## CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

### COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of Their Majesties' Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 18th day of December last) and of fees to be received for the same, will hold their first meeting at the Council Office on Thursday, the 11th February, 1937, at 11 a.m.

Petitioners are required to present their Petitions in writing to the Clerks to the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.1, by the 1st day of February, 1937.

Claims which were received, heard and determined by the Court of Claims set up by the Royal Proclamation of the 28th day of May last are excluded from the consideration of the present Court and no further Petitions in respect of those Claims will be received unless there has been any change of Tenure of any Petitioner or any change in the nature of the Service to be performed.
