The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come:

Greeting!

Whereas his late Majesty King Edward the Seventh did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, institute and create a new medal to be styled the King's Police Medal:

And whereas the said Royal Warrant was amended by Warrants under the Sign Manual of His late Majesty King George the Fifth bearing date respectively the third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty and the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three; and by Warrant under the Sign Manual of Our Royal Predecessor His Majesty King Edward the Eighth bearing date the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six:

And whereas We are desirous of further amending the second and third clauses of the Royal Warrant of the seventh day of July, one

thousand nine hundred and nine, as altered by the Royal Warrants of the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six respectively:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors abrogate the second clause of the said Royal Warrant of the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and the said Royal Warrant of the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and in lieu thereof substitute the following clauses:—

Secondly—It is ordained that the King's Police Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with the effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and shall bear on the reverse a design emblematic of Protection from danger and the words "For Gallantry" or "For Distinguished Service" as the case may be and on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal has been awarded.

Thirdly—It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our Faithful Subjects and Others who have either performed acts of exceptional courage and skill or exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty as members of a recognised Police Force or of a properly organised Fire Brigade within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland Our Indian Empire or any of Our Colonies or any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction not being administered by Us in Our Government in any other part of Our Dominions; or within any other

part of Our Dominions Our Government whereof has signified its desire that the Medal should be awarded under the provisions of this Our Warrant to members of any such Force or Brigade within such part, or within any territory under Our Protection or jurisdiction being administered by Us in such Government; and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's* the *fifteenth* day of *December*, 1936; in the *First* Year of Our Reign.

NOTE.—Those Peers and Peeresses who have already notified the Earl Marshal of their desire to receive summons to be present on the 12th day of May next need make no further application.

Peers and Peeresses who have not so notified the Earl Marshal are requested to do so before the 1st day of February next.

It is to be understood that the above Orders refer to all English, Scottish and Irish Peers (except Peers who are minors, and Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons), Peeresses in their own right, the widows of Peers, and the wives of living Peers, including the wives of Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons, and Peeresses who have seats in the House of Commons.

Widows of Peers who have remarried under the rank of the Peerage are not entitled to such summons.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure, and powdered with bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz:—

Barons, two rows.

Viscounts, two rows and a half.

Earls, three rows.

Marquesses, three rows and a half.

Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stone are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have, on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquess to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, &c., which are to be worn by the Peeresses at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth.

These are to give notice to all Peeresses who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties that the robes or mantles appertaining to their respective ranks are to be worn over the usual full Court dress.

That the robe or mantle of a Baroness be of crimson velvet, the cape thereof to be furred with miniver pure, and powdered with two bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur); the said mantle to be edged round with miniver pure, two inches in breadth, and

the train to be three feet on the ground; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz., a circle or rim with six silver balls upon the same.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, the cape to be powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz., a circle with sixteen silver balls thereon.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as above, the cape to be powdered with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz., a circle with eight silver balls raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as above, the cape to be powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three-quarters; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz., a circle with four strawberry leaves and four silver balls raised upon points of the same height as the leaves alternately.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as above, the cape to be powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches in breadth, the train two yards; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz., a circle with eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height.

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top.

NOTE—The wives or widows of Peers, and Peeresses in their own right, whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland, will wear robes of such dignity.

The precedence of the widow of a Peer who has married more than once in the Peerage is that of her last husband.

THE Earl Marshal's Orders concerning the Dress to be worn by Peeresses with their Robes of Rank at Their Majesties' Coronation.

The Dress worn by a Peeress consists of a Kirtle of crimson velvet, bordered all round with a narrow edging of miniver pure, scalloped in front, plain otherwise. The Kirtle, which may be fastened down the back or in front, opens from the waist widening gradually down to the ground. It may be gathered back in three festoons, each tied with a bow of gold tinsel. The sleeves should be about nine inches long, and have two narrow rows of miniver, below which are five lappets varying in length, the outer one three inches, the inner one one inch, each edged in a similar manner with miniver. White lace sleeves may be worn below these lappets.

The Kirtle is worn over the usual full court dress, without train: the petticoat (or skirt) should be white or slightly cream coloured,

with lace, embroidery, or brocade, in accordance with the taste of the Peeress. The brocade must be of gold or silver, as it would not be correct to introduce any colour. Feathers and veils will not be worn, but a tiara must be worn.

Jewels may be worn round the neck, on the bodice and on the petticoat.

Robes and Kirtles worn at previous Coronations may be worn at the forthcoming Coronation.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF (1) CLERICAL ASSISTANT, GRADE I (FEMALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE GENERALLY; (2) CLERICAL ASSISTANT (FEMALE) IN OFFICES OF INSPECTORS OF TAXES UNDER THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year, the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year, the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted. Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father

nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates must be unmarried and will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. The subjects of examination are as follows, viz. :—

1. English.
2. Handwriting.
3. Spelling.
4. Arithmetic.
5. Geography.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of the candidates will, where possible, be respected. Candidates will be assigned, save in exceptional circumstances, only to offices within daily travelling distance of their places of residence.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of twelve shillings and sixpence will be required from every candidate applying for admission to attend an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations on the 1st April, 1937.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE EXECUTIVE GROUP OF SITUATIONS, THAT IS TO SAY, FOR THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE, FOR EXECUTIVE BRANCHES OF THE DEFENCE DEPARTMENTS, AND FOR THE SITUATIONS OF ASSISTANT AUDITOR IN THE EXCHEQUER AND AUDIT DEPARTMENT, ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE ESTATE DUTY OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, ACTUARIAL ASSISTANT IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT ACTUARY, AUDIT ASSISTANT IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH, AND ASSISTANT INSPECTOR ON THE OUTDOOR STAFF OF THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH, THE WELSH BOARD OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR SCOTLAND.

With the exception of posts in executive branches in the Defence Departments, for which men only are eligible, competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.

3. No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.
