At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 18th day of *December*, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of November, 1936, (P.M. 2020/36), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service men re-entered in Your Majesty's Naval Force after invaliding therefrom are allowed, provided they present themselves for re-entry within twelve months from the date of the medical survey at which they were invalided, to resume their former Continuous Service engagements:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 19th April, 1933, provision is made, *inter alia*, that men resuming their former engagements on re-entry after invaliding shall, notwithstanding that such re-entry shall have been subsequent to the 31st day of March, 1930,

count their time for long service pension and for service and rank elements of disability pension at the rates, and under the conditions, laid down in Orders in Council bearing dates the 7th February, 1921, and 6th February, 1922, provided that they be otherwise eligible therefor:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the rule governing eligibility to resume a former Continuous Service engagement on re-entry into Your Majesty's Naval Force after invaliding and to retain any consequential pension privileges, should be modified:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise us, at our discretion, to allow Petty Officers, men and boys, re-entered in Your Majesty's Naval Force after invaliding therefrom, to resume their former Continuous Service engagements, and to retain any pension privileges which may accompany such engagements when the period between the date of medical survey for invaliding and the date of application to re-enter does not exceed twelve months.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it is further enacted in the Act aforesaid that "the powers of the Commissioners shall continue in force until the end of the year nineteen hundred and thirty-six and no longer: Provided that His Majesty in Council may, on the application of the Commissioners, continue their powers for such period as His Majesty may think fit, but not beyond the end of the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven":

And whereas The University of Durham Commissioners have made application to His Majesty in Council for the continuation of their powers under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the powers of The University of Durham Commissioners shall continue until the end of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, as extended by section nine of the Finance Act, 1931, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to income tax payable under the law in force in any foreign state; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign state with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax payable in the foreign state;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas the arrangements contained in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with the Netherlands Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of air transport which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to the income tax payable under the law in force in the Netherlands; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Schedule have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of air transport are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax payable in the Netherlands.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Air Transport Profits (Netherlands) Declaration, 1936".

SCHEDULE.

(1) His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom undertake that any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport carried on by a person resident in the Netherlands and not resident in the United Kingdom shall, so long as the exemptions specified in sub-paragraph (2) hereof remain effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Sur-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, 1935, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and that they will take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament known as the Finance Act, 1923, as extended by Section 9 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1931, to profits or gains arising from the business of air transport, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemptions aforesaid.

(2) The Netherlands Government declare that, under the laws of the Netherlands relating to Income Tax and Municipal Fund Tax (*Inkomstenbelasting en Gemeentefondsbelasting*), tax is not chargeable on any profits or gains arising from the business of air transport carried on by a person resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in the Netherlands, and that under the laws of the Netherlands relating to Dividend and Tantième Tax (*Dividend- en Tantiëmbelasting*) tax is not chargeable on dividends or other sums on account of profits distributed by

a body corporate carrying on the business of air transport and resident in the United Kingdom, and undertake that, so long as the exemptions specified in sub-paragraph (1) hereof remain effective, such profits or gains and dividends and other sums as aforesaid shall continue to be so exempt.

The Netherlands Government further undertake that, as from the sixth day of April, 1935, and thereafter, so long as the exemptions specified in sub-paragraph (1) hereof remain effective, any property which is owned or possessed and employed in the Netherlands by a person resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in the Netherlands for the purpose of making profits or gains arising from the business of air transport shall, in so far as it is employed for that purpose, be exempted from Property Tax and Defence Tax 1 (Vermogensbelasting en Verdedigingsbelasting 1) and that they will take the necessary action under the law of the 14th June, 1930 (Collection of Acts No. 244, 1930), with a view to giving the force of law to the exemptions aforesaid.

(3) The exemptions granted under the foregoing sub-paragraphs shall not extend to Income Tax chargeable in the United Kingdom under Schedule A or to Property Tax or Defence Tax 1 (Vermogensbelasting or Verdedigingsbelasting 1) chargeable in the Netherlands in respect of immovable property in the Netherlands.

(4) The expression "business of air transport" means the business carried on by an owner of aircraft, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

For the purposes of this agreement the word "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate, and a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom and shall be regarded as resident in the Netherlands if its business is managed and controlled in the Netherlands.

(5) The present agreement may be terminated by either Contracting Government at any time by a notice in writing given through the diplomatic channel, and shall cease to operate six months after the date on which the notice of denunciation is received.

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be confirmed and approved.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

And whereas in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies are desirous of denouncing the said Convention:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be denounced accordingly and that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

7. Candidates must take up subject 67 French Language, and reach a high standard in it. They must also take either subject 26 General Economics, or subject 3 Elementary Economics, but they may not take both.

8. In Section B a candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 750 marks (or 800 marks if Russian Language be selected) must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 750 (or 800). This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can make the reduction by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

9. The following restrictions apply to particular subjects in Section B.

International Relations (25), may not be taken by a candidate who offers European History, Period 3 (8), or Constitutional Law (12).

Greek Literature (60), may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), and Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61).

In subjects 68 to 84 the history or literature paper associated with a language may be taken only by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.

A candidate who offers one or more of the subjects French History (68), German History (71), Spanish or Italian History (74), Russian History (77), may not offer either subject 7 (European History, Period 1 or Period 2), or subject 8 (European History, Period 3).

10. A candidate desiring to offer Experimental Psychology (22), or any of the subjects 37 to 48, must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (36), Engineering (49), Geography (50), and the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (52), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

11. From the marks assigned to candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

12. Moreover, candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a further deduction of marks on that account.

13. Application for permission to attend one of these examinations must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

14. A fee of £2 will be required from every applicant for permission to attend an examination; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £6, being the balance of the prescribed fee of £8, will be required from every candidate attending such examination.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF
THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION
OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department, by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise, to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission, the Department and a nominee of the Surveyors' Institution.

Other things being equal, preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 and ordinarily should not have attained the age of 35 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take

part. Candidates above that age will not be excluded from consideration but preference will be given to those within the stated upper age limit.

5. Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Chartered Surveyors' Institution, or the corresponding examination of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society or of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland, or hold a University Degree (e.g., B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge, or B.Sc. (Estate Management) London) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. They must have had at least four years' professional experience which may have been obtained in:—

(a) The Office of a F.S.I., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or member of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland in professional practice, or in Government or Municipal service; or

(b) The Office of any other Surveyor, Estate Agent or Land Agent which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

Time which has been spent in study of Agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College if followed by the obtaining of a Degree or Diploma will be allowed to count up to two years out of the four years.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

6. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department. Appointment will be subject to the condition that the person appointed may be required to serve in any town in Great Britain. Inland Revenue Valuers are not allowed to engage for profit in commercial dealings in land or houses whether directly or through an agent, or to participate in the control of any business dealing with real and leasehold property, or to accept any fee or reward whatsoever for professional or official services.

8. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces when called upon to do so the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate Education Authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

10. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £5.
