The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come:

Greeting!

Whereas His late Majesty King Edward VII being desirous of recognising more fully than had theretofore been possible the faithful and meritorious services rendered to Him by Members of the Civil Services of the various parts of His Empire, did by Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and two, the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six, the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and the seventeenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nine, for Himself, His Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Civil Order of Distinction—to be designated the Imperial Service Order—and He was graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Rules and Ordinances for the government of the same:

And whereas His late Majesty King George V by Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual dated the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the sixteenth day of

June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the fourteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two did Make, Ordain, and Establish Statutes and Ordinances for the government of the Imperial Service Order and the Imperial Service Medal, reserving to Himself His Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating and augmenting, interpreting and dispensing with those Statutes by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the said Order:

And whereas We are minded to make certain amendments to the Statutes of the said Order:

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, abrogate the Eighth clause of the said Warrant of the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the said Warrant of the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in lieu thereof Make, Ordain and Establish the following Statutes:

Eighthly.—It is ordained that the decoration to be worn by Companions of the Order shall be: for men, a Badge or Medallion of gold or enamel, bearing the Imperial and Royal Cypher of the Sovereign, and the words "For Faithful Service", both to be executed in dark blue enamel on a plaque or shield of gold, surrounded by a seven-pointed star of silver, surmounted by the Imperial Crown; and for women, a Badge

or Medallion in all respects similar to the Badge or Medallion for men, save that the plaque or shield of gold shall be surrounded by a wreath of laurel in silver instead of a star, surmounted by the Imperial Crown.

Sixteenthly.—It is ordained that the Imperial Service Medal for men and women respectively shall be a circular medal of silver bearing the Effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse and on the reverse an appropriate design and the words "For Faithful Service", and on the rim of the Medal the name of the recipient, and it is ordained that the Imperial Service Medal shall be worn in a similar manner to that prescribed for the Imperial Service Order.

And it is Our will and pleasure that these Statutes shall be taken and received as part and parcel of the Statutes of the said Order.

Given at Our Court at *Sandringham* the *Eleventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven*; In the *First* year of Our Reign.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the general minimum time rates, guaranteed time rates, general minimum piece rates, piece work basis time rates and overtime rates for male and female workers at present set out in the Schedule to their Notice J. (56) dated 11th May, 1933.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objection to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 26th January, 1937. Any such objection should be in writing and signed

Bridge. Thence along the road which runs south over the River Calder and under the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to the road junction just south of Mytholmroyd Station. Thence along the road running in an easterly and south-easterly direction passing on the west side of the road island at Boulder Clough to Sowerby. Thence following the road running in a southerly direction past Rooley Hill and Kebroyd to its junction with Elland Road in the town of Ripponden. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the road junction about 700 feet south-east of Ripponden Railway Station. Thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction for about half a mile to the road junction, thence along the road running east for about a quarter of a mile to the cross-roads west of the Church at Barkisland. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction and passing west of the Church to the junction with the main road from Greetland. Thence along the main road in a southerly direction passing Ringstone Edge Reservoir to the cross-roads about 1,500 feet north of the road junction at Moselden Height. Thence along the road running generally in an easterly direction to Yews, thence south-east to the road junction at Camp Hill. Thence following the road running in an easterly and south-easterly direction crossing the main Huddersfield-Rochdale road passing east of Worts Hill and past the west end of Moorside Edge to Wilber Lee. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the road junction at Heys and thence westwards to the point where the road crosses the river and thence south-east along the road to its junction with the road running in an easterly direction to Slaithwaite. Thence eastwards to Slaithwaite passing through the town by way of Nabbs Lane, Church Street, Market Place, Britannia Road, the west part of Lingards Lane and crossing Manchester Road to the road running in a southerly and south-easterly direction to Meltham. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the road junction about 600 feet south-west of Thick Hollins, thence in a north-easterly direction to the road junction at Thick Hollins. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction over Thick Hollins Moor to the Inn on the main Oldham-Holmfirth Road. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction to Holmfirth; passing through the town by way of, Modd Lane, Victoria Street, and Dunford Road. Thence along the road running in a southerly direction to the road junction by the Inn about 1,200 feet south of Longley. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction past Daisy Lee Moor to the School at the cross-roads about 1,600 feet south-west of Sledbrook Hill. Thence southwards along the road to the cross-roads at Flouch Inn.

Southern Boundary.

Thence following the main road which runs in a westerly direction through Fiddlers Green and passing to the north of Woodhead Reservoir and through Tintwistle to the fork-roads about 350 feet north-east of Mottram in the County of Chester.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a north-westerly direction following the main Glossop-Stalybridge road to the road junction at Stalybridge. Thence along

the road running in a north-easterly direction passing through Millbrook, past Micklehurst in the County of Lancaster to the road junction at Greenfield Railway Station in the County of York. Thence along the east fork-road in a northerly direction passing through Upper Mill to the road junction about 175 feet south-west of Saddleworth Railway Station. Thence westwards along the road for about 250 feet to the road junction and thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction passing through Dobb Cross to the road junction about 500 feet east of New Delph Railway Station. Thence northwards along the road to the main Oldham-Huddersfield Road. Thence westwards along the said main road for about 275 feet to the cross-roads and thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction passing through Delph, Linfitts to the cross-roads near Denshaw. Thence in a north-westerly and westerly direction along the road passing through Haugh to the road junction at New Hey in the County of Lancaster. Thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction to the road junction about 700 feet south-west of the Church at Milnrow. Thence along the road running in a northerly direction past Wild House to the road junction about 1,100 feet south-east of the Church in the village of Smithy Bridge. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to Hollingworth Lake following the road round the north-west shore of the Lake and northwards over the Rochdale Canal to Littleborough; passing through the town by the way of Canal Street and Todmorden Road. Thence northwards along the Todmorden Road to the road junction by the Churches at Walsden in the County of York. Thence by Hollins Road and Rochdale Road to Todmorden. Thence by Burnley Road through the town and in a north-westerly direction through Lydgate, Cornholme, Portsmouth and Holme Chapel to the road junction about 1,650 feet south-east of the Church at Walk Mill in the County of Lancaster. Thence along the road running in a northerly direction past the Inn at Mere Clough, Ormerod House, through the village of Worsthorne, past Bottin and High Halstead to the road junction about 900 feet north-west of Holden the point of departure.
