowledge all Faith and constant Obedience, with all hearty and humble Affection: beseeching God, by whom Kings and Queens do reign, to bless the Royal Prince

George the Sixth with long and happy Years to reign over us.

Given at St. James's Palace, this Twelfth day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

Now that the duties of Sovereignty have fallen to Me I declare to you My adherence to the strict principles of constitutional government and My resolve to work before all else for the welfare of the British Commonwealth of Nations.

With My Wife as helpmeet by My side, I take up the heavy task which lies before Me. In it I look for the support of all My Peoples.

Furthermore, My first act on succeeding My Brother will be to confer on Him a Dukedom and He will henceforth be known as His Royal Highness The Duke of Windsor.

Whereupon the Lords of the Council made it their humble request to His Majesty that His

Majesty's Most Gracious Declaration to Their Lordships might be made public, which His Majesty was pleased to order accordingly.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 5th November, 1936.)

No. 15/1936.

Whereas under Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar-General, with the approval of the Minister of Health, may divide any superintendent registrar's district into two or more superintendent registrars' districts;

And whereas it is expedient that the Burton upon Trent superintendent registrar's district should be divided into two superintendent

registrars' districts;

And whereas it is necessary to transfer the functions under the Registration Acts in relation to one of the superintendent registrars'

districts so formed;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders follows:

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Burton upon Trent Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1936, and shall come into operation

on the 1st day of January, 1937.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a superintendent registrar's district, and the term "existing district" means a district which existed immediately before the 1st day of January, 1937.

2.—(1) The existing Burton upon Trent district shall be divided into two districts called respectively the Repton and the Burton upon

Trent districts.
