## CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

### COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of Their Majesties' Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 18th day of December last) and of fees to be received for the same, will hold their first meeting at the Council Office on Thursday, the 11th February, 1937, at 11 a.m.

Petitioners are required to present their Petitions in writing to the Clerks to the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.1, by the 1st day of February, 1937.

Claims which were received, heard and determined by the Court of Claims set up by the Royal Proclamation of the 28th of May last are excluded from the consideration of the present Court and no further Petitions in respect of those Claims will be received unless there has been any change of Tenure of any Petitioner or any change in the nature of the Service to be performed.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th January, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st February, 1937, to Saturday, the 6th February, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## THE WEST WALES JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

## POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

88,876. (21st January, 1937.)

Whereas by the West Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930 (in this order referred to as "the principal order") as amended by the West Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee (No. 2) Order, 1930, the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the administrative counties of Cardigan, Carmarthen, Radnor and Pembroke for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a joint committee named the West Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas the constituent authorities of the joint committee have made application to the Minister of Health for the amendment of the principal order as amended:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following order.

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the West Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1937.

(2) The principal order as amended as aforesaid and this order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the West Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders, 1930 to 1937.

2. From and after the 8th day of February, 1937, the principal order as amended as aforesaid shall be read and have effect as if in lieu of Article 10 thereof there were substituted the following Article that is to say—

10.—(1) The joint committee may defray such reasonable expenditure including travelling expenses as may be necessary in connection with the attendance of members at meetings of the joint committee or any sub-committee thereof.

(2) The joint committee may confer with other joint committees for all or any of the purposes of this order and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and of the attendance of their representatives thereat.
