WHEREAS by section one hundred and four of the Explosives Act, 1875 (38 Vict. c. 17), it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that any substance which appears to His Majesty to be specially dangerous to life or property by reason either of its explosive properties, or of any process in the manufacture thereof being liable to explosion, shall be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, and the provisions of the said Act (subject to such exceptions, limitations, and restrictions as may be specified in the Order) shall accordingly extend to any such substance in like manner as if it were included in the term explosive in the said Act:

And whereas acetylene, when liquid or subject to a certain degree of compression, or when in admixture with air or oxygen, is specially dangerous to life or property by reason of its explosive properties:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, as follows:—

Acetylene, when liquid or when subject to a pressure exceeding nine pounds to the

square inch above that of the atmosphere, and whether or not in admixture with other substances, or when in admixture with atmospheric air or with oxygen gas in whatever proportion and at whatever pressure, and whether or not in admixture with other substances, shall be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the following exception; that if it be shown to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State that acetylene, declared to be deemed to be explosive by this Order, when in admixture with any substance, or in any form or condition, is not possessed of explosive properties, the Secretary of State may, by Order, exempt such acetylene from being deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act.

And whereas by section forty-three of the Explosives Act, 1875 (38 Vict. c. 17), it is provided that His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, may prohibit, either absolutely; or except in pursuance of a licence of the Secretary of State under the said Act, or may subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of the United Kingdom, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that, in the judgment of His Majesty, it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order:

And whereas it is, in the judgment of His Majesty, expedient for the public safety that acetylene, declared by this Order to be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act shall be prohibited:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that acetylene, declared by this Order to be deemed to be an explosive, shall be prohibited from being manufactured, kept, imported, conveyed or sold:

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply (1) to the manufacture or keeping of acetylene under the following conditions:—

- (a) that the pressure to which the acetylene is subjected shall not exceed twenty-two pounds to the square inch above that of the atmosphere, and
- (b) that the manufacture and keeping shall be carried out only on such premises and under such conditions as may be approved by the Secretary of State; or
- (2) to acetylene in admixture with air or oxygen when such admixture takes place only in the burner or contrivance in which the mixture is intended to be burnt; or
- (3) to an admixture of acetylene and air which may unavoidably occur in the first use or recharging of an apparatus, properly designed and constructed with a view to the production of pure acetylene.

This Order shall come into operation on the third day of February, 1937, and as from that date the Order in Council dated the 18th June, 1914 (S.R. & O. 1914 (No. 907) I. p. 566), relating to acetylene is hereby revoked: Provided that nothing in this revocation shall affect the Orders of the Secretary of State dated the 28th March, 1898 (S.R. & O. Rev., 1904,

"Explosive Substance," p. 77), the 29th September, 1905 (S.R. & O. 1905 (No. 1128) I. p. 86), and the 23rd June, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919 (No. 809) I. p. 702), and such Order shall have effect as if made under this Order.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas His late Majesty King George the Fifth in consideration of the faithful and devoted service rendered by members of the Special Constabulary during the Great War, 1914-1918, and being desirous of distinguishing

such service by some mark of His Royal Favour, and also of providing a means of recognizing continued and efficient service which may be rendered in the future by members of any Special Constabulary Reserve hereafter constituted, did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual dated the 30th August, 1919, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded for such service as aforesaid:

And whereas by Warrants under His late Majesty's Royal Sign Manual dated the 31st January, 1920, the 15th August, 1929, and the 1st October, 1930, respectively, revised Rules were established for the governance of the said Decoration:

And whereas We are desirous of further amending the said Rules, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules for the governance of the said Decoration:—

I. It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Special Constabulary Long Service Medal."

II. It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Bronze with the Effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse and on the reverse an appropriate design or inscription, and shall bear on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal is awarded.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who, being or having been members of the Special Constabulary during the War or of any Special Constabulary Reserve, shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

(1) Shall have served as a Special Constable without pay during the War for not less than three years, and shall during that period have performed not less than 150 police duties; or

(2) Shall have served in a Special Constabulary Reserve for not less than nine years, and shall be recommended by the Chief Officer of Police as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed without pay such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him by the Chief Officer of Police during that period.

Provided that in the case of a man who has served both in the Special Constabulary during the War and in a Special Constabulary Reserve, each period of service during the War amounting to one year or upwards in the course of which he completed not less than 50 police duties shall be reckoned as equivalent to three years' efficient service in the Reserve, and other periods in the same proportion.

IV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or by Our Principal Secretary of State for Scotland, and that the names of the persons eligible for such Medal shall be submitted to Our said Secretaries of State respectively by the Chief Officer of Police under whom such persons have served.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one-third of the whole) shall be red, while the remaining parts shall each have three longitudinal stripes of equal width, the central stripe being black and the other two

white; and further, that in the case of those to whom the Medal is awarded for service during the War a bar or clasp shall be attached to the riband, bearing the words "The Great War, 1914-1918."

VI. It is ordained that an additional bar or clasp which shall be attached to the riband and shall bear upon it the words "Long Service" may be awarded to those to whom the Medal has been awarded upon the same recommendation by the Chief Officer of Police as is required for the award of the Medal upon the completion of each ten years of service after the award of the Medal, or, where such award was made under Rule III (1), after 19th July, 1919.

VII. It is ordained that on a recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our said Secretaries of State it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to direct the cancellation and annulment of the award to any person of the Medal or Bars, and thereupon the name of such person shall be erased from the record of those to whom the Medal shall have been awarded, and every person whose Medal shall be so forfeited shall on being required so to do by either of Our said Secretaries of State deliver up his Medal to such person as either of Our said Secretaries of State may direct. Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to direct the restoration of any Medal or Bars which may have been so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

VIII. All previous Warrants issued in this behalf are hereby revoked except in so far as they are already revoked.
