Whereas by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, intituled "An Act to reorganise the Administration of the Patriotic Fund," the Patriotic Fund Commission constituted by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, was dissolved, and the property, rights, duties and liabilities thereof, and all property held in trust therefor, were transferred to and vested in the Royal Patriotic

Fund Corporation established in pursuance of

the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas pursuant to the provisions of the said recited Act and of Section 7 of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1918, eight of the members of the said Corporation are appointed by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual and hold office for a term of three years, being eligible for re-appointment:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the said Acts His late Majesty King George the Fifth did, by Warrants under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and the fourteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, appoint you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with the persons therein named to be members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation until the thirty-first day December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents under Our Royal Sign Manual ordain and declare that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with you the said Sir Frederick Spencer Robb, Sir Hugh Dudley Richards Watson, Sir Herbert Ernest Fass, Archibald Edwards Widdows, William Sanger, Elizabeth Hariott Kelly and Herbert Needham Morrison shall be Members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation, to exercise for the term of three years from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, in conjunction with the six members co-opted by the General Council, and the ex-officio members specified in the First Schedule to the Act first above recited, the powers and duties transferred to that body as aforesaid, and generally to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act.

And we do further ordain that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, shall be President of the General Council of the said Corporation.

Given at Our Court at Sandringham the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirtyseven, in the first year of Our Reign.

WARRANT APPOINTING MEMBERS OF THE ROYAL PATRIOTIC FUND CORPORATION.

> Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, S.W. 19th January, 1937.

The KING will hold a Levée at St. James's Palace on Tuesday, the 9th February, at II.30 a.m.

Gentlemen who have already been presented at Levées held in previous Reigns do not require to be re-presented.

Two further Levées will be held in London during the summer, and also a Levée at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in the month of July. The dates of these will be announced later.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

DRESS.

Navy. Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R. —No. I Dress (Full Dress).

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform, and who are not required by the Regulations to provide it—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

Army. Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force. Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

Civilians. Levée Dress.

- I. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.
- 2. A gentleman presented for the first time may present only his son on the occasion when he himself is presented.
- 3. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.
- 4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.
- 5. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

 All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

- 7. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.
- 8. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.
- 9. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.
- ro. Gentlemen connected with the Treasury, the Foreign Office, and other Government Departments will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretaries to the Ministers of the respective Departments.
- II. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Home Office.
- 12. Lord Provosts and Provosts and Conveners of County Councils will make their applications for attendance or for presentation through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Scotland, at the Scottish Office, Whitehall.

Scottish Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel and Legal Officials in Scotland should make their applications through the Legal Secretary to the Lord Advocate.

- 13. Chairmen of County Councils, and gentlement connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.
- 14. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.
- 15. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated as soon as possible, and in any case not later than twelve days prior to the date of the Levée.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- I. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd January. 1937, at I o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th January, 1937, to Saturday, the 30th January, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

References to the Standing Committee

In accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin they have made references to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of imported goods of the following classes and descriptions:—
